AN ACT DIRECTING THE GOVERNOR TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY MEASURES TO PREVENT THE CESSATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE TRAVEL OVER THE TALOFOFO BRIDGE DURING THE UPGRADING OR CONSTRUCTION OF THE TALOFOFO BAY BRIDGE FROM ENDANGERING THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE RESIDENTS OF THE VILLAGES OF MALOJLOJ, INARAJAN, MERIZO AND UMATAC AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS. on August 1, 1977 the Fourteenth Guam Legislature appropriated Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) for the upgrading of the Talofofo Bridge and authorized \$2 million to be appropriated for the construction of a new Talofofo Bridge; and

WHEREAS, upgrading is scheduled to begin November 11, 1977; and

WHEREAS, during the period of upgrading and construction, travel by motor vehicle will cease between the village of Talofofo and the villages of Malojloj, Inarajan, Merizo and Umatac making it impossible for emergency vehicles to transport persons in these villages to Guam Memorial Hospital or Medical Center of the Marianas via Talofofo in time of need; and

WHEREAS, such conditions will seriously endanger the health and safety of the residents of Malojloj, Inarajan, Merizo and Umatac: and

WHEREAS, measures must be taken to reduce to a minimum any such dangers; and

WHEREAS, improved telephone communication between the 1 southern villages and other parts of the island will lessen such 2 dangers by enabling help to reach these villages from Agat or by 3 rescue helicopter; and 4 WHEREAS, the above mentioned dangers to life and property might also be greatly reduced if the medical, police, and fire 6 facilities in the villages of Malojloj, Inarajan, Merizo and 7 Umatac were improved so as to be more self sufficient; and 8 WHEREAS, the Southern Area Medical Center in Malojloj is 9 not being utilized to its potential; and 10 WHEREAS, this facility now has no emergency treatment room, 11 provides only dental and pre and post natal services to nearby 12 residents and is open only eight hours a day; and 13 WHERHAS, this facility could be modified to provide complete 14 emergency treatment if properly equipped and staffed on a 24 15 hour basis; now, therefore, 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: 17 Section 1. Notwithstanding any statute rule or regulation 18 to the contrary, the Governor shall take all necessary measures to 19 protect the health and safety of the residents of the Villages 20 of Malojloj, Inarajan, Merizo and Umatac during the construction 21 or upgrading of the Talofofo Bridge. Such measures shall include 22 but not be limited to improving telephone service in said 23 villages, increasing the number of fire and police personnel 24 assigned to the respective villages, equipping the Southern 25 Area Medical Center with emergency rooms and staffing it with 26 licensed doctors and nurses to provide complete emergency medical 27 care on a 24 hours basis for the duration of the upgrading or 28 construction of the Talofofo Bay Bridge. 29 - 2 -

The sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars 1 (\$120,000) is hereby appropriated from the Unappropriated 2 Surplus of the Territorial Highway Fund for the purpose of 3 procuring and installing a "bailey bridge" for the Talofofo River and for reuse in other similar bridge projects. 5 Section 3. In order to effectuate immediate procurement of the "bailey bridge", the Department of Public Works is hereby 7 granted exemption from the regular procurement procedures of the Ŕ government of Guam. 9 Section 4. Due to urgency of the bridge reconstruction, 10 this Act shall take effect immediately upon its enactment. 11 Section 5. The Talofofo Bay Bridge shall not be closed 12 for construction until the temporary bridge authorized by 13 Section 2 of this Act is in place providing crossing for vehicular 14 traffic. 15 Section 6. A new Section 30927.1 is added to the Government 16 Code to read: 17 "Section 30927.1. Accepting domestic deposits. 18 (a) In this section 'person' means any person, 19 firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, 20 syndicate, estate, trust, business trust or organiza-21 tion of any kind or any branch or division thereof 22 which is located within the territory of Guam. 23 (b) A foreign banking corporation may transact 24 in this territory the business of accepting deposits 25 from any person who is domiciled and maintains its 26 principal place of business within the territory if: 27 - 3 -

- (1) such foreign banking corporation has complied with all of the requirements of Section 30921; and
- (2) such deposits may only be accepted from persons who are or were borrowers from a bank accepting the deposit, provided that the balance of any deposit account shall not exceed the larger of the total current indebtedness of the depositor running to the bank or the largest amount of such indebtedness outstanding on any day during the previous calendar month.
- (c) A foreign banking corporation may accept and hold the deposits of other banks within the territory when a correspondent relationship exists with such other banks."
- Section 7. Section 21001(b) of Public Law 13-179 is hereby amended to read:
  - "(b) A vacancy occurring in the membership of the Commission during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term thereof by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature."
