## FOURTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 1973 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 600

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AN ACT TO CREATE A GUAM PENITENTIARY TASK FORCE AND AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION FOR AN ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING DESIGN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Governor shall appoint a Task Force to be composed of the Director of the Department of Corrections, the Director of the Department of Public Safety, the Attorney General, the Public Defender, the Director of the Territorial Crime Commission, the Director of the Department of Land Management, the Director of the Department of Public Works, the Director of the Department of Public Health & Social Services and two (2) members of the Territorial Planning Commission and two (2) members of the Parole Board. The Director of the Department of Corrections shall serve as chairman of the Task Force.

Section 2. The Task Force shall choose a site for a new penitentiary, preferably on land owned by the government of Guam, in an isolated location with an area large enough for future expansion so that the facility can be constructed in such a way that additional cells may be built with minimal cost.

Section 3. The Governor with the advice of the Task Force shall submit to the Legislature by no later than September 15, 1978 a feasibility plan for the construction of a new penitentiary. Such plan shall include among other items: the type of facility needed and estimated cost of construction.

Section 4. The cost of the study not to exceed a total of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) shall be charged to the appropriation for the Department of Public Works subject to reimbursement by future appropriation to be made by the Legislature.

Section 5. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund for an architectural and engineering design for construction of a Guam Penitentiary as proposed pursuant to the provisions of this Act.

Section 6. Paragraph (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 4233 of the Government Code is repealed. This section shall take effect on January 1, 1979 and shall not affect the interest of any person who contributed to the fund in conformance with the provisions of Paragraph (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 4233 of the Government Code.

Section 7. Section 85.50 of the Criminal and Correctional Code is hereby repealed.

Section 8. A new Chapter VII is added to Title XI of the Government Code to read:

## "CHAPTER VII

Jogging and Bicycle Pathways

Section 10400. The Director, after appropriate consultation with the Director of Parks and Recreation, shall develop plans to provide a jogging and bicycling pathways along the right-of-way of the major highways on government of Guam parks and on government of Guam owned land within the territory. Said plans shall be developed pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act."
