AN ACT TO AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE UNIFORM COM-PENSATION FOR ALL BOARDS AND COMMISSION MEMBERS AT FIFTY DOLLARS PER MEETING, NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. The third paragraph of Section 54001 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Members of the Board shall be compensated in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for attendance at each meeting, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 2. Section 19334 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 19334. Same: compensation. Members of the Board shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Board meets, as certified by the Treasurer of Guam; such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month. The Secretary of the Board shall be paid an additional sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) annually. The members of the Board are also entitled to compensation for their reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the course of their official duties, as certified by the Treasurer."

1 Section 3. Subsection (d) of Section 30011 of the Government Code is amended to read: 2 3 "(d) Each member shall receive Fifty Dollars (\$50) 4 a day as an honorarium for services, and in lieu of 5 reimbursement for expenses incident to his duties, for each 6 day or portion thereof spent in attending meetings of the 7 Board. Such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred 8 Dollars (\$100) per month." 9 Section 4. Subsection (d) is added to Section 10351 of the 10 Government Code to read: 11 "(d) Compensation. Members of the Commission shall 12 be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each 13 day on which the Commission meets, such compensation shall 14 not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month." 15 Section 5. Subsection (d) of Section 27202 of the Government Code is amended to read: 16 17 "(d) Compensation. Members of the Board shall receive 18 compensation at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for 19 attendance at each meeting, provided, however, that such 20 compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars 21 (\$100) per month." 22 Section 6. Subsection (d) of 1GCA Section 1651 is amended 23 to read: 24 "(d) Commission members shall serve without compensa-25 tion except that each member shall be paid Fifty Dollars 26 (\$50.00) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the 27 Commission, provided, that such compensation is not to 28 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month. Each member 29 shall also be allowed actual expenses incurred in the 30 discharge of his duties. Ex-officio members shall receive

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no compensation under this Section."

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Section 7. Subsection (a) of Section 13501 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 13-74) is amended to read:

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"(a) There is within the government of Guam the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. The Commission shall be composed of five (5) members to be appointed by the Governor with the confirmation of the Legislature. Commission members shall be appointed within sixty (60) days after the enactment of this Chapter. All members shall have been residents of the territory at least three (3) years prior to their appointment and at least three (3) of the members shall be native Chamorro. Members shall serve terms of three (3) years, provided, however, that of the members first appointed, one (1) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year and two (2) shall be appointed for terms of two (2) years. The members of the Commission shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Commission, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month. The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the Commission from among the members thereof. The Commission shall have its first meeting within twenty (20) days after confirmation of its members."

Section 8. Section 1806.301(3) of the Civil Code is amended to read:

"(3) Members of the Council shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Council meets, such remuneration not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

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Section 9. Section 25404 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 25404. Same: compensation. Every member of the Board who is not in the service of the government, for which he receives an annual compensation, shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Board meets, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month." Section 10. Section 26201 of the Government Code (enacted

in Public Law 13-80) is amended to read:

"Section 26201. Compensat" on and term. Commission members shall serve for a term of two (2) years, provided that of the members first appointed, three (3) shall serve for one (1) year and two (2) shall serve for two (2) years. Each member shall receive Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day or portion thereof spent in attending meetings of the Board, such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 11. Subsection (b) of Section 13413 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 13-52) is amended to read:

"(b) Commission members shall serve without compensation except that each member shall be paid a per diem of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Commission. Such remuneration shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

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Section 12. Section 26101 of the Government Code is amended to read:

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"Section 26101. Same: term and compensation. The members and chairman of the Board shall be appointed for terms of one (1) year each and shall receive compensation at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each attendance at the meeting of the Board, provided, however, that no member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 13. Section 27403 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 27403. Board of Examiners for the practice of acupuncture; appointment; removal; qualifications. There shall be a board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture who shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Legislature, in accordance with Section 27104 of the Government Code, whose duty it shall be to examine all applicants for license to practice acupuncture.

The board shall consist of five (5) persons: one (1) shall be a physician or surgeon licensed under the laws of the territory, one (1) shall be a licensed practitioner of acupunture, one (1) shall be a member of the legal profession, one (1) shall be the Director of Public Health and Social Services, and one (1) an individual who is not a licensed physician, practitioner of acupuncture, or attorney but who is a resident in good standing of the territory of Guam. However, the initial board of examiners

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shall consist of three (3) members: one (1) shall be a member of the legal profession, one (1) the Director of Department of Public Health and Social Services, and one (1) a resident in good standing of the territory of Guam. Each member of the board who is not in the service of the government, for which he receives an annual compensation, shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the board meets, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum."

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Section 14. Subsection (d) is added to Section 62012 of the Government Code to read:

"(d) Each member of the Council shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Council meets, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month." Section 15. Subsection (a) of Section 49253.3 of the

Government Code (enacted in Public Law 14-11) is amended to read:

"(a) Selection of Officers; Compensation of Members. The Governor or his representative shall serve as temporary chairman and shall convene the first meeting of the Commission. At its first meeting, the Commission shall select a chairman and such other officers from its membership as it deems necessary. The Commission may meet as often as is necessary upon call of the chairman but meetings shall be held at least quarterly. Every member of the Commission who is not in the service of the government,

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for which he receives an annual compensation, shall be paid 1 2 Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the board 3 meets, provided, however, that such compensation shall not 4 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month." Section 16. Subsection (a) of Section 16407 of the 5 Government Code is amended to read: 6 "(a) Members of the Board of Cosmetology shall be 7 8 paid such amount as shall be approved by the Board, not in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50) a day, for each day on which 9 10 meetings are held by the Board. Such compensation is not 11 to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month." 12 Section 17. A new Section 11950.1 is added to the Govern-13 ment Code to read: 14 "Section 11950.1. Compensation of Commission. Members 15 of the Commission shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars 16 (\$50) per day for each day on which the Commission meets, 17 such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) 18 per month." 19 Section 18. A new Section 26301.1 is added to the Govern-20 ment Code to read: 21 "Section 26301.1. Compensation of Council. Every 22 member of the Council shall receive compensation at the 23 rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each attendance at the 24 meeting of the Council, provided, however, that no members. 25 shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per 26 month." 27 Section 19. Section 47005 of the Government Code is amended 28 to read: 29 "Section 47005. Board compensation. Members of the 30 Board shall receive compensation at the rate of Fifty Dollars 31 (\$50) for each attendance at the meeting of the Board, 32 provided, however, that no member shall receive more than 33 One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

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Section 20. Subsection (e) of Section 21001 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 13-179) is amended to read:

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"(e) Each of the members shall receive compensation at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Commission, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month, and such reasonable traveling expenses as may be incurred in the discharge of their duties."

Section 21. Subsection (a) is added to Section 9990.2 of the Government Code to read:

"(a) Compensation of members. Members of the Commission shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Commission meets, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 22. Subsection (d) of Section 61009 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 13-93) is amended to read:

"(d) The Board members shall receive no salary for their services on the Board, provided, however, that they may be paid a reasonable per diem not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50) for attendance at meetings of the Board and reasonable travel allowance for time spent on official business of the Corporation, except that the Station Manager shall not be paid any sums under this clause."

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Section 23. Section 26005 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 26005. Same: Composition: Compensation: The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members, Meetings. two (2) of whom shall be youth members in their first terms on the Board who are between the ages of eighteen (18) and twenty-two (22), when appointed, who shall be appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Legislature. The Governor shall appoint Commission members within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this section. Members shall serve for four (4) years, provided that of the members first appointed three (3), including one (1) youth member, shall serve for two (2) years. Commission members shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Commission meets, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month. Commission meetings shall be public."

Section 24. Section 27104 of the Government Code is amended by adding the following paragraph to read:

"The members of each Board of Examiners shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which meetings are held by the respective boards. No member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 25. Section 58055 of the Government Code (amended by Public Law 13-162) is amended to read:

"Section 58055. Compensation and Expenses. Each member of the Commission, except the Commissioner, shall receive compensation at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Commission meets, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

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Section 26. Subsection (d) is added to Section 10502 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 14-51) to read:

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"(d) Compensation. Members of the Board shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each attendance at the meeting of the Board, provided, however, that no member shall receive more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 27. Subsection (d) of Section 11990.3 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 13-18) is amended to read:

"(d) Board members shall serve without compensation except that each member shall be paid a per diem of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each day of attendance at a meeting of the Board, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month. Each member shall also be allowed actual expenses incurred in the discharge of his duties."

Section 28. Section 21949 of the Government Code, as amended in Public Law 15-92, is further amended to read:

"Section 21949. Composition of Board. The Board shall consist of five (5) directors appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Governor will designate, from among the members of the Board thus appointed, the president and vice-president of the Authority. The Directors and officers thus appointed and designated shall hold office for terms of three (3) years unless sooner removed by the Governor and shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day, for each day on which the Board meets, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month; and they may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out their responsibilities."

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Section 29. The second paragraph of Section 26504 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 14-110) is amended to read:

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"The Council shall elect from among its members a Chairman and a Vice Chairman. Six (6) members shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative votes of six (6) members shall be necessary for Council action. Members of the Council shall be compensated at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per day for each day on which the Council meets, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 30. The second paragraph of Section 9984 of the Government Code (enacted in Public Law 14-139) is amended to read:

"At its initial meeting, the Council members shall elect from among its ranks a Chairman and Vice Chairman. Six (6) members of the Council shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative votes of eight (8) members shall be necessary for Council action. Of the initial appointments, five (5) members of the Council shall serve for one (1) year, five (5) members shall serve for a period of three (3) years and five (5) members shall serve for a period of two (2) years. At the expiration of these terms, all members shall be appointed for three (3) year periods. Members of the Council shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. Members of the Council shall be paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Council, provided, however, that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."

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Section 31. Section 1304 of 1GCA is amended to read:

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"Section 1304. Compensation of the Commission. The members of the Commission shall be compensated Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each meeting they attend not to exceed two (2) meetings per month. The members shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as certified by the Chairman, but in no event to exceed the established per diem rates of the government."

Section 32. A new Chapter XIII is added to Title VII of the Government Code to read:

"Section 6911. Uniform per diem for Boards and Commissions. A member of a board or commission shall be compensated in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for attending a board or commission meeting, such compensation not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month."
