AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 16.30 OF THE CRIMINAL  
AND CORRECTIONAL CODE TO PROVIDE FOR MANDATORY  
LIFE IMPRISONMENT OF A PERSON CONVICTED OF  
MURDER.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 16.30 of the Criminal and Correctional  
3 Code is amended to read:

4 "Section 16.30. (a) Except as provided in Section 16.40,  
5 criminal homicide constitutes murder when:

6 (1) it is committed intentionally or knowingly;

7 or

8 (2) it is committed recklessly under circumstances  
9 manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human  
10 life.

11 (b) Murder is a felony of the first degree but a person  
12 convicted of murder shall be sentenced to life imprisonment  
13 notwithstanding any other provision of law; provided, how-  
14 ever, that any person convicted of murder which is a felony  
15 of the first degree shall not be eligible for parole nor  
16 shall his sentence be suspended."
