




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT CREATING A NEW JUDGESHIP AND MAKING  
AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE CREATION OF A NEW  
JUDGESHIP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 81 of the Code of Civil Procedure is  
3 amended to read:

4 "Section 81. Composition of Court. The Superior  
5 Court shall consist of a presiding judge and five  
6 additional judges. The annual salary of the presiding  
7 judge shall be Thirty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000)  
8 and the annual salary of the other judges shall be  
9 Thirty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$37,500)."

10 Section 2. The sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) is  
11 appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Branch for  
12 the purpose of meeting expenses for the judgeship created  
13 by Section 1 of this Act, including but not limited to, the  
14 judge's salary, renovation of office space, equipment, training  
15 expenses, and personnel costs.

16 Section 3. Section 8 of Public Law 15-102 is amended to  
17 read:

18 "Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from the  
19 General Fund to the Department of Public Works the sum of  
20 Thirty Nine Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars  
21 (\$39,126) for the purpose of compensating equipment

1 contractors for services rendered in removing storm  
2 debris from roadways and drainage culverts as a result  
3 of Typhoon Rita, and for the bulldozer services  
4 provided in clearing the Crdot Public Dump in 1979  
5 to be allocated as follows:

6	a. J & G Repair Shop	\$35,926
7	b. Perez Bros. Inc.	\$ 1,600
8	c. Joe Lujan Enterprise	\$ 1,200

9 and for maintenance of traffic signals in FY 1978."

10 Section 4. The Governor of Guam is authorized to negotiate  
11 for the purchase of private properties to satisfy the real  
12 estate requirements of the Guam Adult Correctional Facility  
13 project and at his option, exchange public land in lieu of or in  
14 combination with pecuniary compensation for such private  
15 property.

16 Section 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund  
17 the sum of One Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand One Hundred  
18 Dollars (\$198,100) to the Department of Land Management for  
19 purposes of payment of just compensation in order to satisfy  
20 the real estate requirements of the Guam Adult Correctional  
21 Facility.

22 Section 6. There is appropriated from the General Fund  
23 the sum of Eight Hundred Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-  
24 Six Dollars (\$817,476) to the University of Guam Student  
25 Financial Assistance Fund established by Section 11802 of the  
26 Government Code to be allocated as follows:

27	a. Professional/Technical Awards	\$238,822
28	b. Student Loans	\$301,587
29	c. Merit Awards	\$277,067.

1 Section 7. There is appropriated from the General Fund  
2 the sum of Four Hundred Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-  
3 Nine Dollars (\$460,479) to the University of Guam for the  
4 Teacher Training Scholarship Program and the Nurses Training  
5 Program to be allocated as follows:

6 a. Teacher Training Scholarship

7 Program \$435,479

8 b. Nurses Training Program \$ 25,000.

9 Section 8. Pursuant to Section 11802 of Public Law 11-138,  
10 the appropriation made under Section 6 of this Act shall  
11 supplement the unencumbered balance of Seven Hundred Ninety-Nine  
12 Thousand Eight Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$799,814) in the Student  
13 Financial Assistance Fund, including all unexpended appropriations  
14 and repayments to the Fund in Fiscal Year 1980.

15 Section 9. The appropriations made under Sections 6 through  
16 8 of this Act shall be for the period commencing August 1, 1980,  
17 and ending July 31, 1981, and shall not be subject to any  
18 allotment reserve that may be imposed by the Office of the  
19 Governor.

20 Section 10. There is appropriated from the General Fund  
21 the sum of Sixteen Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$16,900) to  
22 the Commissioners Council of Guam for the purpose of renovating  
23 the Commissioners Council's Office in Agana.

24 Section 11. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is  
25 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
26 Agriculture for the purpose of obtaining marketing assistance for  
27 farmers through coordination with both the Guam Farmers Union  
28 Association and the Guam Farmers Coop.

29 Section 12. There is hereby appropriated from the General  
30 Fund the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Six Dollars

1 (\$3,306) to the Department of Parks and Recreation to help  
2 defray the cost of officiating and balls in conjunction with  
3 the 1980 Guam Babe Ruth League Baseball Season.

4 Section 13. Item (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 17400  
5 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

6 "(2) Free standing, doubled faced signs indicating  
7 the name of a person or the type of business occupying  
8 the premises or the name of the building, provided that:

9 (i) such signs shall not exceed forty (40)  
10 square feet in area on each face nor twelve (12)  
11 feet in height;

12 (ii) such structure shall not be placed closer  
13 than ten (10) feet to any street or highway right-of-  
14 way; and

15 (iii) one such sign shall be permitted for each  
16 premises or building."

17 Section 14. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000)  
18 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
19 Public Works for the purpose of installing streetlights in the  
20 Canada and Barrigada areas in the municipality of Barrigada.

21 Section 15. The sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred  
22 Dollars (\$3,500) is appropriated to the Guam Memorial Hospital  
23 Authority for the purpose of buying wheelchairs for the Extended  
24 Care Services Division.

25 Section 16. The sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars  
26 (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam  
27 Power Authority for the purpose of installing power lines and  
28 related facilities along Route 15.
