AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE TERRITORIAL HIGHWAY FUND TO SUPPLEMENT PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO BRIDGES ALONG ROUTE 4 IN INARAJAN.

WHEREAS, the Legislature had by Public Law 12-95, 12-198 and 13-142 appropriated Nine Hundred Sixty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$964,000) for the construction of bridges in the municipality of Inarajan; and

WHEREAS, the lowest bidder requires One Million One Hundred Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Four Dollars (\$1,112,504) to undertake the project; and

WHEREAS, an additional appropriation of One Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred Four Dollars (\$148,504) would be needed to award the contract to the lowest bidder; and

1 WHEREAS, Public Works requires an additional Two Hundred Thirty-Seven Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars (\$237,496) 2 for Public Works administration and contingency and One Hundred 3 Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$180,000) for increased labor cost, thus raising the total project cost to One Million Five Hundred 5 Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,530,000); and 6 WHEREAS, this project should commence immediately to avoid further cost escalation and further inconvenience to the residents of the southern districts; now, therefore, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Five Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$566,000) effective July 1, 1978, to supplement prior appropriations for the construction of two bridges along Route 4 in Inarajan.

Section 2. Any unexpended balance remaining in the appropriation made by Section 1 of this Act shall revert to the Unappropriated Surplus of the Territorial Highway Fund on June 30, 1979.

Section 3(a). Part I, Section 2.A.1 of Public Law 14-43 is hereby amended to read as fellows:

"A. Judicial Branch

- 1. Courts and Ministerial Offices
 - f. Equipment (sedan for District Court)

- g. Miscellaneous Items
 - 1. Microfilming \$ 3,000

(b) Section 3002.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read:

Section 3002.1. Same: government vehicles. government vehicle, whether government-owned or leased, shall be used for other than official purposes. vehicle shall be used for the transportation of any government officer or employee between his place of abode and place of employment except in connection with official duties for the convenience of the government. Subject to the limitations imposed herein, the Governor by Executive Order, the Legislature through its Committee on Rules, and the Judicial Council by rule, shall prescribe the use of government vehicles assigned respectively to the Executive Branch, Legislative Branch, and Judicial Branch, and shall take appropriate action to discipline any member of their respective branches who shall violate this section. Such action may be by way of administrative fine, suspension, or removal, and in the case of members of the classified service shall be taken pursuant to the Personnel Law. Such action shall not preclude prosecution for any criminal offense. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any vehicle assigned for the use of the Governor, the Speaker of the Legislature, or the Secretary of Guam." Section 4. Section 3(b) foregoing shall become effective upon the change of the incumbent judge of the District Court of Guam.
