AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ESTABLISH VEHICLE REPLACEMENT STANDARDS AND TO AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASING OF SUCH VEHICLES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the Department of Public Safety is plagued with vehicular problems over a period of time; and

WHEREAS, the measure of effectiveness for the Department is greatly impaired because of the acute lack of such vehicles; and WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is responsible for the security and protection of the island's civilian population; and

WHEREAS, the accomplishment of this responsibility is dependent upon the efficient mobility of Department of Public Safety personnel for the patrol of the island; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the Department of Public Safety's patrol fleet is presently in deplorable condition; and

WHEREAS, the supplement and maintenance of a suitable level of vehicles would increase the effectiveness of our police program; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Director of the Department of Public Safety is directed to establish vehicle replacement standards for the proper and systematic replacement of emergency and patrol

vehicles as required. These standards shall be operable for FY 1981.

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Section 2. The sum of One Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$167,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Safety for the purchase of emergency and patrol vehicles. This appropriation may be expended as matching funds for a federal grant for the purchase of vehicles. Department finds that vehicles may be purchased at a substantially reduced price off-island, it may do so, notwithstanding any provisions of the law regarding purchasing to the contrary.

Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 14-117 is hereby amended to read:

There is hereby appropriated from any "Section 1. balance in the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the purpose of constructing a new bridge on Route 4 across the Talofofo River. above appropriation shall include One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000) in Federal Grants from the Federal Highway Act and Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) in local matching. Any available balance of this appropriation remaining after September 30, 1981 shall revert to the Territorial Highway Fund."

There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-Section 4. ive-Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the installation and operation of street lights where necessary along the collector roads connecting the old BPM road, University of Guam and Route 4 from Chaot Bridge to Pago Bridge.

Section 5. The sum of Twenty-Five-Thousand Dollars 29 (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department 30

of Public Works for the purpose of installing and operating the street lights in the municipality of Barrigada.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-ZERO
Thousand Dollars (\$20-,000-) from the General Fund to the Public
Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of installing water lines
in the vicinity of Tract 542 in Machananao, Dededo, and an area
near the Commissioner's Office in Tamuning.

Section 7. All laws enacted by the Guam Legislature pursuant to Section 1423 j. (a) of the Organic Act of Guam heretofore passed shall be subject to Title I Guam Codes Annotated Section 104 and Section 105 in the same manner as if said Sections had been in force at the time that such were enacted.

Section 8. The sum of Thirty-Three-Theusand Dollars (\$33,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of installing and operating of street lights in the municipality of Dededo. Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) of the appropriation made in this Section shall be used for the purpose of energizing the street lights in GHURA 505.

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated from the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) to pave Casimiru Road in Mongmong.

Section 10. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the purpose of investigating all matters relating to war claims as provided in Rule XVI, Section 1 (d) (6) of the Standing Rules.

Section 11. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Three Thousand Bollars (\$103.000) for the installation of fences and other improvements required

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for proper control and sanitary operation of the Dededo and Malojloj Solid Waste Transfer Stations and Ordot Landfill. 2 Section 12. Part Four, Section 12 of Public Law 15-66 is 3 hereby amended to read: 4 "Section 12. The following sums are hereby appropriated from the Abandoned Vehicle and Streetlight Fund to the Ŏ Department of Public Works to defray the cost of village 7 streetlights and the disposal of abandoned vehicles for the \$ fiscal year ending September 30, 1980. Ø For Abandoned Vehicle Disposal \$115,900 10 \$414,799." For Village Streetlights 11 2. Section 13. The sum of Four Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty 12 Dollars (\$4,760) is appropriated from the General Fund to the 13 Department of Public Safety for the purpose of paying for the 14 materials and installation of window grills at the Agana Police 15 Headquarters, Agana Lock-up and Crime Laboratory facilities. 16 Section 14. Part One, Section 1, III.a.l. of Public Law 17 15-48 is amended to read: 18 Public Health Division 19 (not to exceed 216 positions) \$862,230". 20 Section 15. A new Item b. is added to Part Three, Section 21 1, Subsection II of Public Law 15-48 to read: 22 23 "b. Family Planning 1. Family Planning Program 24 \$21,250". \$3,000 13.217 25 The provisions of Sections 14 and 15 shall be 26 Section 16. retroactive in effect to July 2, 1979. 27 The sum of Twenty-Five-Thousand Dollars Section 17. 28 (\$25,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the 29 Department of Public Works for the purpose of installing 30 lighting facilities in the village of Talofofo.

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d-Five-Hundred Dollars The sum of Five Section 18. ((5,500) is hereby appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund 2 to the Department of Public Works for demolishing the old buildings in the village proper of Inarajan. Section 19. The following sums are hereby appropriated 5 from the General Fund: Û Thirty-Two-Thousand-Six-Hundred-Seventy-Five 7 Dollars (532,675.00) to the University of Guam to fund the 8 twenty-five percent (25%) salary adjustment for research 9 professors at the Marine Laboratory and Water Research 11 96_{0} (\$72,000.00) to the Center. Section 22. All employees of the Public Defender Service Corporation hired to effectuate the purposes of Public Law 14-98 prior to July 1, 1979, shall become classified employees of the Corporation effective February 1, 1980.
