AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE CONTINUED IMPLEMENTATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 384 RELATIVE TO THE WATER RESOURCES PLANNING FOR GUAM AND FOR AMENDING GEPA'S FISCAL YEAR 1978 OPERATIONAL BUDGET AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of One Hundred and Four Thousand Dollars (\$104,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of developing and finalizing the Territorial Water Facilities Plan. Said sum shall include Thirty-Five Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty-Five Dollars (\$35,655) of Federal Grant-in-Aid from the U. S. Water Resources Council for Fiscal Year 1978 and Sixty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred and Forty-Five Dollars (\$68,345) of local matching share. Any balance remaining as of September 30, 1979 for the appropriation made in this Section is hereby returned to the General Fund.

Section 2. Part I, Section 1, Subsections VII.A.a, b, d, and f, of Public Law 14-43 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Part I, Section 1, Subsection XII, Item 26.a of Public Law 14-43 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"XII.For Power, Water/Sewer & Telephone.

The following sums shall be used for telephone, water/sewer and power expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978.

Section 4. Part I, Section 1, Subsections XIV, F.1, 2 and 1 of Public Law 14-43 are amended and new Items 3, 4, 5 are added to read as follows:

The following sums shall be used to implement programs financed in whole or in part from Federal Grants-in-Aid for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978. These sums are included in the operations budget of the following departments and agencies of the Executive Branch and, therefore, do not constitute additional appropriations for the agencies. These sums are listed to identify the Federal Grants-in-Aid included in the budget and their corresponding matching portion to facilitate the accounting of those federal funds and restrict the expenditures of local funds.

Law 14-97, is henceforth identified as the partial source of funding for the appropriation made in Section 8 of Public Law 14-87 for funding of the salary adjustments for government of Guam employees.

Section 9. Subsection (c) of Section 11 of Public Law 14-87 is hereby repealed.

Section 10. Section 57003 of Chapter 1, Title LXI of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed and a new Section 57003 of Chapter 1, Title LXI is hereby reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 57003. Administration. (a) Administrator The Board shall appoint an Administrator to administer matters
of the Agency under the supervision of the Board. The
Administrator shall not be a member of the Board and shall
not have a right to vote. The Administrator shall be given
the necessary authority and be held responsible for the
administration of the Agency in all its activities subject
only to such policies as may be adopted and such orders
as may be issued by the Board.

- (b) Deputy Administrator The Board shall appoint a Deputy Administrator who shall not be a member of the Board and shall not have a right to vote. The Deputy Administrator shall perform such functions as the Administrator desires during the absence of the Administrator or in the event of a vacancy in the office of the Administrator until such time that another Administrator is appointed.
- (c) Secretary of the Board The Secretary of the Board shall be appointed by the Administrator and confirmed by the Board. The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping records of meetings and actions of the Board.

Qualifications, duties, tenure and compensation -1 The qualifications, duties, tenure and compensation of the 2 Administrator, Deputy Administrator and Secretary shall be such as the Board may by resolution determine necessary and desirable, provided that their salaries may not exceed 5 Twenty-Nine Thousand Bollars (\$29,000), Twenty-Four Thousand 6 Dollars (\$24,000) and Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$14,400) per annum respectively. Other fringe benefits such as leave, eligibility for hospital, dental, life insurance and retirement, shall be decided by the Board, notwithstanding 10 any other laws to the contrary."

Section 11. Statement of legislative findings. The Legislature finds that for over twenty (20) years a large number of families in the Chagamin Lago area in Inarajan have been utilizing a private road over Lot No. 116-1 to gain access to their properties, this road also being used by the school buses and garbage trucks although the Superior Court of Guam has found that the owners of said lot own the same in fee and that they may close the road upon six months written notice to the Attorney General; that because of the existence of this road, the owners of said lot are not able to utilize the same since the lot itself contains only 1,394 square meters and the road cuts it in half; that the owners are willing to exchange said lot for government land of equivalent value and were such exchange made, the road through the lot to the Chagamin Lago area could be incorporated in the island road system to the benefit of the many people living in the area; and that, therefore, such an exchange would be in the public interest.

Section 12. Exchange authorized. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contary, the Governor is authorized to acquire Lot No. 116-1, Inarajan, Guam, by exchanging with its

owners government land of equivalent value in the Malojloj district, Inarajan. Motwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, such exchange may be consumated by the Governor and the landowners without any further action by the Legislature.

Section 13. Section 4233, (a), (3), of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(3) 'Average annual salary' for any member of the Legislature shall mean the average of the three (3) highest annual salaries received by a member during his years of credited service, whether or not with the Legislature, or an amount equivalent to the annual compensation paid the Director of Administration at the time the Legislator applies for benefits, whichever is greater; provided, however, that, effective January 1, 1978, whenever the annual compensation of the Director of Administration exceeds the annual compensation of the members of the Legislature, the contribution of the Legislators shall be based on the annual compensation of the Director of Administration."

Section 14. Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter I of Title XXIX of the Government Code to the contrary, any person who prior to the effective date of Public Law 14-102 was engaged in the study of law under the preceptorship of a locally admitted attorney pursuant to the requirements of Chapter I of Title XXIX (repealed by Public Law 14-102) shall be qualified for admission to the Guam Bar as a fully licensed attorney who proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Bar Examiners that:

(1) he has studied law diligently and in good faith for a period of a least five (5) years in the office and under the preceptorship of a locally-admitted attorney (which attorney must have graduated from a law school accredited by the American Bar Association);

- (2) he has resided in Guam for not less than three (3) months preceeding certification and intends in good faith to practice in Guam;
 - (3) he is at least eighteen (18) years of age;
 - (4) he is of good moral character;
- (5) he has not been convicted in any court of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude;
- (6) he has completed at least two (2) years of college; and
- (7) he has passed a final examination given by the Board of Bar Examiners.
