AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) TO RESTORE THE OLD GOVERNOR'S PALACE AND TO DESIGNATE THE PALACE THE MUSEUM OF GUAM HISTORY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: 2 Section 1. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 3 (\$250,000) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of restoring and 4 5 renovating the Old Governor's Palace in the municipality of 6 Agana.

7 Section 2. The appropriation made in Section 1 of this Act shall include such grants-in-aid as may be awarded to the 8 9 territory from either the National Society for Historic Preservation and the National Endowment for the Arts. 10

Section 3. All unexpended balances from the appropriation 11 12 made in Section 1 of this Act as of June 30, 1981 shall revert to the Unappropriated Surplus of the Tourist Attraction Fund. 13

14 Section 4. The following sums are hereby appropriated in part from the General Fund and Federal Grants-in-Aid to implement 15 programs for the period beginning September 1, 1980 and ending 16 August 31, 1981. Local funds appropriated under this Section 17 may not be expended except to match the Federal funds identified 18 herein and the appropriations so made shall comply with the 19
