


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 16026 TO THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO ISSUANCE OF BUSINESS
LICENSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 16026 is hereby added to the Government
3 Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 16026. Employment Discrimination. Applicants
5 for business licenses shall be required to attest to under
6 oath to the following:

7 (a) 'I shall not fail or refuse to hire or to
8 discharge any individual, or otherwise to discriminate
9 against any individual with respect to his compensation,
10 terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because
11 of such individual's race, color, religion, sex, or
12 national origin;

13 (b) I shall not limit, segregate, or classify
14 employees in any way which would deprive or tend to
15 deprive any individual of employment opportunities or
16 otherwise adversely affect his status as an employee,
17 because of such individual's race, color, religion, sex,
18 or national origin'."

19 Section 2. The oath prescribed under Sections 16026(a) and
20 16026(b) shall be incorporated in the business license application
21 in affidavit form subscribed and sworn to by the applicant before
22 a Notary Public.

1 Section 3. The provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Act
2 shall be effective on January 1, 1978. The provisions of
3 Sections 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this Act shall be effective upon
4 enactment.

5 Section 4. A new Section 16026.1 is hereby added to the
6 Government Code of Guam to read:

7 "Section 16026.1. The License Board shall have the
8 power to suspend or revoke any license when, after formal
9 hearing, it determines that a licensee has intentionally
10 or knowingly practiced employment discrimination."

11 Section 5. Section 23100(c) of the Government Code is amended
12 to read:

13 "(c). A person having in his immediate possession a
14 valid operator's or chauffeur's license issued by any other
15 territory or state of the United States or the country of
16 Japan, may drive a motor vehicle upon the highways for a
17 period not exceeding thirty (30) days from the date such
18 person arrived in Guam. In addition, a person having in his
19 immediate possession a temporary operator's or chauffeur's
20 license issued under this Title may drive a motor vehicle
21 upon the highways for a period not exceeding thirty (30)
22 days, while the Department of Public Safety is completing
23 its investigation and determination of all facts relative
24 to the applicant's right to receive a license. Such temporary
25 license is invalid when the applicant's license has been
26 issued or refused."

27 Section 6. Notwithstanding any laws, rules and regulations
28 to the contrary, the drive designated as Senator Gibson's Drive,
29 more specifically that stretch of road within the village of
30 Sinajana extending from the junction of said Gibson's Drive and
31 Chalan Macajna to the junction of that drive and Chalan Canton
32 Tutujan is hereby renamed Pale Kieran Hickey Drive.

1 Section 7. Section 3 of Public Law 14-41 is amended to read:

2 "Section 3. Any property owner affected by the rezoning
3 in this Act may, notwithstanding the provisions of this Act,
4 and not more than one hundred fifty (150) days after the
5 effective date of this Act, notify the Territorial Planning
6 Commission that he desires that his land remain zoned as
7 it is on the effective date of this Act, and his land shall
8 remain so zoned."
