


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





THE OMNIBUS BILL OF THE FIFTEENTH GUAM
LEGISLATURE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars
3 (\$140,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
4 Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of administering
5 a summer youth internship program for college students subject
6 to the following conditions:

7 (a) Employment of youths shall be within the three
8 branches of the government of Guam or in any duly licensed
9 and registered firm complying with all fair labor laws
10 existing in and for the territory of Guam;

11 (b) Of the number to be employed, fifty (50) shall
12 be assigned to the Legislature and fifteen (15) to the
13 Judiciary. Those assigned to the Legislature and the
14 Judiciary shall be selected from a list of recommendations
15 to be submitted by the Legislature and the Judiciary
16 respectively;

17 (c) Employment of an eligible youth shall be in an
18 area that will be meaningful to the youth's development of
19 a career;

1 (d) Employment shall be for a person aged eighteen (18)
2 or older as of June 4, 1979, provided, however, that he is
3 currently registered in a recognized college or university
4 and has completed at least one full academic school year
5 (twenty-four (24) semester hours or the equivalent);

6 (e) The employee shall be paid the sum of Two Dollars
7 and Ninety Cents (\$2.90) per hour, provided, however, that
8 work for which compensation shall be paid does not exceed
9 thirty-five (35) hours per week, per employee and that
10 such work is provided during the period of June 4, 1979
11 through August 27, 1979. Student employees shall not be
12 members of the government of Guam Retirement Fund;

13 (f) The Department of Youth Affairs shall establish
14 such procedures, rules and regulations to implement the
15 provisions of this program not inconsistent with the condi-
16 tions prescribed above. The regulations shall provide
17 that the persons desiring to be employed by the Judiciary
18 or the Legislature shall be interviewed by officials of the
19 respective branch who shall then make recommendations to the
20 Department of Youth Affairs concerning the employment of
21 such applicant.

22 Section 2. The Department of Youth Affairs shall submit a
23 report to the Legislature not later than September 23, 1979,
24 which shall include, but not limited to, a detailed statement of
25 expenditures, the extent to which the above conditions were
26 complied with and a review and evaluation of the program and
27 such recommendations for improving the program as may be
28 warranted.

1 Section 3. The sum of One Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand
2 Dollars (\$189,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
3 Department of Youth Affairs for the purpose of initiating and
4 administering a Summer Youth Employment Program subject to the
5 following conditions:

6 (a) Employment of youths shall be in any duly
7 licensed or registered firm complying with all fair labor
8 laws existing in and for the territory of Guam and within
9 departments or agencies within the Executive Branch.
10 Furthermore, no employer shall claim for reimbursement of the
11 work of student employees normally employed during the year,
12 as determined by the Director of the Department of Youth
13 Affairs or his appointed delegate.

14 (b) Persons aged fifteen (15) through nineteen (19),
15 as of June 1, 1979, shall be eligible for employment,
16 provided, however, that they are currently enrolled in
17 junior or senior high school or have just completed one full
18 academic year prior to the period of employment.

19 (c) The government of Guam shall reimburse partici-
20 pating private employers the sum of One Dollar and Forty-
21 Five Cents (\$1.45) per hour, per employee, provided, how-
22 ever, that reimbursement shall not be provided for work in
23 excess of thirty-five (35) hours per week, per employee and
24 that reimbursement shall cover work performed in the period
25 June 4 through August 27, 1979.

26 (d) The government of Guam shall pay student employees
27 enrolled in the Executive Branch program, the sum of Two
28 Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$2.90) per hour, provided, how-
29 ever, that work for which payment is made (1) shall not

1 (2) shall be performed between June 4 and August 27, 1979.
2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, student
3 employees shall not be members of the government of Guam
4 Retirement Fund.

5 (e) The Department of Youth Affairs is authorized to
6 expend not more than five percent (5%) of this appropriation
7 for administrative expenses.

8 (f) The Director of Youth Affairs shall establish
9 such procedures, rules and regulations as necessary to
10 administer this program."

11 Section 4. The Director of Youth Affairs shall submit a
12 report to the Legislature not later than September 21, 1979,
13 which shall include, but not be limited to, a detailed statement
14 of expenditures under each program a review and evaluation of
15 the Summer Employment Programs under the Department's sponsor-
16 ship and recommendations for improving the programs.

17 Section 5. The sum of ^{Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty}
~~Twenty-Five-Thousand Dollars (\$25,000)~~
(\$18,250)
18 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Youth
19 Affairs for the Youth Conservation Corps Program in Calendar Year
20 1979 to serve as local matching funds for Federal funds. No
21 amount of the appropriation shall be expended until such time
22 that the awarding of the Federal funds is certain.

23 Section 6. The Youth Conservation Corps Program shall be
24 administered in accordance with Federal guidelines established
25 with the program and such other rules and procedures as may
26 be required.

27 Section 7. The Director of the Department of Youth Affairs
28 shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than

1 Section 8. All unexpended balances from the appropriations
2 made in Sections 1, 3 and 5 of this Act existing as of September
3 1, 1979 are returned to the General Fund.

4 Section 9. There is hereby appropriated from the General
5 Fund the sum of ^{Fifty} ~~Sixty~~ Thousand Dollars ^(50,000) ~~(60,000)~~ to the Department
6 of Parks and Recreation to cover part of the expenses for Guam's
7 participation in the 6th South Pacific Games in Fiji.

8 Section 10. The Guam Amateur Sports Federation, which is
9 coordinating and supervising Guam's participation, shall make a
10 detailed report to the Director of Parks and Recreation who in
11 turn shall make a report to the Governor and the Legislature on
12 expenses incurred using the funds appropriated by Section 9 of
13 this Act.

14 Section 11. The sum of ^{Sixty} ~~Seventy~~ Thousand Dollars ^(\$60,000) ~~(\$70,000)~~
15 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the
16 Governor for the use of the Guam Youth Band.

17 Section 12. The sum of ^{Ten} ~~Fifty~~ Thousand Dollars ^(\$10,000) ~~(\$50,000)~~
18 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Senior Community
19 Service Employment Division of the Guam Department of Labor for
20 the purpose of providing meaningful employment to the economically
21 disadvantaged senior citizens.

22 Section 13. A new Section 6110.1 is hereby added to the
23 Government Code of the territory of Guam to read as follows:

24 "Section 6110.1. Exemption for books and educational
25 materials. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6110
26 of this Code, rules and regulations promulgated thereunder,
27 or any other law or administrative provision, any agency,
28 department or instrumentality of the government of Guam

is authorized to donate books or other educational materials

1 Section 14. For purposes of the election to be held on
2 August 4, 1979, the provisions of Section 2456 of the Government
3 Code with respect to the time of application and personal delivery
4 of an absentee ballot are suspended. The Election Commission
5 shall deliver a ballot to any qualified elector who submits an
6 application not more than sixty (60) nor less than one (1)
7 day before the date of the election.
