## FOURTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 1978 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 634 (As Substituted by the Committee on Finance & Taxation)

Introduced by B. M. Palomo

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4005 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS OF CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4005 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 4005. Civil Service Commission. There is hereby established, in and for the government of Guam, a Civil Service Commission, composed of seven (7) members, appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Legislature Members shall serve for a term of three (3) years, provided that of the initial members appointed, one (1) shall serve for one (1) year, three (3) for two (2) years and three (3) for three (3) years. No member shall be either an employee of the government of Guam or a member of any other board or commission thereof. The Commission is authorized to employ its own staff. Each member of the Commission shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each attendance at the meetings of the Commission, provided, however that no member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month."

Section 2. Section 4220 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 4220. Board of Trustees. The responsibility for the proper operation of the fund and the direction of its policies shall be vested in a Board of Trustees of five

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(5) members, consisting of the Director of the Department of Administration, ex-officio, two (2) members appointed by the Governor who shall be employees having at least five (5) years of service and participants in the fund, and two (2) members appointed by the Governor who shall not be employees of the government. The term of office of the appointive members shall be for five (5) years, except that the original appointees shall be appointed for terms of one (1), two (2), three (3), and four (4) years. As their terms expire, new members shall be appointed to fill vacancies and such appoint ment shall be made for terms of five (5) years. Each member of the Board of Trustees shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each attendance at the meetings of the Board, provided, however, that no member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month; provided, further that no board member who is an employee of the government of Guam shall receive compensation if the meeting attended is held during regular working hours."

Section 3. Section 42010 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 42010. Same: Compensation. Members of the Board shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each attendance at the meetings of the Board, provided, however, that no member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month."

Section 4. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the following sums:

A. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to the Chamorro Language Commission to defray all expenses in conducting a seminar-workshop on the Chamorro Language.

B. The sum of Two Hundred Forty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$242,000) for the construction of three (3) dry wells/ponding basins in Agana Heights for flood control purposes. Said sum is to augment an earlier appropriation made in Public Law 13-201.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500) for the operation of Youth Week 1978. No amount of this appropriation shall be expended until the report that is due on or before June 1, 1977 is received by the Legislature.

Section A. Governor's staff responsible for the Youth Bureau shall have purview over the disbursement of funds, maintaining of records, administering revenues, providing manpower as needed, insuring the compliance of the report due date, and other logistical support as needed.

Section B. The certifying officer shall be the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research or his designee.

Section C. Any nonexpended items purchased with funds under Section 5 of this Act shall be stored for use in the ensuing Youth Week.

Section D. All proceeds collected from activities during Youth Week 1978 may be expended for the operation of Youth Week 1978.

Section E. The Central Planning Committee will submit to the Legislature, the Youth Congress and the Governor of Guam a full report of the Youth Week activities, including an analysis of all income and expenditures, on or before June 1, 1978.

Section F. Sections 5 A thru E of this Act shall be effective immediately.

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Section 6. The sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for the drainage improvements at the Guzman Memorial Baseball Field in the municipality of Santa Rita.

Section 7. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the installation of waterlines and related appurtenances necessary to provide water for the irrigation of those areas used as farms located in the eighty acre lots leased from the Navy which lots are situated opposite P. C. Lujan Elementary School in Radio Barrigada along Route 8.
