AN ACT RELATING TO UNDERGROUND UTILITY DAMAGE PREVENTION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Chapter I-A is added to Title XXII of

the Government Code to read:

"Chapter I-A

Underground Utility Damage Prevention

Section 21050. Definitions. As used in this Chapter:

- (1) 'Damage' includes the substantial weaning of structural or lateral support of an underground utility; penetration or destruction of any protective coating, housing, or other protective device of an underground utility; and the partial or complete severance of an underground utility.
- (2) 'Demolish' or 'demolition' means any operation by which a structure or mass of material is wrecked, razed, rendered, moved or removed by means of any tools, equipment or discharge of explosives.
- (3) 'Excavate' or 'excavation' means an operation for the purpose of the movement or removal of earth, rock or other materials in or on the ground by use of mechanized equipment or by discharge of explosives, including augering, backfilling, digging, ditching, drilling, grading, plowing-in, pulling-in, ripping, scraping, trenching, and tunneling, but not including the tilling of soil for agricultural purposes.

'Mechanized equipment' means equipment operated by means of mechanical power, including trenchers, bull-dozers, power shovels, augers, back hoes, scrapers, drills, cable and pipe plows, and other equipment used for plowing-in cable or pipe. 'Person' means any individual, any corporation, partnership, association, or any other entity organized under the laws of the territory of Guam. 'Utility' means any line, system or facility used for producing, storing, conveying, transmitting or distri-buting communication, electricity, water or sewage.

- (7) 'Operator' means the agencies responsible for operating the public utilities of Guam specifically Guam Power Authority, Guam Telephone Authority and the Public Utility Agency of Guam.
- (8) 'Working day' means every day, except Saturday, Sunday and national and legal holidays.

Section 21051. Excavation and Demolition Permits.

A permit issued pursuant to law, authorizing excavation or demolition operations, shall not be deemed to relieve a person from the responsibility of complying with the provisions of this Chapter.

Section 21052. Prohibition. Except as provided in Section 21055 of this Chapter, no person may excavate in a street, highway, public space, a private easement of an operator, or near the location of a utility installed on the premises of a customer served by such utility, or demolish a building without having first ascertained the location of all underground utilities that would be affected by the proposed excavation or demolition.

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Section 21053. Notice of Intent to Excavate or Demolish. Except as provided in Section 21055 of this Chapter, before commencing any excavation or demolition operation designated in Section 21052 of this Chapter, each person responsible for that excavation or demolition shall serve written notice or intent to excavate or demolish at least three (3) but not more than ten (10) full working days on Guam Power Authority, Guam Telephone Authority, Public Utility Agency of Guam and the village Commissioners of the project site, if such operator has underground utilities located in the proposed area of excavation or demolition. The written notice shall contain the name, address and telephone number of the person filing the notice of intent and, if different, the person responsible for the excavation or demolition, the starting date, anticipated duration, and type of excavation or demolition operation to be conducted, the location of the proposed excavation or demolition, and whether or not explosives are to be used.

Excavate or Demolish. (a) Each operator notified in accordance with Section 21053 of this Chapter, shall, not less than five (5) working days in advance of the proposed excavation or demolition (unless a shorter period is provided by agreement between the person responsible for the excavation or demolition and the operation), supply, by use of maps when appropriate, the following information to the person responsible for the excavation or demolition:

(1) The approximate location and description of all of its underground utilities which may be damaged as a result of the excavation or demolition.

(2) The location and description of all utility
markers indicating the approximate location of the
underground utilities.

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- (3) Any other information that would assist that person in locating and thereby avoiding damage to the underground utilities including, the provision of adequate temporary markings indicating the approximate location of the underground utility in locations where permanent utility markers do not exist.
- (b) For purposes of this Section, the approximate location of underground utilities is defined as a strip of land at least three (3) feet wide but not wider than the width of the utility plus 1.5 feet on either side of the utility.

Section 21055. Emergency Excavation or Demolition. Compliance with the notice requirements of Section 21053 of this Chapter is not required of persons responsible for emergency excavation or demolition to ameliorate an imminent danger to life, health or property, provided, however, that those persons give, as soon as practicable, oral notice of the emergency excavation or demolition to each operator having underground utilities located in the area where that excavation or demolition is to be performed and requests emergency assistance from each operator so identified in locating and providing immediate protection to its underground utilities. An 'imminent danger to life, health or property' means whenever there is a substantial likelihood that loss of life, health or property will result before the procedures under this Chapter can be fully complied with.

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Section 21056. Precautions to Avoid Damage. In addition to the notification requirements of Section 21053 of this Chapter, each person responsible for any excavation or demolition operation designated in Section 21052 of this Chapter shall:

- (1) Plan the excavation or demolition to avoid damage to or minimize interference with underground utilities in and near the construction area.
- (2) Maintain a clearance between an underground utility and the cutting edge or point of any mechanized equipment, taking into account the known limit of control of such cutting edge or point, as may be reasonably necessary to avoid damage to such utility.
- (3) Provide such support for underground utilities in and near the construction area, including during backfill operations, as may be reasonable for the protection of such utilities.

Section 21057. Excavation or Demolition Damage. Each person responsible for any excavation or demolition operation designated in Section 21052 of this Chapter that results in any damage to an underground utility shall, immediately upon discovery of that damage, notify the operator of such utility of the location and nature of the damage and shall allow the operator reasonable time to accomplish necessary repairs before completing the excavation or demolition in the immediate area of such utility.

Section 21058. Damages: Cost of Repairing. Any person who damages a utility line is subject to pay for all costs incurred by the operator to restore the utility to its original condition.

Section 21059. Civil Penalties. Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for each such violation. Actions to recover the penalty provided for in this Section shall be brought by the Attorney General at the request of any person in the territory of Guam in which the cause, or some part thereof, arose or in which the defendant has its principle place of business or resides. All penalties recovered in any such actions shall be paid into the General Fund. This Chapter does not affect any civil remedies for personal injury or property (including underground utilities) damage except as otherwise specifically provided for in this Chapter."

Section 2. New Section 17402 and 17402.1 are added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 17402. Any permitted sign which contains a message in a language other than English or Chamorro in Roman alphabet characters shall contain a meaningful translation in the English or Chamorro language which shall be printed on the sign using Roman alphabet characters. The Chamorro Language Commission shall assist in translating and approve all Chamorro translations required by this Section for existing and new signs. The English or Chamorro translation must predominate the sign.

Section 17402.1. Any person who violates the provision of Section 17402 of this Chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for each such violation. Actions to recover the penalty provided for in this Section shall be brought by the Attorney General at the request of any person in the territory of Guam. All penalties recovered in any such action shall be paid into the General Fund."

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Section 3. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of renting a crane and a dump truck to correct the flooding problem on Umang River in the municipality of Agat.

Section 4. The sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Six Dollars (\$120,756) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation to be used for the local support of workshop staff who provide guidance to the sheltered employees and other clients in the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation.

Section 5. The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of repairing the air conditioning system in the old Guam Memorial Hospital building.

Section 6. Effective Date. The provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall take effect one hundred twenty (120) days after its enactment.

Section 7. The sum of Thirty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$36,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Museum for the acquisition of museum showcases.
