

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE
OPERATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL
BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR
THE TRANSITIONAL QUARTER PERIOD COMMENCING
JULY 1, 1979 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1979
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 PART ONE

3 Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from
4 the General Fund for the operations of the Executive and Judicial
5 Branches for the period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending
6 September 30, 1979. The sums appropriated shall be expended as
7 specified in the following subsections of this Section, subject
8 to the conditions further set forth in other parts of this Act to
9 provide for governmental operations.

1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the General
2 Fund the following sums to be transferred to the following agency
3 funds for the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979
4 to September 30, 1979:

6 Fund (not to exceed 753 positions) \$ 950,000
7 b. University of Guam (not to exceed
8 379 positions) \$2,156,616
9 c. Housing Revolving Fund (not to
10 exceed 26 positions) \$ 43,000
11 d. Guam Community College (not to
12 exceed 277 positions) \$1,000,000

13 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the General
14 Fund the sum of Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Five Hundred Eighty
15 Dollars (\$580,580) for the operations of the Judicial Branch for
16 the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and
17 ending September 30, 1979.

18 Section 4. There is hereby appropriated from the General
19 Fund the sum of One Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$105,000) for
20 the operations of the Public Defender Corporation for the
21 Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending
22 September 30, 1979.

23 Section 5. The sum of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars
24 (\$35,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam
25 Legislature Operations Fund for the design, construction, equip-
26 ment, furnishings and carpeting for the renovation and parti-
27 tioning of the Legislative Session Hall.

1 Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from any available
2 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
3 of Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$3,150.00) to the
4 Public Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of upgrading water
5 lines in Ordot-Chalan Pago.

6 PART TWO

7 Section 1. The sum of Forty Three Thousand Dollars (\$43,000)
8 which is transferred from the General Fund to the Housing Re-
9 volving Fund by Part One, Section 2.c. of this Act and the
10 anticipated receipts of One Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand Two
11 Hundred Dollars (\$129,200) of the Housing Revolving Fund for the
12 Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending
13 September 30, 1979 are hereby appropriated for the operations
14 of the Housing Management Division, Department of Administration,
15 government of Guam.

16 Section 2. The sum of Two Million One Hundred Fifty-Six
17 Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen Dollars (\$2,156,616) which is
18 transferred from the General Fund by Part One, Section 2.b. of
19 this Act is hereby appropriated to the University of Guam for the
20 period commencing July 1, 1979, and ending September 30, 1979, to
21 be allocated as follows:

Any imposed reserve by the administration, at any time, shall be deducted only from the operational budget.

Section 3. The sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Guam Community College Fund by Part One, Section 2.d of this Act is hereby appropriated for the operations of the Guam Community College for the period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 4. The sum of Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Hospital Operations Fund by Part One, Section 2.a. of this Act is hereby appropriated for the operations of the Guam Memorial Hospital Fund Transition Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 5. The appropriation made for the Micronesian Cultural Fair shall be available until the Fair shall have been held.

PART THREE

FEDERAL GRANTS-IN-AID

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to implement programs which are financed in whole or in part from Federal Grants-in-Aid for the period specified in the Grant Award. Local funds appropriated under this section may not be expended except to match the Federal funds identified hereunder with the local matching funds.

1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the Territorial
2 Highway Fund the sum of Six Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Eight
3 Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars (\$626,866) of local revenue for the
4 operations of the following programs under the Highway Division,
5 (not to exceed 148 positions), Department of Public Works for the
6 Transition Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending
7 September 30, 1979:

14 PART FOUR

15 ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

16 Section 1. On Reporting Requirements:

17 (a) The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management
18 Research shall submit to the Legislature a General Fund
19 revenue report not later than the 15th of each month begin-
20 ning August 1979. Said report shall list the actual
21 collected revenues along with the actual collection for the
22 same time period during the previous fiscal year, plus
23 recommendations for adjustments of the revenue estimate, if
24 determined to be necessary.

25 (b) The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management
26 Research shall submit to the Legislature not later than the
27 15th of each month beginning July 1979, a statement of the
28 General Fund cash receipts and disbursements for the month
29 and for the fiscal year to date.

1 (c) The Director of Administration shall submit to
2 the Legislature not later than the 20th of each month
3 beginning August 1979, the Financial Statement of the
4 government of Guam for the preceding month.

5 (d) The Director of the Department of Public Works
6 shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 20th of
7 each month beginning August 1979, a capital project status
8 report of all active projects, including outstanding balances.

9 (e) The Executive Director of the Civil Service
10 Commission shall submit not later than the 15th of each month
11 beginning July 1979, a report to the Legislature of any
12 violation of Section 3 of these Administrative Provisions.
13 Section 2. On Expenditures from Appropriations.

14 (a) Funds appropriated under this Act shall not be
15 used to pay obligations incurred prior to July 1, 1979.

16 (b) The Director of Public Works may charge capital
17 improvement appropriations and job orders for services
18 rendered to these projects in an amount not to exceed
19 Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for A&E and Construc-
20 tion Administration to supplement the personnel services
21 budget approved for these divisions.

22 (c) Certification of fund availability by the
23 certifying officers of the various agencies shall be based
24 on balances on allotments released by the Bureau of Budget
25 and Management Research.

26 Section 3. On Employment and Compensation.

27 (a) No department within the Executive Branch shall
28 have more than one deputy director.

1 (b) No position authorized by this Act may be filled
2 nor may the work to be performed by the occupant of said
3 position be performed by any person who is not employed as
4 a government employee pursuant to the provisions of Title V
5 of the Government Code.

6 (c) Pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 14-150,
7 all employees of the Mental Health and Substance Abuse
8 Agency, except the Administrator, shall be classified
9 employees by August 15, 1979. Funds for salaries and bene-
10 fits will not be authorized for expenditures unless this
11 administrative provision is met on the prescribed date.

12 PART FIVE

13 Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to
14 the contrary, governmental agencies and non-profit corporations
15 providing service to the public and utilizing government-owned
16 housing shall continue to use such housing on the same terms
17 existing as of January 1, 1979, and any governmental agency or
18 non-profit corporation providing service to the public which
19 agrees to rehabilitate a government housing unit shall rent such
20 unit free of charge. These corporations shall have preference
21 over other tenants and such conditions and terms in effect shall
22 continue through September 30, 1979.

23 Section 2. Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection (c) of
24 Section 4233 of the Government Code are repealed and reenacted to
25 read:

26 "(1) To receive credit for services rendered as a member
27 of the Legislature during the period from 1951 to 1966, such
28 persons or their surviving spouses shall pay before
29 January 1, 1980 as contribution to the Fund an amount equal
30 to One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150) for each years of
31 service as a member of the Legislature during that period.

1 (2) To receive credit for services rendered as a member
2 of the Legislature during the period from 1966 to 1973, such
3 persons or their surviving spouses shall pay before
4 January 1, 1980 as contribution to the Fund an amount equal
5 to six percent (6%) of the member's annual salary for each
6 year of service as a member of the Legislature during that
7 period."

8 Section 3. Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection (c) of
9 Section 4233 of the Government Code are repealed effective
10 January 1, 1980.

11 Section 4. (a) Section 3 of Public Law 15-33 shall not
12 take effect until funds necessary for its implementation have
13 been appropriated.

14 (b) Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule, regulation
15 or executive order to the contrary, no reclassification or posi-
16 tions within the Civil Service of the government of Guam shall
17 take effect until funds necessary for its implementation have
18 been appropriated.

19 Section 5. For the purpose of establishing an orderly
20 accounting of expenditures made against the appropriations con-
21 tained in this Act, the expenditures of the Transitional Quarter
22 July 1, 1979 through September 30, 1979 shall be combined with
23 the expenditures of the previous twelve (12) month period, and
24 constitute the operating expenditures of the Executive and
25 Judicial Branches of the government of Guam for Fiscal Year 1979.
26 At September 30, 1979, the financial accounts of the government
27 of Guam shall be closed. In no way shall this section be con-
28 strued to mean that any lapses from P. L. 14-143, as amended,
29 shall be carried past June 30, 1979, except as encumbered, but
30 rather the authority for expenditures from July 1, 1979 forward
31 shall be as provided in this Act.

1 Section 6. Sections 5162, 5163 and 5164 are added to the
2 Government Code to read:

3 "Section 5162. No new program created by the Legisla-
4 ture or by any department, commission or agency shall have
5 force or effect unless funding for such program is appro-
6 priated from local funds to finance the cost of implementing
7 such program.

8 Section 5163. Funds other than appropriated funds may
9 be used for the operation of a government program and
10 activity, provided, that the Legislature, by resolution,
11 shall first give its approval to said program or activity.

12 Section 5164. The provisions of Sections 5162 and 5163
13 of this Code shall not apply to Guam Power Authority, Guam
14 Telephone Authority, Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, Public
15 Utility Agency of Guam, Port Authority of Guam, Guam Housing
16 and Urban Renewal Authority, Guam Housing Corporation, Guam
17 Airport Authority and Guam Economic Development Authority."

18 Section 7. Section 4C of Part Five of Public Law 14-132,
19 as amended by Public Law 14-138, is repealed.

20 Section 8. Sections 18 and 19 of Public Law 14-140 are
21 hereby amended to read as follows:

22 "Section 18. Appropriation. There is hereby appro-
23 priated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Sur-
24 plus of the General Fund the sum of ~~Two Hundred Fifty~~^{zero} ~~thousand~~^{0.00} Dollars (\$~~250,000~~) to the Government of Guam Retire-
25 ment Fund to serve as the employee's contribution to such
26 Fund for those casual employees of the Port Authority of
27 Guam. Such contribution shall be deemed to entitle every
28

1 such casual employee who so joined the Fund to prior service
2 credit for all such casual employment with the government
3 prior to joining the Fund. From such contribution, the
4 Fund shall reimburse each such member or retired member who
5 contributed his share to obtain prior service credit pursuant
6 to the provisions of Section 4209.2 of the Government Code.
7 Those members, either active or retired, who made no such
8 contribution shall have their service years recomputed pur-
9 suant to the provisions of this Act and those who have
10 retired as well as those surviving spouses and minor children
11 receiving annuities shall be paid their revised annuities
12 effective the month following receipt by the Fund of the
13 appropriation made hereby.

14 Section 19. Rules and Regulations. The Board of
15 Trustees of the government of Guam Retirement Fund shall
16 issue and promulgate all needful rules and regulations
17 required to carry out the provisions of this Act, the purpose
18 of which the Legislature declares to be that of crediting
19 all former casual employees of the Port Authority of Guam
20 who became or who were or are eligible to become members of
21 the Fund before or after the enactment of Public Law 135,
22 Eleventh Guam Legislature, with all of their years of prior
23 service to the Port Authority of Guam without such employees
24 personally making any contribution to the Fund to obtain
25 such prior service credit and the same to be retroactive
26 to the date of joining the Fund so that those annuitants
27 receiving annuities calculated without including such prior
28 service shall receive adjusted annuities effective as
29 provided in Section 18 of this Act."

PART SIX

1
2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General
3 Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation the sum of Six
4 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500) to defray the cost of
5 transportation for the Guam Little League participation in the
6 1979 Asian Regional Championship in Taipei.

7 Section 2. Section 18(d) of Public Law 14-150, as amended
8 by Public Law 14-154, is further amended to read:

9 "Section 18(d). The sum of One Million One Hundred
10 Fifty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars
11 (\$1,154,952) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to
12 Public Utility Agency of Guam through June 30, 1980 to be
13 expended for water services connections as follows:

14	Materials	\$606,499.00
15	Labor and Equipment	\$548,453.00".

16 Section 3. The sum of Two Million Four Hundred Thousand
17 Dollars (\$2,400,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
18 Retirement Fund for payment of annuity benefit adjustments of
19 One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month for retirees, survivors and
20 dependents for the period beginning July 1, 1979 and ending
21 September 30, 1980, pursuant to Section 11 of Public Law 14-87,
22 as amended by Public Law 14-114.

23 Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is
24 appropriated from the General Fund to Guam Memorial Hospital
25 Authority for the purpose of renovating and expanding the first
26 floor "F" wing of the old Guam Memorial Hospital facility into a
27 maximum security psychiatric treatment unit.

1 Section 5. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is
2 appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislative
3 Operations Fund for the purpose of pursuing the intent expressed
4 in Resolution No. 106, relating to a reassessment of Guam's
5 political relationship to the United States.

6 Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from the General
7 Fund the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) to the Depart-
8 ment of Education for the relocation of temporary classroom
9 buildings. The appropriation to the Department of Education in
10 Fiscal Year 1980 shall be reduced by this corresponding sum.

11 Section 7. The sum of ~~Three Hundred Thirty One Thousand One~~
12 ~~Hundred and Thirty Nine~~ ^{zero} Dollars (~~\$331,139~~^{0.00}) is appropriated from
13 the General Fund to the Department of Education to fund back pay
14 for teachers during school year 1976-77.

15 Section 8. No revenues or receipts into the University of
16 Guam Development Fund and Student Activity Fund shall be used for
17 the hiring and paying of personnel expenses.

18 Section 9. The appropriations made under this part shall
19 continue in effect beyond the period September 30, 1979 as
20 required.

21 Section 10. (a) There is hereby appropriated from the
22 General Fund the sum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars
23 (\$175,000) to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of
24 providing emergency repairs at the Guam Penitentiary.

25 (b) Notwithstanding any rule or regulation to the contrary,
26 all bidding requirements for the emergency repairs shall be
27 waived.

28 (c) Upon completion of the repairs, any remaining balance
29 of funds appropriated in this section shall revert to the General
30 Fund.

1 Section 11. There is hereby appropriated ~~Five-Thousand-Five~~
2 ^{zero} ~~Hundred~~ Dollars (~~\$5,500~~^{0.00}) from the General Fund of the government
3 of Guam Claims Fund to reimburse the family of the late George B.
4 San Agustin the cost of all funeral and other related expenses
5 incurred due to his death while under custody of the Department
6 of Correction, government of Guam.

7 Section 12. The sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) is
8 appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature Opera-
9 tions Fund for the conduct of an in depth study of the territory's
10 labor situation.
