


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
TO MAKE COMMITMENTS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF
OFF-ISLAND INSTRUCTIONAL PERSONNEL AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES AGAINST OPERATIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR
THE TRANSITIONAL QUARTER BUDGET FOR THE PERIOD
JULY 1, 1979-SEPTEMBER 30, 1979.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Department of Education is hereby authorized
to make commitments in the following itemized categories and
amounts against operational appropriations for the transitional
quarter budget for the period July 1, 1979-September 30, 1979:

1. Travel & Transportation Costs

for Off-island Recruitment

a. Secondary \$ 51,940

2. Contractual Services for
Printing and Building and
Equipment Maintenance

a. Elementary \$ 41,532

b. Secondary \$ 95,000

c. Special Education \$ 1,000

d. Maintenance \$ 79,836

3. Supplies and Materials

a. Elementary \$ 229,500

b. Secondary \$ 170,000

c. Pupil Personnel

Services \$ 7,500

d. Maintenance \$ 110,000

e. Special Education \$ 10,500

17 Section 2. Funds committed under Section 1 of this Act
18 shall not be disbursed prior to July 1, 1979; provided, however,
19 vendors shall be promptly paid for products and services rendered
20 upon release of the funds on July 1, 1979, notwithstanding provi-
21 sions of the Executive Budget Act to the contrary.

22 Section 3. Subsection (b) of Section 2 of Public Law 15-6
23 is amended to read:

24 "(b) There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
25 a sum not to exceed Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) for use
26 by the Committees on Education and Territorial-Federal Affairs
27 to conduct an educational program on the provisions of the
28 proposed Guam Constitution."

1 Section 4. Item B. of Section 3 of Public Law 15-7 is amended
2 to read:

3 "B. For the operation of the Standing
4 Committees, the Offices of the
5 Speaker and Legislative Secretary
6 and to provide contingency funds
7 for the Speaker, Vice-Speaker,
8 Legislative Secretary, each of
9 the Standing Committees and the
10 Majority Leader, as allocated
11 by the Committee on Rules \$1,467,000".

12 Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 19374
13 of the Government Code, the first half of property taxes for 1978
14 shall not become delinquent unless still unpaid as of July 31, 1979
15 and the deadline for payment is extended accordingly.

16 Section 6. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 19375
17 of the Government Code, the second half of property taxes for 1978
18 shall not become delinquent unless still unpaid as of September 30,
19 1979 and the deadline for payment is extended accordingly.

20 Section 7. Section 5 of this Act shall be effective retro-
21 actively from February 20, 1979.

22 Section 8. A new Subsection (e) is added to Section 4006.2
23 of the Government Code to read:

24 "(e) As used in this section 'employees occupying per-
25 manent positions' includes all elected officials except
26 members of the Board of Education."
