


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
SAFETY TO ESTABLISH VEHICLE REPLACEMENT
STANDARDS AND TO AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASING
OF SUCH VEHICLES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the Department of
2 Public Safety is plagued with vehicular problems over a period of
3 time; and

4 WHEREAS, the measure of effectiveness for the Department is
5 greatly impaired because of the acute lack of such vehicles; and

6 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is responsible for
7 the security and protection of the island's civilian population;
8 and

9 WHEREAS, the accomplishment of this responsibility is
10 dependent upon the efficient mobility of Department of Public
11 Safety personnel for the patrol of the island; and

12 WHEREAS, the majority of the Department of Public Safety's
13 patrol fleet is presently in deplorable condition; and

14 WHEREAS, the supplement and maintenance of a suitable level
15 of vehicles would increase the effectiveness of our police
16 program; now, therefore,

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

18 Section 1. The Director of the Department of Public Safety
19 is directed to establish vehicle replacement standards for the
20 proper and systematic replacement of emergency and patrol

1 vehicles as required. These standards shall be operable for
2 FY 1981.

3 Section 2. The sum of One Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand
4 Dollars (\$167,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
5 Department of Public Safety for the purchase of emergency and
6 patrol vehicles. This appropriation may be expended as matching
7 funds for a federal grant for the purchase of vehicles. If the
8 Department finds that vehicles may be purchased at a substantially
9 reduced price off-island, it may do so, notwithstanding any
10 provisions of the law regarding purchasing to the contrary.

11 Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 14-117 is hereby amended
12 to read:

13 "Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any
14 balance in the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Two
15 Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the purpose of constructing
16 a new bridge on Route 4 across the Talofofo River. The
17 above appropriation shall include One Million Eight Hundred
18 Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000) in Federal Grants from the
19 Federal Highway Act and Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
20 (\$200,000) in local matching. Any available balance of
21 this appropriation remaining after September 30, 1981 shall
22 revert to the Territorial Highway Fund."

23 Section 4. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-
24 ^{ZERO} Five-Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) from the General Fund to the
25 Department of Public Works for the installation and operation of
26 street lights where necessary along the collector roads
27 connecting the old BPM road, University of Guam and Route 4
28 from Chaot Bridge to Pago Bridge.

29 Section 5. The sum of Twenty-^{ZERO} Five-Thousand Dollars
30 (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department

1 of Public Works for the purpose of installing and operating the
2 street lights in the municipality of Barrigada.

3 Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty
4 ^{ZERO} Thousand Dollars (^{20,000} \$20,000-) from the General Fund to the Public
5 Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of installing water lines
6 in the vicinity of Tract 542 in Machananao, Dededo, and an area
7 near the Commissioner's Office in Tamuning.

8 Section 7. All laws enacted by the Guam Legislature
9 pursuant to Section 1423 j. (a) of the Organic Act of Guam
10 heretofore passed shall be subject to Title I Guam Codes Annotated
11 Section 104 and Section 105 in the same manner as if said Sections
12 had been in force at the time that such were enacted.

13 Section 8. The sum of ^{ZERO} Thirty-Three-Thousand Dollars
14 ^{33,000} (\$33,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department
15 of Public Works for the purpose of installing and operating of
16 street lights in the municipality of Dededo. Eight Thousand
17 Dollars (\$8,000) of the appropriation made in this Section shall
18 be used for the purpose of energizing the street lights in
19 GHURA 505.

20 Section 9. There is hereby appropriated from the Territorial
21 Highway Fund the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) to pave
22 Casimiru Road in Mongmong.

23 Section 10. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is
24 appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations
25 Fund for the purpose of investigating all matters relating to
26 war claims as provided in Rule XVI, Section 1 (d) (8) of the
27 Standing Rules.

28 Section 11. There is hereby appropriated from the General
29 Fund the sum of One Hundred Three Thousand Dollars (\$103,000)
30 for the installation of fences and other improvements required

1 for proper control and sanitary operation of the Dededo and
2 Malojloj Solid Waste Transfer Stations and Ordot Landfill.

3 Section 12. Part Four, Section 12 of Public Law 15-66 is
4 hereby amended to read:

5 "Section 12. The following sums are hereby appropriated
6 from the Abandoned Vehicle and Streetlight Fund to the
7 Department of Public Works to defray the cost of village
8 streetlights and the disposal of abandoned vehicles for the
9 fiscal year ending September 30, 1980.

- 10 1. For Abandoned Vehicle Disposal \$115,900
11 2. For Village Streetlights \$414,799."

12 Section 13. The sum of Four Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty
13 Dollars (\$4,760) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
14 Department of Public Safety for the purpose of paying for the
15 materials and installation of window grills at the Agana Police
16 Headquarters, Agana Lock-up and Crime Laboratory facilities.

17 Section 14. Part One, Section 1, III.a.1. of Public Law
18 15-48 is amended to read:

19 "1. Public Health Division
20 (not to exceed 216 positions) \$862,230".

21 Section 15. A new Item b. is added to Part Three, Section
22 1, Subsection II of Public Law 15-48 to read:

23 "b. Family Planning
24 1. Family Planning Program
25 13.217 \$3,000 \$21,250".

26 Section 16. The provisions of Sections 14 and 15 shall be
27 retroactive in effect to July 2, 1979.

28 Section 17. The sum of ^{ZERO} Twenty-Five-~~Thousand~~ Dollars
29 (\$25,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
30 Department of Public Works for the purpose of installing
31 lighting facilities in the village of Talofofa.

1 Section 18. The sum of ^{ZERO} Five-Thousand-Five-Hundred Dollars
2 ~~(5,500)~~ is hereby appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund
3 to the Department of Public Works for demolishing the old
4 buildings in the village proper of Inarajan.

5 Section 19. The following sums are hereby appropriated
6 from the General Fund:

7 "A. ^{ZERO} Thirty-Two-Thousand-Six-Hundred-Seventy-Five
8 Dollars ~~(32,675.00)~~ to the University of Guam to fund the
9 twenty-five percent (25%) salary adjustment for research
10 professors at the Marine Laboratory and Water Research
11 Center.

12 "B. ^{ZERO} Seventy-Two-Thousand Dollars ~~(72,000.00)~~ to the
13 University of Guam to fund the eight percent (8%)
14 differential for research and extension faculty.

15 "C. Thirty Thousand Dollars ~~(30,000.00)~~ to the
16 Department of Education for classrooms and for other
17 purposes for Talofofo Elementary School."

18 Section 20. Section 3 of Public Law 14-98, as amended by
19 Public Law 15-61, is further amended to read:

20 "Section 3. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand
21 Dollars (\$250,000) is hereby appropriated from the General
22 Fund to the Public Defender Service Corporation exclusively
23 to meet increased costs occasioned by the Corporation's
24 assistance and legal aid to landowners claimants through
25 September 30, 1980. Use of such funds shall include the
26 recruitment of legal counsels, land investigators, inter-
27 viewers and such other staff personnel as may be required,
28 all of whom shall be in the unclassified service."

29 Section 21. Section 6 of Public Law 14-98 is amended to
30 read:

31 "Section 6. This Act shall take effect immediately
32 upon its enactment."

1 Section 22. All employees of the Public Defender Service
2 Corporation hired to effectuate the purposes of Public Law 14-98
3 prior to July 1, 1979, shall become classified employees of the
4 Corporation effective February 1, 1980.
