AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 10 OF PUBLIC LAW 11-179 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of Public Law 11-81, as amended by Section 10 of Public Law 11-179 is further amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the General Fund the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000) to the Public Utility Agency Wastewater Fund for the purpose of advancing the costs of sewer connection line installations to private residential homes, and of Type 2 toilet facility installations and connections pursuant to the provisions of Section 9671 et seq. of the Government Code of Guam provided, however, that no single advance shall exceed the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500).

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000) to the Public Utility Agency Wastewater Fund to provide for the connection of sewer lines

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and the installation and connection of Type 2 toilet facilities without cost to private residences owned and occupied by families certified by the Department of Public Health and Social Services to be underprivileged according to guidelines established by said Department." Section 2. Section 9671.8 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

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"Section 9671.8. Repayment of installments. The cost of the installation of connection lines to the public sewer and of Type 2 toilet facilities shall be borne by each individual homeowner and the cost thereof shall be repaid to the Fund on an installation basis in equal installments over a period not to exceed four (4) years from the date the sewer connection or the toilet facility shall have been completed."

Section 3. A new Section 9671.11 is added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 9671.11. Expiration of Fund. The Public Utility Agency Wastewater Fund shall expire as of June 30, 1985, after which time, no further advances or grants shall be made. In addition, balances within the Fund at the date shall be returned to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund. Loans outstanding at that date shall be repaid in the manner prescribed by contract, except that payment shall be made to the Treasurer of Guam and deposited in the General Fund account. The Chief Officer of the Public Utility Agency of Guam shall at that time relinquish all records of the Fund to the Director of Administration who shall be responsible for same and collection of loans outstanding."

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Section 4. Sections 805f, 805g, 805h, 805i and 805j are added to the Penal Code to read:

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"Section 805f. Grand Jury, duty of. It shall be the duty of the Grand Jury to examine all evidence coming to its attention and upon the basis of such evidence return either a true bill of indictment or a no bill. The Grand Jury also may issue such statements or reports as it finds proper.

Section 805g. Grand Jury, power to investigate. In the discharge of the duty imposed upon it by Section 805f of this Code the Grand Jury is empowered to conduct such investigations as it may find warranted to ascertain the truth or falsity of the evidence it may be called upon to weigh. In carrying out such investigations the Grand Jury may request the assistance of the Department of Law or the Department of Public Safety or such other agencies of the government as it may find could be of assistance or, upon the availability of funds appropriated for such purpose and in accordance with such appropriation, it may engage its own investigatory staff to assist it. No person engaged by the Grand Jury shall be an employee of the Executive, Legislative or Judicial branches of government but shall be an independent contractor engaged to provide services to the Grand Jury for a period not to exceed the life of the Grand Jury. For purposes of administration any person engaged to assist the Grand Jury shall be compensated from the Special Grand Jury Fund upon the presentation of a voucher approved by the foreman of the Grand Jury.

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Section 805h. Special Fund: creation. There is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'Special Grand Jury Fund'. This fund shall be maintained separate and apart from other funds of the Government of Guam and independent records kept as to its use. No expenditure may be made from this fund except in accordance with this Act.

Section 805i. Same: administration of fund. The Treasurer of Guam shall be solely responsible for the administration of the Special Grand Jury Fund. He shall make expenditures from said fund in accordance with law and pursuant to written requests of the foreman of the Grand Jury. There shall be no certifying or disbursing officer of the fund.

Section 805j. Assistance of the Director of Administration. The Director of Administration is directed to provide such clerical, logistic and administrative support as the Grand Jury shall require when notified of the need for such assistance in writing by the foreman of the Territorial Grand Jury."

Section 5. There is appropriated from any Unappropriated Surplus in the General Fund to the Special Grand Jury Fund the sum of Sixty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$63,500). This appropriation shall expire on December 31, 1977. Any unexpended balance of the funds appropriated by this Act remaining on December 31, 1977 shall automatically revert to the General Fund. None of the moneys appropriated herein shall be obligated, committed, utilized or expended for any expenses

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arising after December 31, 1977. The funds appropriated to the Special Grand Jury Fund shall be used to conduct an investigation into illegal drug activities in or affecting the territory and particularly to investigate in a thorough and expeditious manner the alleged involvement of Senators in illegal drug activities so that such allegations may either be proven false or substantiated. The funds shall be expended in the following manner only:

19	Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from any available
20	balance in the Unappropriated Balance of the General Fund the

sum of One Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000) to the Department of Public Works to initiate a Pilot Program for the repair and rehabilitation of ten (10) seven-and-eight-year old school buses to extend their usefulness an additional three (3) to four (4) years.

Section 7. Any unexpended balance remaining of the appropriation made by Section 6 of this Act on June 30, 1978, shall revert to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund.

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Section 8. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Two 21 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) from the Tourist Attraction 22 23 Fund to the Department of Public Works for the construction of a bicycle/pedestrian path at least eight feet (8') wide 24 along the oceanside of San Vitores Road from Route 14 (Hospital 25 Road) to the Okura Hotel. The construction shall provide for 26 adequate drainage and distance from the San Vitores Road to 27 ensure the safety of both bicycle riders and pedestrians using 28 the path. 29

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Section 10. The unexpended balance of the appropriation to the Special Study Committee on Cost of Living created by Resolution No. 213, Twelfth Guam Legislature, which appropriation is contained in Public Law 12-121, is hereby transferred to the Tourist Attraction Fund to partially satisfy the appropriation contained in Section 9 of this Act.

Section 11. The unexpended balance of the appropriation to the Select Committee on Sports Wagering created by Resolution No. 22, Twelfth Guam Legislature, which appropriation is contained in Public Law 12-121, is hereby transferred to the Tourist Attraction Fund to partially satisfy the appropriation contained in Section 9 of this Act.

Section 12. The unexpended balance of the appropriation to the Select Committee for the Implementation of Resolution No. 5, Twelfth Guam Legislature, which appropriation is contained in Public Law 12-60, is hereby transferred to the Tourist Attraction Fund to partially satisfy the appropriation contained in Section 9 of this Act.

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
