


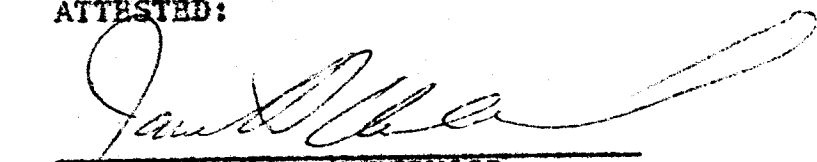

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

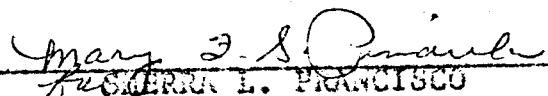

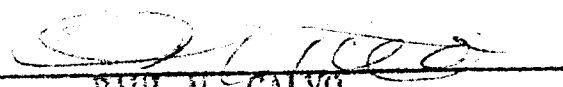

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE
OPERATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL
BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR
THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1980
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 PART ONE

3 OPERATIONS BUDGET

4 Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from
5 the General Fund for the operations of the Executive Branch of
6 the government of Guam for the fiscal year ending September 30,
7 1980. The sums appropriated shall be expended as specified with-
8 in the Committee Report of the Committee on Ways and Means and
9 further subject to the conditions set forth in the other parts of
10 this Act. It shall be unlawful to make any expenditures from
11 the sums appropriated herein unless such expenditures are in
12 accordance with the conditions set forth in this Act.

30 three percent (3%) of the total expenses

1. incurred including but not limited to hiring
 2. personnel to cover administrative expenses
 3. borne by the Guam Energy Office in the
 4. administration of the provisions of this
 5. section. The Administrator of the Guam
 6. Energy Office shall have the power to re-
 7. allocate among the appropriations made herein
 8. such sums as are necessary to pay the power
 9. costs of the agencies of the government of
 10. Guam. In no way shall the appropriations

PART FIVE

ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

Section 1. On Reporting Requirements.

(a) The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research shall submit to the Legislature a General Fund revenue report not later than the 25th of each month beginning November 1979. This report shall list the actual collected revenues along with the actual collection for the same time period during the previous fiscal year, plus recommendations for adjustments of the revenue estimate, if determined to be necessary.

(b) The Director of Administration shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 25th of each month beginning November 1979, a report of all gifts, advances or loans made between funds. No gifts, advances or loans may be made without legislative authorization. This prohibition shall be applicable to cash gifts, temporary loans between funds and General Fund advances to Federal Programs not budgeted in this Act.

(c) The Director of Administration shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 15th of each month beginning November 1979, the Financial Statement of the government of Guam for the preceding month.

(d) The Director of the Department of Public Works shall submit to the Legislature not later than the 25th of each month beginning November 1979, a capital project status report of all active and inactive projects, including outstanding balances and shall provide an explanation and recommendation on projects inactive six months or longer.

1 (c) The Executive Director of the Civil Service Commis-
2 sion shall submit not later than the 25th of each month
3 beginning November 1979, a report to the Legislature of any
4 violation of Section 3 of these Administrative Provisions.
5 Section 2. On Expenditures from Appropriations.

6 (a) Funds appropriated under this Act shall not be
7 used to pay for obligations incurred prior to October 1, 1979.

8 (b) Expenditures proposed to be charged against the
9 appropriations made in this Act must have been obligated by
10 a valid purchase order or contract during FY 1980 if it is
11 to be carried forward and charged to the appropriations made
12 by this Act. Any unencumbered balance at the end of the
13 fiscal year shall revert to the Unappropriated Surplus of
14 the General Fund.

15 (c) Expenditures for travel shall be charged to the
16 budget for the fiscal year during which such travel is
17 commenced to the office for which such appropriation is
18 made and for the benefit of employees of the office for which
19 travel funds are budgeted.

20 (d) The Director of Public Works may charge capital
21 improvement appropriations and job orders for services
22 rendered to these projects in an amount not to exceed one
23 hundred percent (100%) of the personnel services allocation,
24 as identified in the Committee Report on the FY 1980 Budget,
25 for A&E and Construction Administration to supplement the
26 personnel service allocation for these divisions.

27 (e) Certification of fund availability by the certifying
28 officers of the various agencies shall be based on balances
29 on allotments released by the Bureau of Budget and Management

1 Research. The release of monthly or quarterly allotments
2 by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research from appro-
3 priations made under this Act shall be based on anticipated
4 cash receipts so that obligations incurred, both current
5 and past, shall have sufficient cash for their payments.
6 Allotment releases shall not exceed anticipated cash receipts;
7 adjustments shall be made by the Bureau of Budget and Manage-
8 ment Research to correct releases in excess of actual collec-
9 tions.

10 Section 3. On Employment and Compensation.

11 (a) No department within the Executive Branch shall
12 have more than one deputy director.

13 (b) No position authorized by this Act may be filled
14 nor may the work to be performed by the occupant of said
15 position be performed by any person who is not employed as
16 a government employee pursuant to the provisions of Title
17 V of the Government Code.

18 (c) Notwithstanding other laws, rules or regulations to
19 the contrary, no reclassification of any position not
20 funded by appropriation of the Legislature may be implemented.
21 No classified position may be paid above the steps in the
22 established pay range or supplemented by other funding
23 sources except as provided by law.

24 Section 4. On Federal Funds

25 (a) The Bureau of Budget and Management Research is
26 hereby authorized to use Federal funds received for audit
27 and program evaluation performed on Federal programs for
28 purposes of recruitment, training and staff development
29 within the Bureau, provided, however, that such recruitment
30 would be only for the Internal Audit Section of the Bureau
31 and subject to availability of Federal funds.

1 Section 5. On Legislative Intent. The Committee Report,
2 Analysis and Digest of the FY 1980 appropriations shall be
3 evidence of the legislative intent for the allocation and expendi-
4 tures from the appropriations made in this Act. The Digest
5 shall constitute the approved budget plan for the agency for FY
6 1980 and may be amended by the written consent of the Committee
7 on Ways and Means. It is the intent of the Legislature with
8 regard to Federal Programs to allow the greatest degree of
9 flexibility in allowing grantees to execute their programs and,
10 therefore, expenditures from these grants shall not be prescribed
11 in the Legislative Digest. All local and Federal laws, rules and
12 regulations relative to employment and expenditure of funds shall
13 be in effect and determine the legality of the grantees actions.

15 GENERAL PROVISIONS

16 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General
17 Fund the sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000)
18 to the University of Guam for the construction of second floor

28 "Section 6308. Money available to meet obligations. It
29 shall be the duty of the Director of Administration at all
30 times, to have available sufficient monies to meet the legal

1 obligations of the government of Guam, except that money
2 from the Territorial Highway Fund may not be utilized."

3 Section 5. The Department of Education is hereby authorized
4 to expend monies earmarked under this Act for school aides to
5 meet unforeseen needs for additional teachers due to increased
6 enrollment in schools.

7 Section 6. The Governor of Guam is authorized to transfer
8 buses and their drivers transporting students of Brodie Memorial
9 School from the Department of Public Works (Bus Operations
10 Division) to the Department of Education (Special Education
11 Division).

12 Section 7. The Department of Education is hereby directed
13 to formulate necessary plans to utilize Adelup Elementary School
14 as Administrative Offices beginning FY 1981. The Director is
15 expressly forbidden to negotiate renewal of any office lease
16 beyond Fiscal Year 1980.

19 "Section 11107. Same: pay. Members shall be paid the
20 amount of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) for each day on

20 awarded by the government of Guam unless the proposed
21 contractor has, and throughout the term of the contract,
22 maintains a total work force of which no less than forty
23 percent (40%) are citizens or permanent residents of the
24 United States."

25 Section 26. Section 4106(B) of the Government Code of Guam
26 is amended by adding the following:

27 "Director of Civil Defense \$27,300".

28 Section 27. Subsection (b) of Section 10352 of the Govern-
29 ment Code is amended to read:

30 "(b) For the period beginning July 1, 1971, all monies
31 received under Subchapter D, Chapter 6, Title XX and Section

1 23354, Chapter 3, Title XXIV, Government Code of Guam and
2 monies and revenue made available from the Federal Government
3 for public highway purposes and highway safety related plans,
4 programs and projects shall be deposited with the Territorial
5 Highway Fund. Accounting procedures for the funds shall be
6 prescribed by the Director of Administration and suitable
7 reserves shall be maintained for tax drawbacks under this
8 Subchapter which shall be paid from the Fund."

9 Section 28. Section 1 of Public Law 12-109, as amended by
10 Public Law 13-29, is repealed.

11 Section 29. The Department of Public Health and Social
12 Services is hereby directed to contract with the Guam Community
13 College or the Department of Education for feeding of the elderly.

14 Section 30. The provisions of Section 2 of Public Law 14-153
15 shall be effective for the Fall Semester of 1979.

16 Section 31. Notwithstanding any other laws of the territory
17 to the contrary, the Contractors License Board is hereby authorized
18 to use such sums as are available in the Contractors License Fund
19 for its operations in Fiscal Year 1980.
