



AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 59019
AND TO ADD SECTION 59019.1 TO THE GOVERNMENT
CODE RELATIVE TO EXPENDING CERTAIN TAX REVENUES
FOR PAYMENT OF CERTAIN BONUSES AND AUTHORIZING
THE GOVERNOR TO INCUR INDEBTEDNESS FOR PAYMENT
OF CERTAIN BONUSES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 59019 of the Government Code is repealed
3 and reenacted to read:

4 "Section 59019. Veterans Bonus Fund. (a) All tax
5 revenue paid to Guam pursuant to Section 59010 of the Govern-
6 ment Code, shall be deposited in the Veterans Bonus Fund
7 hereby established and is appropriated for the expenditures
8 hereafter authorized. Expenditures shall be made from the
9 fund for the purpose of paying to eligible veterans, Guam
10 Combat Patrol members and Civilian Scouts the bonuses
11 authorized by Chapters XIV-A, XIV-B and XV, Title IX of the
12 Government Code, as it may, from time to time, be amended
13 or for repayment of any indebtedness incurred pursuant to
14 subsection (b) of this section.

15 (b) The Governor of Guam is authorized to incur in-
16 debtedness, with the consent of the Legislature by resolution
17 as to the terms of the loan, for the purpose of paying to
18 eligible persons the bonuses authorized by Chapter XIV-A,
19 XIV-B and XV, Title IX of the Government Code. The Governor

1 may assign, pledge or grant a security interest in the
2 tax revenue payable to the government of Guam pursuant to
3 Section 59010 of the Government Code. Repayment of the loan
4 shall be guaranteed by the government of Guam out of its
5 revenues.

6 (c) If the loan authorized by subsection (b) of this
7 section is obtained, then the bonuses shall be paid from
8 the funds borrowed and the Veterans Bonus Fund shall be
9 expended only for the purpose of repayment of such indebted-
10 ness until such indebtedness is repaid in full as to both
11 interest and principal. After the indebtedness is repaid,
12 the Veterans Bonus Fund shall be used to pay eligible persons
13 who did not receive bonus payments from the funds borrowed
14 pursuant to subsection (b) of this section."

15 Section 2. A new Section 59019.1 is added to the Government
16 Code to read:

17 "Section 59019.1. Section 59019 of this Code shall
18 be of no further effect after each eligible person is paid
19 a bonus pursuant to Sections 8981, 8985 and 8990 of the
20 Government Code and after any loans obtained pursuant to the
21 provisions of Section 59019(b) of this Code are paid in full
22 as to both principal and interest."

23 Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 13-180 is repealed.

24 Section 4. Section 47136 of the Government Code is amended
25 to read:

26 "Section 47136. Charges for services of customs and
27 quarantine officers. All air and sea carriers and other
28 persons whose operations require the services of customs
29 and quarantine officers of the government of Guam shall be

1 charged for said services as are rendered by such officers
2 on any day of the week upon special request, Sunday, holi-
3 days, or between the hours of 5 P.M. of any day and 8 A.M.
4 of the following day as follows: for the first hour or
5 fraction thereof of such services, the hourly wage rate
6 of three (3) hours of service by whichever officer is
7 performing such service, plus twenty-five percent (25%)
8 thereof for administrative overhead and overtime. In
9 addition to the first-hour charge for any hour or fraction
10 thereof over one (1) hour, one and half (1.5) times the
11 hourly wage rate of whichever officer performs such services,
12 plus twenty-five percent (25%) thereof for administrative
13 overhead. Any sum received by the government of Guam for such
14 overtime work shall be reimbursed to the employee who has
15 rendered such service, regardless of his pay range, less the
16 twenty-five percent (25%) administrative overhead which
17 shall be used for the government contribution to the Retire-
18 ment Fund and the balance thereof shall be deposited to
19 Customs and Quarantine Revolving Fund.

20 Non performance of services. If services which have been
21 requested and the officer has reported to work and the services
22 are not performed by reason of circumstances beyond the control
23 of the officers concerned, the interested party shall be
24 charged on the same basis as though the services had actually
25 been performed during the period between the time the officer
26 was ordered to report for duty and did so report and the times
27 he was notified that his services would not be required, a
28 minimum charge of two (2) hours of his hourly rate plus
29 twenty-five percent (25%) thereof for administrative overhead
30 and overtime.

1 Assignment. The Chief of Customs and Quarantine Division
2 is authorized to order officer to report for any overtime
3 duty 15 minutes in advance of the scheduled time to avoid
4 unnecessary delay."

5 Section 5. There is hereby appropriated from the General
6 Fund the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500.00) for
7 the purpose of sending Constitutional Convention Delegates to
8 testify at the Senate Hearing on the Guam Constitution in Washing-
9 ton, D. C. scheduled for the third week of May 1973.

10 Section 6. Subsection (b)(2) of Section 64.70 of the
11 Criminal and Correctional Code of Guam is hereby amended to read
12 as follows:

13 "(2) no member of the sponsoring organization shall
14 receive remuneration in any form for time or effort devoted to
15 the promotion and conduct of the gambling activities; and".
