AN ACT TO ADD SUBSECTION (p) TO SECTION 4203 AND TO AMEND SECTION 4234(a) OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Subsection (p) is added to Section 4203 of the Government Code to read:

"(p) 'Uniformed personnel' means police officers and firemen in the Department of Public Safety, Customs and Quarantine Officers in the Department of Commerce, Conservation Officers of the Department of Agriculture and Correction Officers of the Department of Corrections."

Section 2. Section 47136 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 47136. Charges for services of customs and quarantine officers. All air and sea carriers and other persons whose operations require the services of Customs

and Quarantine Officers of the government of Guam shall be charged for said services as are rendered by such officers on any day of the week upon special request, Sunday, holidays, or between the hours of 5 P.M. of any day and 8 A.M. of the following day as follows: for the first hour or fraction thereof of such services, the hourly wage rate of three (3) hours of service by whichever officer is performing such service, plus twenty-five percent (25%) thereof for administrative overhead and overtime. In addition to the first-hour charge for any hour or fraction thereof over one (1) hour, one and one-half (1.5) times three (3) hours, the hourly wage rate of whichever officer performs such services, plus twenty-five percent (25%) thereof for administrative Any sum received by the government of Guam for such overtime work shall be reimbursed to the employee who who has rendered such service, regardless of his pay range, less the twenty-five percent (25%) administrative overhead which shall be used for the government contribution to the Retirement Fund and the balance thereof shall be deposited to the Customs and Quarantine Overtime Revolving Fund. Non-performance of services. If services which have been requested and the officer has reported to work and the services are not performed by reason of circumstances beyond the control of the officers concerned, the interested party shall be charged on the same basis as though the services had actually been performed during the period between the time the officer was ordered to report for duty and did so report and the times he was notified that his services would not be required, a minimum charge of two (2) hours of his hourly rate plus twenty-five percent (25%) thereof for administrative overhead and overtime.

Assignment. The Chief of Customs and Quarantine Division is authorized to order an officer to report for any overtime duty 15 minutes in advance of the scheduled time to avoid unnecessary delay."

Section 3. Section 4234(a) of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read:

"(a) Any person who is elected Governor or Lieutenant
Governor may retire following the completion of his term of
office as the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of the territory of Guam. He shall be paid from the Retirement Fund
by appropriation made by the Legislature notwithstanding the
amount of his contributions thereto an annual pension during
the remainder of his life in an amount equal to and not to
exceed fifty percent (50%) of the annual salary of the
Governor or Lieutenant Governor at the time he retires."
