AN ACT CREATING A NEW JUDGESHIP AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE CREATION OF A NEW JUDGESHIP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 81 of the Code of Civil Procedure is
amended to read:

"Section 81. Composition of Court. The Superior Court shall consist of a presiding judge and five additional judges. The annual salary of the presiding judge shall be Thirty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000) and the annual salary of the other judges shall be Thirty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$37,500)."

Section 2. The sum of Highty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Branch for the purpose of meeting expenses for the judgeship created by Section 1 of this Act, including but not limited to, the judge's salary, renovation of office space, equipment, training expenses, and personnel costs.

Section 3. Section 8 of Public Law 15-102 is amended to read:

"Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works the sum of Thirty Nine Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars (\$39,126) for the purpose of compensating equipment

contractors for services rendered in removing storm debris from roadways and drainage culverts as a result of Typhoon Rita, and for the bulldozer services provided in clearing the Ordot Public Dump in 1979 to be allocated as follows:

a. J & G Repair Shop
 b. Perez Bros. Inc.
 \$ 1,600

c. Joe Lujan Enterprise \$ 1,200

and for maintenance of traffic signals in FY 1978."

Section 4. The Governor of Guam is authorized to negotiate for the purchase of private properties to satisfy the real estate requirements of the Guam Adult Correctional Facility project and at his option, exchange public land in lieu of or in combination with pecuniary compensation for such private property.

Section 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$198,100) to the Department of Land Management for purposes of payment of just compensation in order to satisfy the real estate requirements of the Guam Adult Correctional Facility.

Section 6. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Eight Hundred Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$817,476) to the University of Guam Student Financial Assistance Fund established by Section 11802 of the Government Code to be allocated as follows:

- a. Professional/Technical Awards \$238,822
- b. Student Loans \$301,587
 - c. Merit Awards \$277,067.

Section 7. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Four Hundred Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars (\$460,479) to the University of Guam for the Teacher Training Scholarship Program and the Nurses Training Program to be allocated as follows: Teacher Training Scholarship

Nurses Training Program \$ 25,000.

Pursuant to Section 11802 of Public Law 11-138, the appropriation made under Section 6 of this Act shall supplement the unencumbered balance of Seven Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$799,814) in the Student Financial Assistance Fund, including all unexpended appropriations and repayments to the Fund in Fiscal Year 1980.

Section 9. The appropriations made under Sections 6 through 8 of this Act shall be for the period commencing August 1, 1980, and ending July 31, 1981, and shall not be subject to any allotment reserve that may be imposed by the Office of the Governor.

Section 10. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Sixteen Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$16,900) to the Commissioners Council of Guam for the purpose of renovating the Commissioners Council's Office in Agana.

The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is Section 11. appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of obtaining marketing assistance for farmers through coordination with both the Guam Farmers Union Association and the Guam Farmers Coop.

Section 12. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Six Dollars

(\$3,306) to the Department of Parks and Recreation to help defray the cost of officiating and balls in conjunction with the 1980 Guam Babe Ruth League Baseball Season.

Section 13. Item (2) of Subsection (b) of Section 17400 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

- "(2) Free standing, doubled faced signs indicating the name of a person or the type of business occupying the premises or the name of the building, provided that:
 - (i) such signs shall not exceed forty (40) square feet in area on each face nor twelve (12) feet in height;
 - (ii) such structure shall not be placed closer than ten (10) feet to any street or highway right-of-way; and
 - (iii) one such sign shall be permitted for each premises or building."

Section 14. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of installing streetlights in the Canada and Barrigada areas in the municipality of Barrigada.

Section 15. The sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) is appropriated to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of buying wheelchairs for the Extended Care Services Division.

Section 16. The sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Power Authority for the purpose of installing power lines and related facilities along Route 15.
