AN ACT TO CREATE A CRIMINAL JUSTICE BUILDING  
TASK FORCE AND AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION  
FOR AN ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING DESIGN  
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2       Section 1. The Governor shall appoint a Task Force to be  
3 composed of the Attorney General, the Director of the Department  
4 of Public Safety, the Director of the Department of Corrections,  
5 the Public Defender, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court,  
6 the Director of the Department of Land Management, the Director  
7 of the Department of Public Works, and two (2) members of the  
8 Territorial Planning Commission. The Attorney General shall serve  
9 as chairman of the Task Force.

10      Section 2. The Task Force shall choose a site, preferably  
11 on government of Guam owned land, for the construction of a  
12 Criminal Justice Building to house the Department of Public  
13 Safety, the Department of Law, the Public Defender Service Corpo-  
14 ration, the Judicial Branch and the Territorial Law Library.

15      Section 3. The Task Force shall report its recommendation  
16 to the Legislature of an appropriate site for a criminal justice  
17 building within ninety (90) days of enactment of this Act into  
18 law.

19      Section 4. The Legislature shall approve or disapprove the  
20 site selection by adoption of a resolution concerning the site  
21 chosen by the Task Force.

1           Section 5. The sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars  
2           (\$400,000) is authorized to be appropriated from the Unappropriated  
3           Surplus of the General Fund for an architectural and engineering  
4           design for the construction of a criminal justice building on the  
5           site selected by the Task Force and approved by the Legislature.

6           Section 6. The sum of One Hundred and Twenty Thousand  
7           Dollars (\$120,000) is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus  
8           in the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the  
9           purpose of paving the Pulantat Road in the municipality of Yona.

10          Section 7. There is hereby appropriated from the General  
11          Fund the sum of Twenty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Seven  
12          Dollars (\$23,577) to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor to  
13          implement the salary adjustments authorized by P. L. 14-87 effec-  
14          tive January 1, 1978 through June 30, 1978.

15          Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from any available  
16          funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum  
17          of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) to the Department of Public  
18          Works for the construction of lighting facilities for the basket-  
19          ball court next to the Dededo Public Library in the Dededo  
20          Central Park.

21          Section 9. Statement of Findings: The Legislature finds  
22          that the families who live in the area more particularly described  
23          as Lot No. 10102, Machananao, in Yigo have never had electrical  
24          power in their neighborhood; the Legislature further finds that  
25          this situation has caused hardship for those families as a result;  
26          the Legislature further finds that it is unfair that the residents  
27          of this neighborhood be denied access to such an important and  
28          vital utility as electrical power; the Legislature, therefore, con-  
29          cludes that access to electrical power should be provided for the  
30          families who live in that neighborhood.

1           Section 10. There is hereby appropriated from any available  
2 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum  
3 of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) to the Guam Power Authority  
4 for the installation of power lines, primary and secondary, at  
5 Lot No. 10102, Machananao, Yigo, and for the extension of needed  
6 power lines along either side of the haul road between Liangilao  
7 and Anderson Air Force Base.

8           Section 11. There is hereby appropriated the following sums:

9           A. From the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Forty  
10 Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) for the installation of fire  
11 hydrants along Tenbat Street and Franquez Street in Mongtong  
12 and Maite; and

13           B. From the General Fund the sum of Fourteen Thousand  
14 Dollars (\$14,000) for the renovation of the Tamuning  
15 Commissioner's Office.
