




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO CREATE A GUAM PENITENTIARY TASK FORCE  
AND AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION FOR AN ARCHITECTURAL  
AND ENGINEERING DESIGN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The Governor shall appoint a Task Force to be  
3 composed of the Director of the Department of Corrections, the  
4 Director of the Department of Public Safety, the Attorney  
5 General, the Public Defender, the Director of the Territorial  
6 Crime Commission, the Director of the Department of Land Manage-  
7 ment, the Director of the Department of Public Works, the Director  
8 of the Department of Public Health & Social Services and two (2)  
9 members of the Territorial Planning Commission and two (2) members  
10 of the Parole Board. The Director of the Department of Correc-  
11 tions shall serve as chairman of the Task Force.

12 Section 2. The Task Force shall choose a site for a new  
13 penitentiary, preferably on land owned by the government of  
14 Guam, in an isolated location with an area large enough for  
15 future expansion so that the facility can be constructed in such  
16 a way that additional cells may be built with minimal cost.

17 Section 3. The Governor with the advice of the Task Force  
18 shall submit to the Legislature by no later than September 15, 1978  
19 a feasibility plan for the construction of a new penitentiary.  
20 Such plan shall include among other items: the type of facility  
21 needed and estimated cost of construction.

1           Section 4. The cost of the study not to exceed a total  
2 of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) shall be charged to the  
3 appropriation for the Department of Public Works subject to  
4 reimbursement by future appropriation to be made by the Legisla-  
5 ture.

6           Section 5. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars  
7 (\$250,000) is authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund  
8 for an architectural and engineering design for construction of  
9 a Guam Penitentiary as proposed pursuant to the provisions of  
10 this Act.

11          Section 6. Paragraph (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 4233  
12 of the Government Code is repealed. This section shall take  
13 effect on January 1, 1979 and shall not affect the interest of  
14 any person who contributed to the fund in conformance with the  
15 provisions of Paragraph (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 4233 of  
16 the Government Code.

17          Section 7. Section 85.50 of the Criminal and Correctional  
18 Code is hereby repealed.

19          Section 8. A new Chapter VII is added to Title XI of the  
20 Government Code to read:

21                           "CHAPTER VII

22                                   Jogging and Bicycle Pathways

23           Section 10400. The Director, after appropriate consul-  
24 tation with the Director of Parks and Recreation, shall  
25 develop plans to provide a jogging and bicycling pathways  
26 along the right-of-way of the major highways on government  
27 of Guam parks and on government of Guam owned land within the  
28 territory. Said plans shall be developed pursuant to the  
29 provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act."
