



AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 11833
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FOR A
STUDENT MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF
THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11833 of the Government Code is
3 repealed and reenacted to read:

4 "Section 11833. Board of Regents. The government,
5 control and operation of the University is vested in a
6 Board of Regents to be known as the 'Board of Regents of
7 the University of Guam', (hereinafter referred to as
8 the 'Board'). The Board shall be composed of nine (9)
9 members of which eight (8) members, of which at least
10 one (1) member shall be a member of the University of
11 Guam Alumni Association, all citizens of the United
12 States of America and residents of Guam for at least
13 three (3) years, shall be appointed by the Governor
14 with the advice and consent of the Legislature for a
15 term of four (4) years, provided, however, that the
16 members of the existing Board of Regents of the Uni-
17 versity of Guam shall be deemed appointed to terms which
18 will expire at the end of their current appointments
19 without the necessity of the advice and consent of the
20 Legislature. The remaining Board member shall be a
21 resident of the territory of Guam, a citizen of the
22 United States who is enrolled as a student in the

1 University of Guam. The student member shall be a
2 full Board member with all rights, privileges and
3 responsibilities thereof and shall be appointed by the
4 Governor with the advice and consent of the Legisla-
5 ture for a term of two (2) years. Future appointments
6 to fill vacancies shall be made so as to assure that
7 the membership of the Board will include at least one
8 (1) University of Guam Alumni Association member and
9 a student member appointed for the duration of the un-
10 expired term of the office."

11 Section 2. Part I, Section 1, I.J.1.a.b., I.J.2.a.b.,
12 I.J.3.b. I.J.4.a., I.J.5.a., IX.A.1.d., and IX.A.2.a.b. of
13 Public Law 14-43, as amended by Public Laws 14-81, 14-84 and
14 14-87, are amended to read:

15 "I. For General Governmental Operations

16 1. Director's Office

- 17 a. Personal Services (not to
18 exceed 7 positions) \$ 113,363
19 b. Personnel Benefits \$ 13,334

20 2. Personnel Division

- 21 a. Personal Services (not to
22 exceed 4 positions) \$ 36,221
23 b. Personnel Benefits \$ 4,426

24 3. Supply Management Division

- 25 b. Personnel Benefits \$ 7,184

26 4. Architectural Engineering
27 Division

- 28 a. Personal Services (not to
29 exceed 49 positions) \$ 295,073

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- 5. Building Maintenance Division
 - a. Personal Services (not to exceed 62 positions) \$ 521,062

IX. For Transportation

- A. Department of Public Works
 - 1. Transportation Maintenance
 - d. Supplies & Materials \$ 882,825
 - 2. Bus Operations
 - a. Personal Services (not to exceed 270 positions) \$2,828,931
 - b. Personnel Benefits \$ 341,216".

Section 3. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, obligations incurred by the Department of Public Works during fiscal year ending June 30, 1978 may be paid out of the categories set forth in Public Law 14-43 as it is amended in Section 2 of this Act.

Section 4. For the purposes of paying obligations incurred during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978, Part II, Section 1, C.a., and D.a. of Public Law 14-43 are amended to read:

- "C. Highway Engineering/Construction Administration
 - a. Personal Services (not to exceed 56 positions) \$409,134
- D. Highway Maintenance
 - a. Personal Services (not to exceed 84 positions) \$619,681".

1 Section 5. Items 1., 2. and 4. of Part Two, Section
2 1. X.A. of Public Law 14-132 are amended to read:

3 "1. Personnel Services \$107,388
4 2. Personnel Benefits \$ 12,398
5 4. All Others \$726,200".

6 Section 6. A new Section 47009.1 is added to the
7 Government Code to read:

8 "Section 47009.1. All examination, license and
9 renewal fees received from such persons licensed under
10 the provisions of this Chapter shall be paid to the
11 government of Guam and deposited in a special fund,
12 'the Professional Engineer, Architect and Land Surveyors
13 Fund' to be used by the Board to administer and enforce
14 the laws relating to professional engineers, architects
15 and land surveyors. Expenditures from the fund shall
16 be made upon certification of the chairman of the Board
17 who is hereby designated the certifying officer. At
18 the end of each fiscal year, any amount exceeding Ten
19 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) in the fund shall be re-
20 verted to the General Fund."
