Bonding of officers and employees. 9 10 officers and employees of the government of Guam who serve 11 as certifying and/or disbursing officers or who handle public 12 funds in any manner whatsoever shall be properly bonded against any loss of money or other property which the said 13 14 government of Guam shall sustain through any negligent, 15 fraudulent or dishonest act or acts committed by any of such employees, acting alone or in collusion with others." 16 17 Section 5. The sum of Twenty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$29,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the 18 Department of Public Health and Social Services to provide for 19 20 services for battered and abused spouses pursuant to the provisions of P.L. 15-117. Any unexpended balances from this 21 22 appropriation as of September 30, 1980 shall revert to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund. 23 Section 6. The sum of Ninety-Thousand-Dollars (\$90,000) is 24 25 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of road repairs and water needs in 26 27 the Wusstig area, Yigo and Ucudu area, Dededo; and for installing lighting facilities in the baseball field in the municipality of 28 29 Yigo. Section 7. The sum of Twenty-Five-Thousand-Dollars (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the

purpose of conducting a demographic survey of Guam's displaced homemakers and single head of family. The survey shall include 3 4 identification of population and assessment of their needs: social, health, psychological, economic, legal and educational. 5 Section 8. Section 29 of Public Law 15-108 is repealed 7 and reenacted to read: "Section 20. In addition to the other sums appropriated Ü by Public Laws 14-98 and 15-31, the sum of Two Hundred 9 10 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is hereby appropriated 11 from the General Fund to the Public Defender Service 12 Corporation exclusively to meet increased costs occasioned 13 by the Corporation's assistance and legal aide to landowners 14 claimants. Use of such funds shall include the recruitment 15 of legal counsels, land investigators, interviewers and such other staff personnel as may be required." 16 17 Section 9. The sum of Twenty-Three Thousand Dollars 18 (\$23,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the Youth Conservation Corps Program in 19 20 Calendar Year 1980 to serve as local matching funds for Federal Funds. No amount of the appropriation shall be expended until 21 22 such time that the awarding of the Federal funds is certain. Section 10. The Youth Conservation Corps Program shall be 23 24 administered in accordance with Federal guidelines established 25 for the program and such other rules and procedures as may be required. 26 27 Section 11. The Director of the Department of Youth Affairs 28 shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 15, 1980, which shall include but not limited to, a 29

"Section 47136. Charges for services of customs and quarantine officers. All air and sea carriers and other persons whose operations require the services of customs and quarantine officers of the government of Guam shall be charged for said services as are rendered by such officers on any day of the week upon special request, Sunday, holidays, or between the hours of 5 P.M. of any day and 8 A.M. of the following day as follows: for the first hour or fraction thereof of such services, the hourly wage rate of three (3) hours of service by whichever officer is performing such service. In addition to the the first-hour charge for any hour or fraction thereof over one (1) hour, one and one-half (1.5) times the hourly wage rate of whichever officer performs such services. Any sum received by the government of Guam for such overtime work shall be reimbursed to the employee who has rendered such service, regardless of his pay range.

Non-performance of services. If services which have been requested and the officer has reported to work and the services are not performed by reason of circumstances beyond the control of the efficers concerned, the interested party shall be charged on the same basis as though the services had actually been performed during the period between the time the efficer was ordered to report for duty and did so report and the times he was notified that his services would not be required, a minimum charge of two hours of his hourly wage rate.

Assignment. The Chief of Customs and Quarantine Division is authorized to order an officer to report for

any overtime duty 15 minutes in advance of the scheduled 1 time to avoid unnecessary delay." 2 Section 18. The provisions of Section 17 of this Act shall 3 take effect September 30, 1980. The sum of Four Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Section 19. 5 Dollars (\$445,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of: restoring eroded river banks, correction of landslide and reconstructing drainage system in the 9 municipalities of Santa Rita, Agat, Umatac and Merizo. 10 Section 20. The Director of Public Works shall have the 11 authority to waive Section 10001.6 of the Government Code of Guam 12 in the awarding of a contract or contracts to accomplish the 13 objectives of Section 19 of this Act, provided that in awarding 14 such contracts, the Director shall contract only with responsible 15 companies and on such terms as are most favorable to the govern-16 4 ment given the emergency nature of the contracts involved and 17 shall provide in writing a record of any informal bids and 18 nature of the emergency. 19 Section 21. Section 5 of Public Law 15-120 is hereby 20 amended to read: 21 "Section 5. The sum of One Hundred Forty Thousand 22 Dollars (\$140,000) is appropriated from the General 23 Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the 24 purpose of administering a Summer Youth Internship 25 Program for college students, subject to the following 26 conditions: 27 Employment of youths shall be within the 28 branches of the government of Guam or in any duly 29 licensed and registered firm complying with all fair 30 labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam; 31

1 b) Of the number to be employed, fifty (50) shall be assigned to the Legislature and fifteen (15) to the 2 Judiciary. Those assigned to the Legislature and the 3 Δ Judiciary shall be selected from a list of recommen-5 dations to be submitted by the Legislature and the 6 Judiciary respectively; 7 c) Employment of an eligible youth shall be in 8 an area that will be meaningful to the youth's 9 development of a career; 10 Employment shall be for a person aged 11 twenty-five (25) or younger as of June 4, 1980 12 provided, however, that he is currently registered 13 in a recognized college or university and has 14 completed at least one full academic school year 15 twenty-four (24) semester hours or the equivalent; 16 The employee shall be paid the sum of 17 Three Dollars and Ten Cents (\$3.10) per hour, provided, 18 however, that work for which compensation shall be 19 paid does not exceed thirty-five (35) hours per week, 20 per employee and that such work is provided during the 21 period of June 9, 1980 through August 23, 1980. Student 22 employees shall not be members of the government of 23 Guam Retirement Fund: 24 The government of Guam shall reimburse 25 participating private employers the sum of One Dollar 26 and Fifty-Five Cents (\$1.55) per hour, per employee, 27 provided, however, that reimbursement shall be 28 provided for work in excess of thirty-five (35) hours 29 per week, per employee and that reimbursement shall 30 cover work performed in the period June 8 through

1 g) The Department of Youth Affairs shall establish 2 procedures, rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this program not inconsistent with the 3 conditions prescribed above. The regulations shall 4 provide that persons desiring to be employed by the 5 6 Judiciary or the Legislature shall be interviewed by 7 officials of the respective branch who shall then make recommendations to the Department of Youth Affairs concerning the employment of such applicant. 10

The Department of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 30, 1980, which shall include, but not limited to, a detailed statement of expenditures, the extent to which the above conditions were complied with and a review and evaluation of the program and such recommendations for improving the program as may be warranted." Section 22. Section 6 of Public Law 15-120 is hereby

amended to read:

"Section 6. The sum of Three Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$324,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of initiating and administering a Summer Youth Employment Program subject to the following conditions:

Employment of youths shall be in any duly licensed or registered firm complying with all fair labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam and within the departments or agencies with the Executive Branch. Furthermore, no employee shall claim for reimbursement of the work of student employees normally employed during the year, as

determined by the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs or his appointed delegate.

- b) Persons aged fifteen (15) through nineteen (19) as of June 8, 1980, shall be eligible for employment provided, however, that they are currently enrolled in junior or senior high schools or have just completed one full academic year prior to the period of employment.
- participating private employers the sum of One Pollar and Forty-Two Cents (\$1.42) per hour, per employee, provided, however, that reimbursement shall not be provided for work in excess of thirty-five (35) hours per week, per employee and that reimbursement shall cover work performed in the period June 8 through August 30, 1980.
- d) The government of Guam shall pay student employees enrolled in the Executive Branch program, the sum of Two Bollars and Ninety-Five Cents (\$2.95) per hour, provided, however, that work for which payment is made (1) shall not exceed thirty-five (35) hours per week, per employee and (2) shall be performed between June 8 and August 30, 1980. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, student employees shall not be members of the government of Guam Retirement Fund.
- e) The Department of Youth Affairs is authorized to expend not more than five percent (5%) of this appropriation for administrative expenses.
- f) The Director of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 21, 1980, which shall be limited to, a detailed statement

of expenditures under each program a review and evaluation of the Summer Employment Programs under the department's sponsorship and recommendations for improving the programs.

Section 23. The sum of Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of constructing restroom facilities at the baseball fields in the municipalities of Merizo, Agat and Mangilao. The Department of Parks and Recreation shall be responsible for the maintenance of these restroom facilities upon completion.
