







AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF TWO
HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000)
TO RESTORE THE OLD GOVERNOR'S PALACE AND
TO DESIGNATE THE PALACE THE MUSEUM OF GUAM
HISTORY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
3 (\$250,000) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to
4 the Department of Public Works for the purpose of restoring and
5 renovating the Old Governor's Palace in the municipality of
6 Agana.

7 Section 2. The appropriation made in Section 1 of this
8 Act shall include such grants-in-aid as may be awarded to the
9 territory from either the National Society for Historic
10 Preservation and the National Endowment for the Arts.

11 Section 3. All unexpended balances from the appropriation
12 made in Section 1 of this Act as of June 30, 1981 shall revert
13 to the Unappropriated Surplus of the Tourist Attraction Fund.

14 Section 4. The following sums are hereby appropriated in
15 part from the General Fund and Federal Grants-in-Aid to implement
16 programs for the period beginning September 1, 1980 and ending
17 August 31, 1981. Local funds appropriated under this Section
18 may not be expended except to match the Federal funds identified
19 herein and the appropriations so made shall comply with the

1 provisions of P.L. 14-83, as applicable:

5 Section 7. Part One, Section IX relative to rental of
6 office space for the Passport Office appropriated under Public
7 Law 15-66, as amended by Public Law 15-125, is further amended
8 to read as follows:

9 "IX. RENTAL OF OFFICE SPACE

10 The following sums are hereby
11 appropriated to the Department
12 of Administration for the
13 purpose of satisfying all
14 contractual obligations arising
15 from the need to lease office
16 space between different agencies
17 and departments of the executive
18 branch of the government of Guam
19 for the fiscal year ending
20 September 30, 1980.

22 Section 8. Part One, Section XI relative to utilities for
23 the Passport Office appropriated under Public Law 15-66 is
24 amended to read as follows:

25 "XI. UTILITIES

26 The following sums are appropriated to
27 the executive branch of the govern-
28 ment of Guam for the purpose of
29 paying telephone and water/sewer
30 bills incurred during fiscal year
31 ending September 30, 1980.

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Passport Office (Governor's
Office)

1. Telephone \$ 1,548."

Section 9. The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Defender Service Corporation exclusively to meet increased costs occasioned by the Corporation's assistance and legal aid to landowners claimants.

Section 10. Part One, Section 1, Subsection 1., A., Items 1. and 2. of Public Law 15-66 is hereby amended to read:

"I. GOVERNMENT-WIDE SUPPORT

A. Office of the Governor

not to exceed \$771,023

2. Government House,
not to exceed \$204,383."

Section 11. Part One, Section 1, Subsection XI of Public Law 15-66 on utilities is amended to read:

"XI. UTILITIES

Section 12. Part One, Section 1, Subsection F., Items 1., 5., 6., and 7 of Public Law 15-66 are amended to read:

10 Section 13. Part One, Section 1, Subsection XI.2 of Public
 11 Law 15-66 is amended to read:

 14 2. Water/Sewer \$ 2,380."

15 Section 14. Item e. of Section 6. of Public Law 15-76 is
 16 repealed and reenacted to read:

17 "e. For furnishing equipment and materials
 18 needed to clear boonie and jungle areas
 19 surrounding John F. Kennedy High School
 20 in order to prevent vandalism and truancy
 21 and to create a larger field area. \$10,000."

22 Section 15. The sum of Five Thousand Seven Hundred Forty
 23 Dollars (\$5,740) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
 24 Civil Service Commission for the purpose of funding in-service,
 25 off-island training. The funds appropriated by this Section
 26 shall remain available until the trainee completes his program
 27 of study.

1 Section 16. Section 53607.03 of the Government Code is
2 amended to read:

3 "Section 53607.03. Amounts and rates of charges;
4 refunds. Payments and charges shall be fixed to yield
5 annual revenues not less than the aggregate of the annual
6 payments to the bond, sinking, reserve and other funds
7 provided in an indenture for the bonds, and operational
8 costs. Provided, however, the total payments and charges
9 shall not exceed one and three quarters per cent (1 3/4%)
10 over interest on the bonds."

11 Section 17. Section 53607.08(a) of the Government Code is
12 amended to read:

13 "Section 53607.08. Interest on bonds.

14 (a) Bonds shall bear interest payable
15 annually or semi-annually or in part annually
16 and in part semi-annually, except that the
17 first coupon on any bond may be payable
18 twelve (12) months or any number of months
19 less than twelve (12) after the date of such
20 bond."
