AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER II TO TITLE XXIX OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO ESTABLISH THE GUAM TERRITORIAL LAW LIBRARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. A new Chapter II is added to Title XXIX
of the Government Code to read:

"CHAPTER II

Guam Territorial Law Library

Section 28500. (a) A non-profit public corporation

The Guam Territorial Law Library, is hereby chartered.

(b) The Guam Territorial Law Library, as a nonprofit educational corporation, shall be exempt from taxes and licensing requirements under the laws of Guam.

Section 28501. Existence and function. (a) There is established in the territory of Guam a Board of Law Library Trustees, which governs the Guam Territorial Law Library.

- (b) The first Board of Trustees shall prepare
 Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws for the governing
 of the library. The Articles and By-laws shall be filed
 with the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation and the Legislative Secretary and shall become
 effective upon filing.
- (c) The Board of Trustees, by majority vote, may appoint a law librarian whose duties, compensation, qualifications and tenure of office shall be determined by the Board. The librarian shall be the administrative

head of the law library and shall be responsible to the 1 Board of Law Library Trustees for the administration of 2 3 personnel and service activities of the Guam Territorial 4 Library. Section 28502. Membership of Board: number of 5 6 members: manner of appointment. (a) The Board of Law 7_ . Library Trustees established in Section 28501 of this 8 Chapter shall initially consist of eleven (11) nembers 9 and shall initially be constituted as follows: 10 (1) the presiding judge of the Superior Court 11 may appoint himself to serve ex-officio as trustee, 1.2 or, in the event he chooses not to so serve, he shall appoint a law clerk in the employ of the Superior 13 14 Court of Guam or a member of the Guam Bar to serve as 15 trustee; 16 (2) the judge of the District Court of Guam 17 may appoint himself to serve ex-officio as a trustee, 18 or, in the event he chooses not to so serve, he may 19 appoint a law clerk in the employ of the District 20 Court of Guam or a member of the Guam Bar to serve 21 as trustee; but if there be more than one (1) judge 22 of the District Court, such judges may appoint one 23 (1) of their number to serve ex-officio as trustee, 24 or, in the event they choose not to appoint one (1) 25 of their number to so serve, they may appoint a law 26 clerk in the employ of the District Court or a 27 member of the Guam Bar to serve as trustee; 28 (3) the associate judges of the Superior 29 Court of Guam may appoint one (1) of their number 30 to serve ex-officio as a trustee, or, in the event 31 that they choose not to appoint one (1) of their 32 number to so serve, they shall appoint a law clerk 33 in the employ of the Superior Court or a member of 34 the Guam Bar to serve as trustee;

(4) the Judicial Council shall appoint 1 one (1) trustee who is a member of the Guam Bar; 2 (5) the Chairman of the Judiciary and 3 Criminal Justice Committee of the Guam Legislature shall appoint one (1) trustee who is a member of 5 the Guam Bar; (6) the Territorial Librarian shall be a 7 trustee. ex-officio; 8 (7) the Governor of Guam shall appoint one (1) 9 trustee who is a member of the Guam Bar; and 10 (8) the President of the Guam Bar Association 11 shall appoint four (4) trustees who are members of 12 the Bar of the Territory of Guam. 13 (b) Following the expiration of the terms of 14 membership of the initial members of the Board of Law 15 Library Trustees, the Board of Law Library Trustees 16 shall thereafter consist of nine (9) members, and shall 17 be constituted as follows: 13 (1) the Chief Justice of the territory or in 19 the event no Chief Justice is serving, the presiding 20 judge of the Superior Court may appoint himself to 21 serve ex-officio as a trustee, or, in the event he 22 chooses not to so serve, he shall appoint a law 23 clerk in the employ of the Court or a member of the 24 Guam Bar to serve as trustea; 25 (2) the judge of the District Court may appoint 26 himself to serve ex-officio as a trustee, or, in the 27 event he chooses not to so serve, he may appoint a 28 law clerk in the employ of the District Court or a 29 member of the Guam Bar to serve as trustee; provided, 30 that if there be more than one (1) judge of the 31 District Court, such judges may appoint one (1) of 32 their number to serve ex-officio as a trustee, or, 33 in the event they choose not to appoint one (1) of 34

their number to so serve, they may appoint a law clerk in the employ of the District Court or a member of the Guam Bar to serve as truatee;

- appoint one (1) of their number to serve ex-officions as a trustee, or, in the event they choose not to appoint one (1) of their number to so serve, they shall appoint a law clerk in the employ of the Superior Court or a member of the Guam Bar to serve as trustee;
- (4) the Judicial Council shall appoint one (1) trustee who is a member of the Guam Bar;
- (5) The Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice of the Guam Legislature shall appoint one (1) trustee who is a member of the Guam Bar;
- (6) the Territorial Librarian shall be a trustee ex-officio;
- (7) the Governor shall appoint one (1) trusted who is a member of the Guam Bar; and
- (8) the President of the Cuam Bar Association shall appoint two (2) trustees who are members of the Guam Bar.

Section 28503. Same: term of membership on Board.

- (a) The initial members of the Board of Law Library
 Trustees shall be appointed within one (1) month after
 the effective date of this Act. The initial members of
 the Board of Law Library Trustees as so constituted shall
 serve a term which shall expire at midnight on December
 31, 1981.
- (b) Not more than one (1) month before the expiration of the terms of the initial members of the Board of Law Library Trustees as set forth in Subsection (a)

of this section, those persons empowered by Section 28502(b) of this Chapter to appoint members of the Board of Law Library Trustees shall submit in writing to the President of the Board of Law Library Trustees the names of their respective appointees. The terms of membership of such appointees upon the Board of Law Library Trustees shall commence at 12:01 a.m. on January 1, 1932, and shall expire as follows:

- (1) the terms of membership of those members appointed pursuant to the provisions of Section 28502(b) (1), (4) and (7) shall expire at midnight on December 31, 1984;
- (2) the terms of membership of those members appointed pursuant to the provisions of Section 28502(b) (2) and (8) shall expire at midnight on December 31, 1983; and
- (3) the terms of membership of those members appointed pursuant to the provisions of Section 28502(b) (3), (5) and (6) shall expire at midnight on December 31, 1982.
- (c) Not more than one (1) month before the expiration of the term of each member of the Board of Law Library Trustees as set forth in Subsections (b) and (c) of this section, those persons empowered by Section 28502(b) of this Chapter to appoint such members of the Board of Law Library Trustees shall submit in writing to the President of the Board of Law Library Trustees the names of their appointees. The term of membership of such appointees upon the Board of Law Library Trustees shall commence at 12:01 a.m. on January 1 of the year following the expiration of his predecessor's term of membership, and shall expire at midnight on December 31, thirty-six (36) months thereafter.

(d) In the event that any member of Board of Law
Library Trustees shall die, resign or otherwise be removed
from the Board prior to the expiration of his term as set
forth in this section, the vacancy so created shall be
filled for the remainder of such member's term in the same
manner in which the member whose death, resignation or
removal that created such vacancy was appointed.

Section 28504. Establishment, maintenance and regulation of Territorial Law Library: leasing or constructing quarters; furniture and services: regulations. The Board of Law Library Trustees shall establish and maintain a Law Library in Agana, as close to the Judiciary Building as possible. The Board may lease or construct suitable quarters to house the library facility and shall provide these quarters with suitable furniture and services for utilities, maintenance and security. The Board shall coordinate with the Nieves M. Flores Library concerning access to material by providing a catalog of the law library collection at the central library.

Section 28505. Nature of office of trustee: compensation. The office of trustee is honorary, without
salary or other compensation. Ordinary and necessary
expenses of trustees may be reimbursed from the funds of
the Territorial Law Library upon application approved by
the Board.

Section 28506. Grounds for removal of members. The Board of Law Library Trustees, acting pursuant to the provisions of the Articles and By-laws of the Territorial Law Library, may remove a trustee for cause.

Section 28507. Designation of president. The Board shall elect one (1) of its number as president, whose powers and duties shall be prescribed in the Articles and By-laws.

Section 28508. Election of treasurer and secretary: duties and powers.

- (a) The Board of Law Library Trustees shall elect from its members a treasurer, who shall keep a full statement and account of all property, money, receipt and expenditures of the law library.
- (b) The Board shall elect from its members a secretary who shall keep a record and full minutes in writing of all proceedings of the Board. The secretary may certify to such proceedings, or any part thereof, under his hand, verified by an official seal adopted and provided by the Board for that purpose.

Section 28509. Disposition of money collected. All money collected for the law library must be paid into the hands of the treasurer of the law library, or his designee, who must keep the same in a bank account or accounts in the name of 'The Guam Territorial Law Library,' to be expended by the Board of Law Library Trustees.

All funds that are a part of the Superior Court

Law Library Fund at the time this Act becomes effective

shall be immediately transferred to the 'Guam Territorial

Law Library.'

Section 28510. Fee payable for libraries: when to be paid: commencement etc., of action, proceeding, etc.

(a) On the commencement in, or the removal to, the Superior Court of any civil action, proceeding or appeal, the party instituting such proceeding, or filing the first papers, shall pay to the clerk of the court, for the Territorial Law Library, a law library fee computed in accordance with the following schedule or such increased schedule as may be duly adopted by the Judicial Council.

Same: from members of Guam Bar 28 Association. Each active member of the Bar of the 29 territory, as part of his or her dues for membership in 30 the Guam Bar under the Guam Integrated Act, shall pay 31 Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per year to the Territorial Law 32 Library Fund. Said contribution shall be collected with - 8 -

the annual dues for the Bar of Guam and transmitted by it to the Territorial Law Library Fund.

> Section 28512. Authority of Legislature to augment fund with appropriations. The Legislature may appropriate from the General Fund for the Territorial Law Library such additional sums as may in its discretion appear proper. When so appropriated such funds shall be paid to the treasurer of the Territorial Law Library for deposit in the Territorial Law Library Fund and for all purposes.

Section 28513. Use of libraries: removal of books: regulation. The Territorial Law Library shall be free to the judiciary, to members of the Guam Bar, and to all residents for the examination of books and other publications at the library or its branches.

Section 28514. Furnishing of reports, statutes and other documents. (a) The Governor shall cause to be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library at least one (1) copy of each executive order, administrative regulations and each attorney general's opinion which has been or shall be promulgated in the territory.

- (b) The Chief Justice of the territory shall cause to be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library at least one (1) copy of every decision, opinion and order of the Supreme Court of the territory, and at least one (1) copy of all rules promulgated by the Supreme Court of the territory.
- (c) The presiding judge of the Superior Court shall cause to be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library at least one (1) copy of every decision, opinion and order of the Superior Court, and at least one (1) copy of all rules promulgated by the Superior Court.

(d) The Speaker of the Guam Legislature shall cause to be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library at least one (1) copy each of every public law, of every vetoed bill and every bill introduced in the Guam Legislature, and at least one (1) copy of every item included in the legislative history of every bill considered by the Guam Legislature or any committee or subcommittee thereof.

(e) In addition to the materials which shall be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library pursuant to the provisions of Subsections (a) through (d), inclusive, of this section, the Governor, the Chief Justice, the presiding judge of the Superior Court and the Speaker of the Guam Legislature shall transmit or cause to be transmitted to the Territorial Law Library any other public records which shall be designated by the Territorial Law Librarian.

its publication of any of the official documents referred to in this section, he shall submit one (1) copy, free of charge, to the Territorial Law Library. When such publication has commenced, the officials referred to in this section shall not be required to submit the documents stated above unless requested to do so by the Board of Law Library Trustees."

Section 2. The Governor is authorized to dedicate government owned real property not to exceed 40,000 square feet to the Girl Scouts of America for the construction of a headquarters building. Said dedication shall provide if any of the property dedicated shall not be used and maintained for the aforesaid purpose, or if any part shall cease to be used

and maintained for the aforesaid purpose, or if any part shall be used for any other purpose inconsistent with such purpose, then all right, title and interest in and to the property and to the improvements thereon, shall revert to and revest in the dedicator, government of Guam.

Section 3. Any appropriation made to pay the accumulated annual leave of the employees of the Fourteenth Guam Legislature shall include an allocation for the employees of the Minority Office.

Rosarian Foundation for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per annum, not more than twenty (20) acres of government owned land located in the municipality of Dededo on Lot 5173-1-R2 NEW, registered on November 20, 1952, Certificate of Title 5597, land square 13 Section 1. The government shall require the land to be used for construction of the International Pacific Headquarters of the Chamorro Rosarian Foundation and the Chamorro Society of the Marianas and to planting ground areas for rose gardens.
