

AN ACT TO ADD SECTIONS 11413 THROUGH 11416
TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REGULATE
STUDENT ACTIVITIES MONEY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. New Sections 11413 through 11416 are hereby
3 added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 11413. Student Activities Money. Student
5 activities money is all money raised with the approval
6 of the Board by the efforts of students in connection
7 with any activities of student organizations, including
8 without limiting the generality of the foregoing, school
9 supply, stores, clubs, athletic activities, school plays,
10 receipts from vending machines and other student enter-
11 tainment and year books.

12 Section 11414. Committee. (a) There shall be
13 established a Student Activities Money Committee within
14 each school which shall oversee the receipts and ex-
15 penditures of the student activities money and shall
16 make final approval of all expenditures in excess of
17 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) from the Student Activities
18 Fund.

19 (b) Membership on the Student Activities Money
20 Committee shall be the following:

21 (1) Principal of the school concerned serving
22 as Chairman;

1 (2) one faculty staff member designated
2 by the school faculty; and

3 (3) student body president, student body
4 treasurer or a student body member designated by
5 the school faculty.

6 Section 11415. Student Activities Fund. The
7 Student Activities Money Committee of any school having
8 student activities money shall open a checking account
9 and/or savings account in a commercial bank or savings
10 and loan association in Guam in an account designated
11 as the School Student Activities Fund of the school
12 opening the account.

13 Section 11416. Student Activities Treasurer,
14 Audit. (a) The Student Activities Money Committee of
15 any school having student activities money shall appoint
16 a student activities treasurer of that particular school.
17 Each student activities treasurer shall be bonded in
18 accordance with standard government of Guam procedures.

19 (b) Any student organization that raises money as
20 provided by Section 11413, supra, shall promptly deliver
21 such money to the student activities treasurer who shall,
22 forthwith, give that student activity a receipt therefore
23 promptly deposit the money in the Student Activities
24 Fund of such school. Disbursements from the Student
25 Activities Fund shall be made only for the purpose for
26 which the fund was established or other purposes which
27 the student organization raising the fund may determine.

1 All expenditures of student activities money shall be
2 for the enhancement of student educational or social
3 welfare as approved by regulations of the student
4 organization and approved by the Board. Disbursements
5 of funds shall be made by the student activities
6 treasurer as requested in writing by the student organiza-
7 tion advisor and treasurer. The student activities
8 treasurer and the principal of the school shall sign all
9 withdrawals drawn against the Student Activities Fund,
10 provided that no checks or withdrawals may be drawn
11 against the Student Activity Fund without disbursement
12 request signed by the student organization advisor and
13 treasurer.

14 (c) The student activities treasurer shall maintain
15 accounts showing the balances due respective student
16 organizations and shall maintain an accurate record of
17 all deposits and expenditures from the Student Activities
18 Fund and shall prepare a monthly financial statement
19 report. Copies of this report shall be given to the
20 Director of Education, principal and student activities
21 sponsor. The records of the student activities treasurer
22 shall be open to inspection at reasonable times by
23 faculty advisors and officers of the student organiza-
24 tions concerned. Such records shall be maintained by
25 the student activities treasurer in accordance with
26 such rules and regulations as may be established by the
27 Board of Education.

1 (d) Each Student Activity Fund shall be audited
2 as often as required at least annually by the Bureau
3 of Budget and Management Research in cooperation with
4 the Department of Education Fiscal Office and a copy of
5 the audit shall be filed with the Student Activities
6 Money Committee and the Board."

7 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law 12-190 is repealed.

8 Section 3. Section 4110.4 of the Government Code is
9 amended to read:

10 "Section 4110.4. Night Differential Pay. All
11 employees of the government of Guam except the department
12 or agency heads and the Deputy Directors shall be en-
13 titled to night differential pay, calculated at the rate
14 of their regular wage plus ten percent (10%), for all
15 periods worked between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m."

16 Section 4. This Act shall take effect immediately upon
17 enactment into law.
