



AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4212.2 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO DISABILITY
RETIREMENT ANNUITY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4212.2 of the Government Code is amended
3 to read:

4 "Section 4212.2. Same. The amount of disability
5 retirement annuity shall be sixty-six and two-thirds percent
6 (66 2/3%) based on salary of the member in effect at the
7 date of disability."

8 Section 2. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
9 retroactive to May 14, 1971.

10 Section 3. Any person prior to the effective date of this
11 Act who has received both workmen's compensation and disability
12 retirement annuity payments as a result of an injury he received
13 while employed by the government of Guam, shall not be required
14 to repay any benefits received under either program, notwith-
15 standing the provisions of law to the contrary. Provided, how-
16 ever, that any person injured while employed by the government
17 of Guam after the effective date of this Act shall not be eligible
18 to receive both workmen's compensation payments and disability
19 retirement annuity payments.

1 Section 4. There is hereby appropriated to the Department
2 of Public Safety the sum of One Hundred Forty-Four Thousand
3 Three Hundred Four Dollars (\$144,304) from any available balance
4 of the General Fund for payment of outstanding overtime obliga-
5 tions to personnel of the Department of Public Safety for fiscal
6 year 1976 and fiscal year 1977.

7 Section 5. Notwithstanding the statute of limitation, there
8 is hereby appropriated to the Juvenile Justice Division the sum
9 of Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) from any available
10 balance of the General Fund for the payment of outstanding over-
11 time obligations, night differential pay and other compensations
12 due personnel of the division for services rendered in the 1960's.

13 Section 6. Section 4020(d), 4020.1(c), 4020.2(c) of Title
14 V, Chapter I of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read:

15 "Employees" as used in this section include officers,
16 survivors of officers, survivors of employees, retired
17 employees and survivors of retired employees who are receiv-
18 ing annuity benefits.

19 Section 7. The application of Section 6 of this Act shall
20 be made retroactive to include all living survivors previously
21 denied this benefit.

22 Section 8. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-
23 Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) from any available balance of
24 the General fund to the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority
25 for the purpose of constructing an additional underground duct
26 system within the GHURA 500 Housing project.

27 Section 9. Items a. and b. of Section 1., I.A.1. of Public
28 Law 14-43, as amended, is amended to read:

29 "a. Personal Services \$456,995
30 b. Personnel Benefits \$ 52,168."

1 Section 10. The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) is
2 hereby appropriated from any Unappropriated Surplus of the General
3 Fund to the Department of Education for the purpose of sending
4 the members of the joint Vocational Technical-George Washington
5 High Schools Army J.R.O.T.C. drill team to participate in the
6 competition to be held at Honolulu, Hawaii beginning April, 1978.

7 Section 11. Section 6610.5 of the Government Code is
8 amended to read:

9 "Section 6610.5. Mileage allowance. Persons authorized
10 to travel at government expense shall, in accordance with
11 regulations and whenever such mode of transportation is
12 authorized or approved as more advantageous to the govern-
13 ment, be paid in lieu of transportation not to exceed twenty
14 cents (20¢) per mile for the use of privately owned four-
15 wheeled passenger motor vehicles or six cents (6¢) per mile
16 for the use of other types of privately owned vehicles, when
17 engaged on official business within or outside their desig-
18 nated posts of duty. In addition to the mileage allowance,
19 there may be allowed reimbursement for the actual cost of
20 ferry fares and bridge, road and tunnel fares."

21 Section 12. There is hereby appropriated from any available
22 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
23 of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) to the Department of Public
24 Works for the construction of two (2) canopies at Carbullido
25 Elementary School.

26 Section 13. Subsections C and D of Section 2.(a) of Public
27 Law 14-87 are amended to read:

28 "C. For Contractual Services,

29 not to exceed \$33,875.00

30 D. For Supplies and Materials,

31 not to exceed \$ 3,300.00."

32 Section 14. Sections 11, 12 and 13 of this Act are effective
33 upon enactment.
