AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS OF THE ELECTION CODE TO GRANT THE ELECTION COMMISSION AUTHORITY TO DETERMINE HOW RESULTS OF ELECTIONS SHOULD BE TABULATED AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 2252 of the Government Code is amended
to read:

Commission shall determine the appropriate method of casting ballots, method of tabulating ballots, the appropriate vote tabulating device if such a device is to be used and the form of ballot to be used in an election on Guam. The Commission may authorize manual tabulation for all or part of ballots cast in any election.

- (b) The name of every candidate whose name has been certified shall be printed on or adjacent to the appropriate ballot."
- Section 2. Section 2509 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 2509. Vote tabulating device: mode of tallying. The Commission may appoint such persons as may be necessary for the manual tabulation of ballots and/or for the operation of the vote tabulating device and to keep watch on such tabulation for any possible illegal vote or

any error or omission on the part of the persons tabulating the ballots or operating the vote tabulating device."

Section 3. Section 2510 of the Government Code is repealed in its entirety.

Section 4. Section 24203 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 24203. Publication. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act:

- (1) The Compiler of Laws shall compile, index, codify and publish all the rules filed with him under the provisions of this Act. The compiled publication shall be entitled 'Administrative Rules and Regulations, Government of Guam' and the Compiler of Laws may make non-substantive changes in the numbering and form of the rules as submitted by the agencies to cause the same to conform to a standard system. If, in any rule adopted by any agency, any standard, codes or manuals are adopted by reference, the same need not be copied in said published volume but only the rule as adopted shall be copied.
- (2) The Compiler of Laws shall publish a quarterly bulletin in which he shall set forth the text of all rules filed during the preceding quarter excluding rules contained in the first publication by the Compiler of Laws of the 'Administrative Rules and Regulations' of the agencies of the government of Guam.
- (3) The Compiler of Laws may, in his discretion, omit from the bulletin or the compilation, rules the publication of which would be unduly cumbersome,

expensive or otherwise inexpedient, if such rules are made available in printed or processed form on application to the adopting agency, and if the bulletin or compilation contains a notice stating how copies thereof may be obtained.

(4) Bulletins and compilations shall be made available without cost to officials of this territory

- (4) Bulletins and compilations shall be made available without cost to officials of this territory upon request and to other persons at a price fixed by the Compiler of Laws to cover publication and mailing costs.
- (5) The Compiler of Laws shall supplement or revise the published volume of rules as often as necessary and at least once every two (2) years."

Section 5. The sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Agencies Fund for the Compiler of Laws to fulfill his duties under Section 24203 of the Government Code.

Section 6. A new Subsection (d) is added to Section 1018 of the Government Code to read:

"(d) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, thirty days prior to the end of a calendar quarter, one-fourth of the annual appropriation to the Legislative Operations Fund shall be transferred from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund."

Section 7. A new Section 1956 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 1956. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, thirty days prior to the end of a calendar quarter, one-fourth of the annual appropriation of the Legislative Agencies Fund shall be transferred from the General Fund to the Legislative Agencies Fund."

Section 8. A new Section 66.1 is added to the Code of Civil Procedure to read:

"Section 66.1. There is enacted Guam Rules of Evidence in the form approved by the Judicial Council of Guam on November 16, 1979, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All laws in conflict with such rules shall be of no further force or effect after the effective day of this Act. The Compiler of Laws shall codify the Rules."

Section 9. (a) The sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the purpose of sending delegates to the First International Sovereignty Conference. The funds appropriated herein shall be used for travel expenses and per diem allowances.

- (b) The sum of Two Thousand Bollars (\$2,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Governor's Office for the purpose fo sending delegates to the First International Sovereignty Conference. The funds appropriated herein shall be used for travel expenses and per diem allowances.
- (c) The sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam for the purpose of sending delegates to the First International Severeignty Conference. The funds appropriated herein shall be used for travel expenses and per diem allowances.
 - (d) The sum of One Thousand Bollars (\$1,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam for the purpose of making a contribution on behalf of the territory of Guam to the First International Sovereignty Conference.

Section 10. Section 1 of Public Law 15-2 is amended to read:

"Section 1. (a) There is established within the Legislature the Committee for the Association of Pacific Legislators. The Chairman of the Committee of Commerce, Tourism and Transportation shall serve as Chairman of the Committee and shall appoint six (6) other members to serve on the Committee. The Committee shall communicate with other legislators and legislatures in the Pacific region and Asia including, but not limited to, the West Coast of the United States as to the desirability and feasibility of the formation for such an Association. The Committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the Fifteenth Guam Legislature.

(b) The appropriation made by Section 2 of Public Law
15-7 and allocated to the Committee for the Association of
Pacific Legislators as provided in Section 3 E. of Public
Law 15-7 shall be available for expenditure until expended."
Section 11. There is hereby appropriated from the General
Fund the sum of Forty Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000) to the
Department of Public Works for the resurfacing of the road in
Merizo.

Section 12. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to the Department of Education to help defray the cost of sending a high school ROTC Drill Team to Hawaii.

Section 13. The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the use of the Committee on Ways and Means to conduct a thorough study of the territorial tax system. The study shall be conducted under the auspices and

supervision of the Ways and Means Committee. A detailed analysis of the study shall be submitted by the Committee on Ways and Means to the Legislature within fifteen (15) days after completion of the study but not to exceed six (6) months after enactment of this Bill into law.

Section 14. The sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (340,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service for the purpose of conducting a demographic survey of Guam's displaced homemakers and single head of family for the Task Force on Economically and Socially Disrupted Persons. The survey shall include identification of population and assessment of their needs: social, health, psychological, economic, legal and educational.

Section 15. The sum of Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the use of the Criminal Justice Committee to conduct on exhaustive study on the juvenile justice system of the Territory and the increased crime rate of juvenile offenders.

There is hereby appropriated from any available Section 16. funds in the Treasury of Guam the sum of Pifty-Thousand-Dollars (\$50,000) to the Guam Name Place Commission to implement the provisions of Chapter XV of Title XIV of the Government Code of 23 Guam.
