THE OMNIBUS BILL OF THE FIFTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of administering a summer youth internship program for college students subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Imployment of youths shall be within the three branches of the government of Guam or in any duly licensed and registered firm complying with all fair labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam:
- (b) Of the number to be employed, fifty (50) shall be assigned to the Legislature and fifteen (15) to the Judiciary. Those assigned to the Legislature and the Judiciary shall be selected from a list of recommendations to be submitted by the Legislature and the Judiciary respectively;
- (c) Employment of an eligible youth shall be in an area that will be meaningful to the youth's development of a career:

- (d) Employment shall be for a person aged eighteen (18) or older as of June 4, 1979, provided, however, that he is currently registered in a recognized college or university and has completed at least one full academic school year (twenty-four (24) semester hours or the equivalent);
- (e) The employee shall be paid the sum of Two Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$2.90) per hour, provided, however, that work for which compensation shall be paid does not exceed thirty-five (35) hours per week, per employee and that such work is provided during the period of June 4, 1979 through August 27, 1979. Student employees shall not be members of the government of Guam Retirement Fund;
- (f) The Department of Youth Affairs shall establish such procedures, rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this program not inconsistent with the conditions prescribed above. The regulations shall provide that the persons desiring to be employed by the Judiciary or the Legislature shall be interviewed by officials of the respective branch who shall then make recommendations to the Department of Youth Affairs concerning the employment of such applicant.

Section 2. The Department of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 28, 1979, which shall include, but not limited to, a detailed statement of expenditures, the extent to which the above conditions were complied with and a review and evaluation of the program and such recommendations for improving the program as may be warranted.

Section 3. The sum of One Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$189,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of initiating and administering a Summer Youth Employment Program subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Employment of youths shall be in any duly licensed or registered firm complying with all fair labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam and within departments or agencies within the Executive Branch. Futhermore, no employer shall claim for reimbursement of the work of student employees normally employed during the year, as determined by the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs or his appointed delegate.
- (b) Persons aged fifteen (15) through nineteen (19), as of June 1, 1979, shall be eligible for employment. provided, however, that they are currently enrolled in junior or senior high school or have just completed one full academic year prior to the period of employment.
- (c) The government of Guam shall reimburse participating private employers the sum of One Dollar and Forty-Five Cents (\$1.45) per hour, per employee, provided, however, that reimbursement shall not be provided for work in excess of thirty-five (55) hours per week, per employee and that reimbursement shall cover work performed in the period June 4 through August 27, 1979.
- (d) The government of Guam shall pay student employees enrolled in the Executive Branch program, the sum of Two Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$2.90) per hour, provided, however, that work for which payment is made (1) shall not

- (2) shall be performed between June 4 and August 27, 1979.

  Notwithstanding any other provision of law, student employees shall not be members of the government of Guam Retirement Fund.
- (e) The Department of Youth Affairs is authorized to expend not more than five percent (5%) of this appropriation for administrative expenses.
- (f) The Director of Youth Affairs shall establish such procedures, rules and regulations as necessary to administer this program."

Section 4. The Director of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than September 21, 1979, which shall include, but not be limited to, a detailed statement of expenditures under each program a review and evaluation of the Summer Employment Programs under the Department's sponsorship and recommendations for improving the programs.

Section 5. The sum of Twenty-Five-Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty (\$15,000) (\$18,250) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the Youth Conservation Corps Frogram in Calendar Year 1979 to serve as local matching funds for Federal funds. No amount of the appropriation shall be expended until such time that the awarding of the Federal funds is certain.

Section 6. The Youth Conservation Corps Program shall be administered in accordance with Federal guidelines established with the program and such other rules and procedures as may be required.

Section 7. The Director of the Department of Youth Affairs shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than

Section 8. All unexpended balances from the appropriations made in Sections 1, 3 and 5 of this Act existing as of September 1, 1979 are returned to the General Fund.

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fifty (50,000) Fund the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (50,000) to the Department of Parks and Recreation to cover part of the expenses for Guam's participation in the 6th South Pacific Games in Fiji.

Section 10. The Guam Amateur Sports Federation, which is coordinating and supervising Guam's participation, shall make a detailed report to the Director of Parks and Recreation who in turn shall make a report to the Governor and the Legislature on expenses incurred using the funds appropriated by Section 9 of this Act.

Section 11. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Governor for the use of the Guam Youth Band.

Section 12. The sum of Fefty Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) (\$40,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Senior Community Service Employment Division of the Guam Department of Labor for the purpose of providing meaningful employment to the economically disadvantaged senior citizens.

Section 13. A new Section 6110.1 is hereby added to the Government Code of the territory of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 6110.1. Exemption for books and educational materials. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6110 of this Code, rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, or any other law or administrative provision, any agency, department or instrumentality of the government of Guam

Section 14. For purposes of the election to be held on August 4, 1979, the provisions of Section 2456 of the Government Code with respect to the time of application and personal delivery of an absentee ballot are suspended. The Election Commission shall deliver a ballot to any qualified elector who submits an application not more than sixty (60) nor less than one (1) day before the date of the election.
