### FOURTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 1978 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 635 (As Substituted by the Committee on Commerce, Tourism 4 Transportation)

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Introduced by Committee on Rules at the request of the Governor

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTIONS 12230, 12230.1 AND 12230.2 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD CHAPTER V TO TITLE XLIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sections 12230, 12230.1 and 12230.2 of the Government Code of Guam are repealed.

Section 2. Chapter V is added to Title XLIV of the Government Code of Guam to read:

#### "CHAPTER V

#### Public Harket

Section 47400. The Department of Commerce shall maintain and operate under its control a public market or markets for Guam products at such place or places as the Director may deem proper. Any such market shall be maintained and operated at all times in a sanitary and orderly manner, beneficial to both producers and patrons alike. Producers and sellers desiring to use space within such market to display or sell their produce shall be levied a uniform fee based on the amount of space used and period of such use.

Section 47401. Public Market Revolving Fund.

(a) There is established a fund to be known as the Public Market Revolving Fund which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith.

(c) All funds collected from fees levied pursuant to Section 47400 shall be deposited in the Public Market Revolving Fund."

Section 3. Item 12 of Fart II, Section 1, VI. of Public Law 14-132, as amended by Section 2 of Public Law 14-140, and as amended by Section 10 of Public Law 14-150, is amended to read:

"12. Secondary Education

Section 4. Section 1., IV., A., of Public Law 14-87, as amended by Public Law 14-132, is amended to read:

"IV. General Operation of the Fourteenth Guam Legislature.

A. For expenses of general operation, to include Personal Services, Personnel Benefits, Travel and Transportation, Contractual Services, Supplies and Materials, Equipment, Miscellaneous Contingent Expenses and for the lump sum payment

of annual leave accrued and due to its employees, not to exceed One Million Eight Hundred Forty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty-Two Dollars (\$1,541,522). The sum appropriated herein may also be allocated among the standing committees of the Legislature to fund for year-end expenditures and the accrued leave of their staffs."

Section 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature Operations Fund the sum of Two Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000), of which Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) shall be alloted to the Minority Office, to provide for the operation expenses of the Fifteenth Guam Legislature. The appropriation made by this section is an interimal appropriation.

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Section 6. There is appropriated to the Legislature Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to provide for expenses incurred in conducting the Inauguration of the Fifteenth Guam Legislature. The Speaker of the Fourteenth Guam Legislature is authorized to commit and expend funds from this appropriation prior to January 1, 1979.

Section 7. The road running from Route 1 to San Vitores Road now known as Hospital Road is renamed "Chalan San Antonio".

Section 8. Notwithstanding any provisions of law, rule, or regulations to the contrary, the avenue designated as Snyder Avenue, more specifically that stretch of road within the village of Agat that intersects Buenas Street and Juan L. G. Guerrero Street is hereby renamed Sgt. Emilio Nededog Avenue.

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Section 9. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Sixty
Thousand Dollars (\$60,000), of which Twenty Thousand Dollars
(\$20,000) shall be alloted to the Minority Office, from the General
Fund to the Guam Legislature for the renovation and additional
office space.

Section 10. Section 4220 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 4220. The responsibility for the operation of the fund shall be vested in a board of trustees of five (5) persons appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. Three (3) members shall be employees having at least five (5) years total service credit as members of the fund. The terms of office shall be for five (5) years except that the original appointees shall be appointed for terms of one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4) and five (5) years. As their terms expire, new members shall be appointed to fill vacancies and such appointments shall be made for terms of five (5) years. In the case of an appointment to fill an unexpired term, the appointment shall be for only so long as the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 11. Section 4222 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 4222. Director of Fund. The Director of the fund shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees and shall be in charge of the administration of the detailed affairs of the fund. He shall keep all books, records, files and accounts of the fund and receive all applications for annuities, benefits and refunds. He shall prepare periodic reports relative to the operations of the fund and an annual

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report as of the close of each fiscal year reflecting the results of the financial operations of the fund and embodying all important financial and statistical data pertinent to its operation."

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Section 12. Transition period. Any member of the Board of Trustees not qualifying for his position under the provisions of Section 4220 of the Government Code, as amended by this Act; shall be disqualified to hold office thirty (30) days after the effective date of the provisions of this Act. The Governor shall appoint new members to fill vacancies on the Board of Trustees as soon as possible after the effective date of the provisions of this Act.

Section 13. Section 4019.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 4019.1. (a) All companies or other legal entities providing or applying to provide prepaid health insurance to government of Guam employees shall make their financial records available to the Director of Administration annually. Such records shall be public records.

- (b) The Director of Administration shall promulgate rules and regulations setting forth the information he requires from the companies or legal entities; the time for his review of such information and the method such information shall be reported.
- (c) The Director of Administration shall examine the financial information of the prepaid health insurance companies or other legal entities for the purpose of developing the most economical and beneficial prepaid health plan for government of Guam employees."

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Section 14. Section 18(d) of Public Law 14-150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 18(d). The sum of One Million One Hundred Fifty Four Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars (\$1,154,952) is hereby appropriated to Public Utility Agency of Guam through June 30, 1930 to be expended for water services connections as follows:

\$606,499.00

Labor and Equipment

\$545,453.00".

Section 15. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) to the Department of Corrections for the erection of a second perimeter fence around the Guam Penitentiary.

Section 16. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) to the Department of Corrections to purchase, maintain and operate a standby power generator to the Guam Penitentiary.

Section 17. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to designate government owned real property in the municipality of Dededo not to exceed ten (10) hectares for the construction of baseball playing fields.

Section 18. This Act shall be effective upon the enactment of this measure.

Section 19. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Retirement Fund the sum of Thirty-Five Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$35,700) to pay the retirement pension of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of Guam for the Fiscal Year ending September 50, 1979 pursuant to the provisions of Section 4234(a) of the Government Code of Guam. Any portion of the amount herein appropriated which remains unexpended as of September 50, 1979 shall be returned to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund.
