AN ACT MAKING AFPROPRIATION FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF ROUTE ONE (1) FROM ROUTE FOUR (4) TO CAMP WATKINS ROAD.

WHEREAS, there has been significant increases in the population of the central area of Guam with the advent of cluster housing development and increase business activities in Tamuning; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the island's population will double by the year 2000; and

WHEREAS, an increase in commercial activities has and will continue to accompany a population increase in Guam; and

whereas, approximately eighty percent (80%) of the traffic on Route One (1) originates or terminates in northern Guam; and WHEREAS, Route One is in various stages of disrepair; and WHEREAS, vehicles are the only means of transportation on Guam and can be considered a necessity; and

WHEREAS, there are forty six thousand three hundred (46,300) vehicles daily average traversing Route One; and

WHEREAS, further housing development in the northern half of Guam would compound the existing traffic congestion along Route One; and

WHEREAS, during a two year period, there were 300 accidents 1 on Route One and indicating a growing need for highway and 2 requirements for highway safety; now, therefore, 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available 3 balance of the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Two Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,100,000) consisting of One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000.00) in Federal Righway Administration (FHWA) Grants and Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) in local funds for the reconstruction of a highway improvement project within the limits specified 12 herein: 13 PROJECTS LOCAL FEDERAL TOTAL 14 1. Route One (1) Reconstruction 15 From Route Four (4) to Camp Watkins Road \$300,000 \$1,800,000 16 \$2,100,000. Section 2. The use of local funds in advance of the federal 18 grant is authorized to be expected, subsequent to the actual awarding of federal money. 19 Section 3. The appropriation made in Section 1 and the

authorization for local funds' use shall expire on December 31, 1981.

Section 4. The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) is appropriated from the unexpended balance of the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam Visitors Bureau for the design, construction and installation of two concrete memorials, commemorating the 300th Anniversary of Inarajan, the oldest village on Guam.

Section 5. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the unexpended balance of the Tourist

Attraction Fund to the Cuam Visitors Bureau for the renovation of the Magellan Memorial Monument in Umatac.

Section 6. A sum not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Governor of Guam for the contracting of a financial advisor on the development of Guam's Offshore Lending Facilities and the development of Guam as a Regional Services Center.

Section 7. There is hereby appropriated the amount of One Hundred Ninety Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$199,700) from the General Fund to construct canopies on the following schools:

Section 8. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500) from the General Fund to the Guam Grand Prix Racing Commission to undertake its feasibility study as mandated by Public Law 15-28.

Section 9. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the repair of the Merizo launching ramp.
