AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR COMMERCIAL AND RECREATIONAL FISHING FACILITIES AT THE AGAMA BOAT BASIN AND AUTHORIZING THE DIVISION OF AQUATIC AND WILDLIFE RESOURCES TO MANAGE FEDERAL AND LOCAL FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:


Section 1. The government shall lease to the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per annum an area of the Agana Boat Basin not to exceed one (1) acre which is designated by the Department of Parks and Recreation in its master plan as the best type for a fuel station and which is identified as such on the attached map which is incorporated as a part hereof. The Department of Land Management shall survey the designated area within four (4) weeks after the effective date of this Act and provide the government with a proper legal description of the area.

Section 2. Upon amendment of Public Law 86-664 or a favorable court opinion entitling the use of a portion of Agana Boat Basin or the Paseo de Susana by the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association, the government shall renegotiate its lease with the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association and provide a total area of not to exceed one (1) acre of land in the Agana Boat Basin or Paseo de Susana adjacent to the site leased for the fuel station for the use of the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association as a cold storage plant, ice plant, easy loader and scale platform and a building for the headquarters and retail and

wholesale transactions of the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association with adjacent parking facilities.

Section 3. The land leased to the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association shall be for initial period of ten (10) years renewable for additional ten (10) year terms for a total of fifty (50) years. Upon expiration of the said fifty (50) years, the lease shall be subject to renegotiation between the government of Guam and the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association.

Section 4. The Aquatic and Wildlife Resources Division is authorized to accept federal grants-in-aid to develop commercial and recreational fishing facilities in Guam. The Aquatic and Wildlife Resources Division shall assist the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association and is authorized to accept any and all federal funding relating to the Guam Fishermen's Cooperative Association.
