AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 11810 AND 11813 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF STUDENT LOANS AND MERIT AWARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 11810 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 11810. Maximum limits on loan. Loans granted pursuant to this subchapter to students attending the University of Guam shall not exceed Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) per year and loans granted to students attending off-island colleges or universities shall not exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) per year."

Section 2.--Section 11813 of the Government Code is amended

"Section 11813. Benefits. Students entitled to merit awards pursuant to this subchapter shall receive the following benefits:

(a) Free tuition and fees to be paid by theFund for a period of not more than four (4) yearsat the University of Guam;

(b) An annual allowance of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) per year for room and board, textbooks and educational supplies to be disbursed monthly in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board." Section 3. Section 13602 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 13602. Sale of land to permittee or leasees. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person qualified to own land in Guam who has occupied Tract 103 Lot No. 13 and Tract 103, Lot No. 14 and Lot No. 8, Block No. 7, Machananao Subdivision under a government of Guam land use permit or leasehold in the municipalities of Chalan Pago and Yigo shall be entitled to purchase the land so occupied but not to exceed one (1) lot; on the condition that (1) he has continuously and uninterruptedly occupied said land for more than three (3) years and (2) he owns no other land in Guam. Any land acquired pursuant to this Section shall not be resold by the owner within ten (10) years from the date of sale thereof."

Section 4. The sale authorized herein shall not require any further Legislative approval.

Section 5. A new Subsection 4234(f) is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"(f). Annually, on or before the start of a fiscal year, the Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund shall certify to the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research the amount required to implement the provisions of this Section (but not to include the cost of benefits to be made pursuant to Chapter III, Title V of the Government Code of Guam). Upon the acceptance of the amount so certified by the Director of Bureau of Budget and Management Research, said amount shall become an appropriation of

the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund of the Government of Guam, and, accordingly, shall be so recorded in the books of accounts of the General Fund. Upon the release of the appropriation by the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Treasurer of Guam shall pay said amount to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund in increments provided by the release of the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research.

Within thirty (30) days after the appropriation is made hereunder, a copy of the instrument thereof shall be furnished to the Guam Legislature."

Section 6. Section 6 of Public Law 14-118 is repealed in
its entirety.

Section 7. The sum of Forty-One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$41,690) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the University of Guam's Scholarship and Student Loan Funds.

Section 8. The sum of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) is appropriated to the Sports Fund for the purpose of sending the Guam Eagles to Honolulu to participate in the Pan American International Friendship Bowl.

Section 9. The repeal of the appropriation made in Section 6 of this Act shall be used to satisfy the appropriations made in Sections 7 and 8 of this Act.

25 Section 10. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is 26 hereby appropriated from any Unappropriated Surplus of the General 27 Fund to the Department of Education for the purpose of sending 28 the members of the joint Vocational Technical-George Washington 29 High Schools Army J.R.O.T.C. drill team to participate in the 30 competition to be held at Honolulu, April, 1979.
