Bill No. 402 (As Substituted by the Committee on Ways and Means)

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Introduced by B. M. Palomo

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SUCH SUMS NECESSARY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FENCING FACILITIES FOR THE INARAJAN JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL FIELD AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the construction of fencing facilities for the Inarajan Junior High School Baseball Field.

6 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund the 7 sum of Two Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000) to the 8 Department of Education for the purpose of implementing Public 9 Law 15-137, which provides for auxiliary services to students of 10 non-public schools.

Section 3. The sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for ceiling repairs of the Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center. Any unencumbered balance from this appropriation shall revert to the General Fund by September 30, 1981.

16 Section 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund the sum of Three Hundred Thousand 17 Dollars (\$300,000), of which One Hundred Thousand Dollars 18 (\$100,000) shall be allotted to the Minority Office, to provide 19 for the operation expenses of the Sixteenth Guam Legislature. 20 The appropriation made by this Section is an interim appropriation. 21 The appropriation made by this Section may be used to meet obliga-22 tions incurred by the Fifteenth Guam Legislature for the Sixteenth 23 Guam Legislature. 24

Section 5. 1 The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the Ceneral Fund to the Legislative Operations 2 Fund for the purpose of conducting the Inauguration of the Sixteenth Guam Legislature. The Chairperson of the Committee on Rules of the Fifteenth Guam Legislature may authorize expenditure of funds from this appropriation prior to January 5, 1981.

Section 6. The sum of Six Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars 7 (\$615,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legisla-8 tive Operations Fund for the operations of the Fifteenth Guam 9 Legislature for the calendar year ending December 31, 1980. 10 The sum appropriated by this Section is in addition to any other 11 appropriations made to the Legislative Operations Fund. 12 The appropriation shall be allocated by the Committee on Rules. 13

Section 7. Section 8982 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 8982. Application for Bonuses. All applica-16 tions for bonuses authorized by this Chapter must be made to the 17 Office of Veteran's Affairs on or before March 31, 1981. 18 Each applicant shall furnish to the Office of Veteran's Affairs 19 evidence of his eligibility for a veteran's bonus. Eligibility 20 may be evidenced by authenticated copies of records or certifi-21 cates issued by the Department of Defense, U. S. Military Service 22 Department or any other authorized agency having such evidence 23 in its possession."

Subsection (b) of Section 8991 of the Government 25 Section 8. Code is amended to read: 26

"(b). All applications for the bonuses authorized by this Chapter must be made to the Director of Public Safety on or before March 31, 1981."

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Section 9. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is 1 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 2 Agriculture to assist the Guam Farmers Union Association, the 3 Guam Farmers Cooperative Association and the Malojloj/Inarajan 4 Green Farm Association in marketing fresh produce. 5

Section 10. The sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) 6 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Insular Arts Council 7 for the use and cash match of the Civic Center of Guam Foundation 8 in the development of a conceptual program plan of the construc-9 tion of a cultural facility on Lot 87-5-1 in the municipality of 10 Agana. 11

Section 11. (a) There is hereby appropriated from the 12 General Fund the sum of Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000) to 13 the Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of defraying the 14 expenses of Guam's participants in the Presidential Classroom 15 for Young Americans Leadership Training Program for 1981. 16

The Department of Youth Affairs shall set up administra-(b) 17 tive procedures to ensure equitable participants of all public 18 and private high schools on Guam. 19

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This Act shall be effective upon enactment into law. (c)

Section 12. One Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,750) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, Communicable Disease Control Division. for the purchase of medication for indigent patients suffering from severe cases of tuberculosis.

The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) is 10 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 11 Public Works for the purpose of upgrading the restroom facilities 12 in the Sinajana Community Center. 13 Section 16. Section 29 of P. \bigcirc 15-129 is amended to read: 14 One Hundred Fifteen Thousand The sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thou-"Section 29. 15 115,000 Dollars sand-Bollars (\$125,000) is appropriated from the General 16 Fund to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of 17 purchasing a fire truck to be stationed at the Barrigada 18 Fire Station. Notwithstanding provisions of law to the 19 contrary, the Department may purchase a fire truck from a 20 vendor which did not bid on it if the cost is significantly 21 less." 22 Section 17. There is appropriated from the General Fund 23 One Hundred Thousand, to the Guam Visitors Bureau the sum of One Hundred Fighty-Three 24 Dollars 100,000 Thousand-Bollars (183,000) to be used as follows: 25 Coronation Reimbursement \$60,000 26 Presidential Inauguration '81 27 North America Promotion Account 28 Community Development Account 40,000 29

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Section 18. The sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) is appropriated to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of renovating and extending the Barrigada Community Center.

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Section 19. The sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand
Dollars (\$125,000) is appropriated from the Territorial Highway
Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of resurfacing the Mesa & Fernandez Roads in the municipality of Yona and
for the purpose of improving the drainage of Route 4 near the
Ichihara's residence and the Mobile Gas Station near the entrance
of the village of Yona.

Section 20. The sum of Fourteen Thousand Three Hundred
 Fourteen Dollars (\$14,314) is hereby appropriated from the General
 Fund to the Superior Court of Guam for the implementation of the
 salary reclassification of the Marshals' positions of the
 Superior Court of Guam.

Section 21. Section 4301.1 of the Government Code (enacted
in Public Law 15-72) is amended to read:

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"Section 4301.1. Non-Profit Organizations. The Director of Administration shall make unoccupied governmentowned housing units available at no cost, under specified conditions to Chief Brodie School, the Department of Education, Department of Youth Affairs, Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, the Guam Advisory Council for Vocational Education and any non-profit organization engaged in the provision of such public services as crisis intervention, case work and counseling, or temporary residential care of minor children or abused spouses; provided that no such nonprofit organization shall be eligible for such housing unless it shall have perfected its non-profit status with the Department of Revenue and Taxation and shall have been certified as qualifying by the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services."

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Section 22. Section 4 of Public Law 15-121 is hereby amended to read:

"Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to improve roads and drainage systems near the Truman Elementary School in the municipality of Santa Rita." Section 23. Section 34 of Public Law 15-129 is amended to

"Section 34. Until appropriate office space is available, the Guam Youth Building shall be used jointly by the Agana Village Commissioner, Commissioners Council and the Department of Parks and Recreation. Upon availability of appropriate office space, the Department of Parks and Recreation shall vacate the Guam Youth Building and occupy designated office space. The Agana Village Commissioner shall then assume responsibility for the maintenance of the Guam Youth Building. However, the responsibility of maintenance shall continue with the Department of Parks and Recreation until such time as it vacates the Guam Youth Building."

Section 24. Section 5114 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 5114. Department of Parks and Recreation. There is within the Executive Branch of the government of Guam a Department of Parks and Recreation. The Director of Parks and Recreation is the head of said department, and is appointed by the Parks and Recreation Commission pursuant to Section 20006(a) of this Code with the consent of the Governor and the Legislature."
