AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 15200.14 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE AS ENACTED IN SECTION 1 OF PUBLIC LAW 13-202, SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 14-84 AND SECTION 12 OF PUBLIC LAW 14-91, RELATIVE TO POSTPONING THE DATE OF THE REFERENDUM OF THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTION FOR GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 15200.14 of the Government Code, as enacted in Section 1 of Public Law 13-202, Section 4 of Public Law 14-84 and Section 12 of Public Law 14-91, are repealed.

Section 2. The general election to be held on November 7, 1978 shall not deal with the approval of the proposed Constitution for Guam. If ballots have been printed prior to the effective date of this Act and if it would be impractical to print new ballots, the Election Commission shall, by rule, cause said ballots to reflect the fact that the referendum for the approval of the proposed Constitution of Guam is not an issue in the general election. If the part of the ballot dealing with the Constitutional Referendum is marked, there shall be no tabulation of such marks.

Section 3. A new Section 15200.14 is added to read:

"Section 15200.14. Referendum. The proposed Constitution as so approved or modified by the congress shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Guam for acceptance or rejection through an islandwide referendum to be held on June 2, 1979." Section 4. The Legislature is committed to appropriate such sums as it determines to be reasonably necessary to conduct a referendum for the new Constitution and an educational program emphasizing positive and negative embodied therein, to be translated, published and mailed to registered voters prior thereto. The Committee on General Governmental Operations and the Committee on Finance and Taxation shall within 30 days from the effective date of this Act propose to the Legislature the sum needed to be appropriated to accomplish the purpose of this section. Such recommendation shall not be made without the Committees having first consulted with the Election Commission and other interested parties, and held at least one public hearing.
