AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR THE TRANSITIONAL QUARTER PERIOD COMMENCING JULY 1, 1979 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1979 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAN:

PART ONE

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the operations of the Executive and Judicial Branches for the period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979. The sums appropriated shall be expended as specified in the following subsections of this Section, subject to the conditions further set forth in other parts of this Act to provide for governmental operations.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the following sums to be transferred to the following agency funds for the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 to September 30, 1979:

- a. Guam Memorial Hospital Operations

 Fund (not to exceed 753 positions) \$ 950,000
- b. University of Guam (not to exceed \$2,156,616
- c. Housing Revelving Fund (not to exceed 26 positions) \$ 43,000
- d. Guam Community College (not to exceed 277 positions) \$1,000,000

Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$580,580) for the operations of the Judicial Branch for the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 4. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$105,000) for the operations of the Public Defender Corporation for the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 5. The sum of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature Operations Fund for the design, construction, equipment, furnishings and carpeting for the renovation and partitioning of the Legislative Session Hall.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$3,150.00) to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of upgrading water lines in Ordot-Chalan Pago.

PART TWO

Section 1. The sum of Forty Three Thousand Dollars (\$43,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Housing Revolving Fund by Part One, Section .2.c. of this Act and the anticipated receipts of One Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$129,200) of the Housing Revolving Fund for the Transitional Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979 are hereby appropriated for the operations of the Housing Management Division, Department of Administration, government of Guam.

Section 2. The sum of Two Million One Hundred Fifty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen Dollars (\$2,156,616) which is transferred from the General Fund by Part One, Section 2.b. of this Act is hereby appropriated to the University of Guam for the period commencing July 1, 1979, and ending September 30, 1979, to be allocated as follows:

Any imposed reserve by the administration, at any time, shall be deducted only from the operational budget.

Section 3. The sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Guam Community College Fund by Part One, Section 2.d of this Act is hereby appropriated for the operations of the Guam Community College for the period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 4. The sum of Nine Hundred Pifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Hospital Operations Fund by Part One, Section 2.a. of this Act is hereby appropriated for the operations of the Guam Memorial Hospital Fund Transition Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979.

Section 5. The appropriation made for the Micronesian Cultural Fair shall be available until the Fair shall have been held.

PART THREE

FEDERAL GRANTS-IN-AID

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to implement programs which are financed in whole or in part from Federal Grants-in-Aid for the period specified in the Grant Award. Local funds appropriated under this section may not be expended except to match the Federal funds identified hereunder with the local matching funds.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Six Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars (\$626,866) of local revenue for the operations of the following programs under the Highway Division, (not to exceed 148 positions), Department of Public Works for the Transition Quarter period commencing July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1979:

PART FOUR

ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

Section 1. On Reporting Requirements:

- (a) The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research shall submit to the Legislature a General Fund revenue report not later than the 15th of each month beginning August 1979. Said report shall list the actual collected revenues along with the actual collection for the same time period during the previous fiscal year, plus recommendations for adjustments of the revenue estimate, if determined to be necessary.
- (b) The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 15th of each month beginning July 1979, a statement of the General Fund cash receipts and disbursements for the month and for the fiscal year to date.

- (c) The Director of Administration shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 20th of each month beginning August 1979, the Financial Statement of the government of Guam for the preceding month.
- (d) The Director of the Department of Public Works shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 20th of each month beginning August 1979, a capital project status report of all active projects, including outstanding balances.
- (e) The Executive Director of the Civil Service

 Commission shall submit not later than the 15th of each month
 beginning July 1979, a report to the Legislature of any

 violation of Section 3 of these Administrative Provisions.

 Section 2. On Expenditures from Appropriations.
- (a) Funds appropriated under this Act shall not be used to pay obligations incurred prior to July 1, 1979.
- (b) The Director of Public Works may charge capital improvement appropriations and job orders for services rendered to these projects in an amount not to exceed Seventy-Five Thousand Bollars (\$75,000) for A&E and Construction Administration to supplement the personnel services budget approved for these divisions.
- (c) Certification of fund availability by the certifying officers of the various agencies shall be based on balances on allotments released by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research.
- Section 3. On Employment and Compensation.
- (a) No department within the Executive Branch shall have more than one deputy director.

(c) Pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 14-150, all employees of the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Agency, except the Administrator, shall be classified employees by August 15, 1979. Funds for salaries and benefits will not be authorized for expenditures unless this administrative provision is met on the prescribed date.

PART FIVE

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, governmental agencies and non-profit corporations providing service to the public and utilizing government-owned housing shall continue to use such housing on the same terms existing as of January 1, 1979, and any governmental agency or non-profit corporation providing service to the public which agrees to rehabilitate a government housing unit shall rent such unit free of charge. These corporations shall have preference over other tenants and such conditions and terms in effect shall continue through September 30, 1979.

Section 2. Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection (c) of Section 4233 of the Government Code are repealed and reenacted to read:

"(1) To receive credit for services rendered as a member of the Legislature during the period from 1951 to 1966, such persons or their surviving spouses shall pay before January 1, 1980 as contribution to the Fund an amount equal to One Hundred Fifty Bollars (\$150) for each years of service as a member of the Legislature during that period.

(2) To receive credit for services rendered as a member of the Legislature during the period from 1966 to 1973, such persons or their surviving spouses shall pay before

January 1, 1980 as contribution to the Fund an amount equal to six percent (6%) of the member's annual salary for each year of service as a member of the Legislature during that period."

Section 3. Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection (c) of Section 4233 of the Government Code are repealed effective January 1, 1980.

G

Section 4. (a) Section 3 of Public Law 15-33 shall not take effect until funds necessary for its implementation have been appropriated.

(b) Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule, regulation or executive order to the contrary, no reclassification or positions within the Civil Service of the government of Guam shall take effect until funds necessary for its implementation have been appropriated.

Section S. For the purpose of establishing an orderly accounting of expenditures made against the appropriations contained in this Act, the expenditures of the Transitional Quarter July 1, 1979 through September 30, 1979 shall be combined with the expenditures of the previous twelve (12) month period, and constitute the operating expenditures of the Executive and Judicial Branches of the government of Guam for Fiscal Year 1979. At September 30, 1979, the financial accounts of the government of Guam shall be closed. In no way shall this section be construed to mean that any lapses from P. L. 14-143, as amended, shall be carried past June 30, 1979, except as encumbered, but rather the authority for expenditures from July 1, 1979 forward shall be as provided in this Act.

Section 6. Sections 5162, 5163 and 5164 are added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 5162. No new program created by the Legislature or by any department, commission or agency shall have force or effect unless funding for such program is appropriated from local funds to finance the cost of implementing such program.

Section 5163. Funds other than appropriated funds may be used for the operation of a government program and activity, provided, that the Legislature, by resolution, shall first give its approval to said program or activity.

Section 5164. The provisions of Sections 5162 and 5163 of this Code shall not apply to Guam Power Authority, Guam Telephone Authority, Guam Memorial Mospital Authority, Public Utility Agency of Guam, Port Authority of Guam, Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, Guam Housing Corporation, Guam Airport Authority and Guam Economic Development Authority."

Section 7. Section 4C of Part Five of Public Law 14-132,

Section 8. Sections 18 and 19 of Public Law 14-140 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 18. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Two-Hundred Fifty To Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund to serve as the employee's contribution to such Fund for those casual employees of the Port Authority of Guam. Such contribution shall be deemed to entitle every

such casual employee who so joined the Fund to prior service credit for all such casual employment with the government prior to joining the Fund. From such contribution, the Fund shall reimburse each such member or retired member who contributed his share to obtain prior service credit pursuant to the provisions of Section 4209.2 of the Government Code. Those members, either active or retired, who made no such contribution shall have their service years recomputed pursuant to the provisions of this Act and those who have retired as well as those surviving spouses and minor children receiving annulties shall be paid their revised annuties effective the month following receipt by the Fund of the appropriation made hereby.

Section 19. Rules and Regulations. The Board of Trustees of the government of Guam Retirement Fund shall issue and promulgate all needful rules and regulations required to carry out the provisions of this Act, the purpose of which the Legislature declares to be that of crediting all former casual employees of the Port Authority of Guam who became or who were or are eligible to become members of the Fund before or after the enactment of Public Law 135, Eleventh Guam Legislature, with all of their years of prior service to the Port Authority of Guam without such employees personally making any contribution to the Fund to obtain such prior service credit and the same to be retroactive to the date of joining the Fund so that those annuitants receiving ammuities calculated without including such prior service shall receive adjusted annuities effective as provided in Section 18 of this Act."

PART SIX

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500) to defray the cost of transportation for the Cuam Little League participation in the 1979 Asian Regional Championship in Taipel.

Section 2. Section 18(d) of Public Law 14-150, as amended by Public Law 14-154, is further amended to read:

"Section 18(d). The sum of One Million One Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars (\$1,154,952) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to Public Utility Agency of Guam through June 30, 1980 to be expended for water services connections as follows:

Section 3. The sum of Two Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,400,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Retirement Fund for payment of annuity benefit adjustments of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month for retirees, survivors and dependents for the period beginning July 1, 1979 and ending September 30, 1980, pursuant to Section 11 of Public Law 14-87, as amended by Public Law 14-314.

Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of renovating and expanding the first floor "F" wing of the old Guam Memorial Hospital facility into a maximum security psychiatric treatment unit.

Section 5. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislative Operations Fund for the purpose of pursuing the intent expressed in Resolution No. 106, relating to a reassessment of Guam's political relationship to the United States.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of Thirty Thousand Bollars (\$30,000) to the Department of Education for the relocation of temporary classroom buildings. The appropriation to the Department of Education in Fiscal Year 1980 shall be reduced by this corresponding sum.

Section 7. The sum of Three Hundred Thirty Due Thousand One Hundred and Thirty Wine Dollars (\$331,139) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Education to fund back pay for teachers during school year 1976-77.

Section 8. No revenues or receipts into the University of Guam Development Fund and Student Activity Fund shall be used for the hiring and paying of personnel expenses.

Section 9. The appropriations made under this part shall continue in effect beyond the period September 30, 1979 as required.

Section 10. (a) There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000) to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of providing emergency repairs at the Guam Penitentiary.

- (b) Notwithstanding any rule or regulation to the contrary, all bidding requirements for the emergency repairs shall be waived.
- (c) Upon completion of the repairs, any remaining balance of funds appropriated in this section shall revert to the General Fund.

Section 11. There is hereby appropriated Five Thousand Five Dollars (\$5-500) from the General Fund of the government of Guam Claims Fund to reimburse the family of the late George B. San Agustin the cost of all funeral and other related expenses incurred due to his death while under custody of the Department of Correction, government of Guam.

Section 12. The sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature Operations Fund for the conduct of an in depth study of the territory's labor situation.
