




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR


This is certify that Substitute Bill No. 67, "An Act creating the Guam Reparations Commission", was on the 12th day of December 1980, duly and regularly passed.



AN ACT CREATING THE GUAM REPARATIONS COMMISSION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The Reparations Commission is created for the
3 purpose of investigating claims for compensation accruing to the
4 people of Guam during any period of occupation of Guam by any
5 occupying military or any other type of governmental forces.

6 Section 2. (a) The Commission shall be composed of five (5)
7 members to be appointed by the Governor. The chairperson of the
8 Commission shall be elected by a majority of the Commission
9 members. The term of the Commission members shall be for three (3)
10 years, which shall be the life of the Commission.

11 (b) Members of the Commission shall be compensated in the
12 amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for attendance at each meeting, such
13 compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month.

14 Section 3. (a) The Reparations Commission shall investigate
15 the number, type and extent of claims for compensation of the
16 people of Guam against any occupying military or any other type
17 of governmental forces, and the damages resulting to the people of
18 Guam through forced labor, confiscation of property, physical

1 abuse, torture, killings, rapes and other injuries or damages
2 but not limited to the foregoing. The Commission shall determine
3 how such damages should be measured and, where possible, the
4 dollar amount of such damages.

5 (b) The Commission shall investigate the feasibility of
6 obtaining reparations from those governments for injuries and
7 damages as a result of the occupation of Guam.

8 Section 4. The chairperson of the Commission shall preside
9 at all meetings of the Commission; shall sign all documents for,
10 and on behalf of, the Commission, unless said Commission delegates
11 that power in any case, or cases, to the chief executive officer;
12 and shall generally be responsible for the manner in which the
13 studies and investigations of the Commission are carried out,
14 and the reports thereof made to the Legislature as required.

15 Section 5. In pursuing its studies, the Commission shall
16 take due note of, and make special reports upon, similar or
17 related problems existing within the former Trust Territory of
18 the Pacific Islands and shall confer as needed with those who
19 have information and expertise as to those proceedings.

20 Section 6. The Commission may: contract for equipment,
21 rental space and all other property and facilities necessary, or
22 desirable, to carry out its functions; obtain personal services
23 as may be required in the judgment of the Commission; contract
24 for the conduct of the studies and investigations referred to in
25 this Bill, either in whole or in part; and employ legal counsel,
26 consultants and other personnel to the extent desired to assist
27 in carrying out the Commission's duties and responsibilities.

28 Section 7. No later than December 31, 1983, the Commission
29 shall prepare, and file with the Guam Legislature, a final report
30 as to the extent and amount of reparations necessary to compensate

1 the people of Guam, for presentation to the President and Congress
2 of the United States, and through these channels, to the nations
3 and international agencies which may be expected to be interested
4 in the issues involved. Interim reports shall likewise be made
5 to the Legislature detailing, from time to time, the progress of
6 the investigations.

7 Section 8. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
8 (\$250,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam
9 Reparations Commission to carry out the purposes of this Act. The
10 appropriation is a continuing one and any unexpended portion shall
11 not revert to the General Fund until December 31, 1983.

12 Section 9. Section 9120.3 of the Government Code is amended
13 to read:

14 "Section 9120.3. Exclusions. This Subchapter does not
15 apply:

16 (a) to the care of a relative's, friend's or
17 neighbor's child or children, with or without compensa-
18 tion;

19 (b) where parents on a mutually cooperative basis
20 exchange care of one another's children;

21 (c) to the care of children in their own home;

22 (d) to a hospital, clinic, or educational institu-
23 tion;

24 (e) to kindergartens or nursery schools operated
25 by public or private elementary or secondary level
26 school systems;

27 (f) to facilities operated in connection with a
28 shopping center where children are received while
29 parents are on the premises; or

30 (g) to facilities operated in connection with a
31 church where children are received while parents are
32 on the premises."
