AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF ROUTE ONE (1) FROM ROUTE SIXTEEN (16) TO Y-SENG SONG ROAD.

WHEREAS, there has been significant increases in the population of the northern area of Guam with the advent of cluster housing developments; and

WHEREAS, the density of the northern half of the island now approaches 685 persons per square mile, slightly higher than the densely settled countries in Asia and Europe; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the island's population will double by the year 2000; and

WHEREAS, an increase in commercial activity has and will continue to accompany a population increase in the north; and

WHEREAS, approximately fifty-one percent (51%) of Route 1 between Route 16 and Y-Seng Song is composed of two (2) lanes, which poses problems during peak hours; and

WHEREAS, vehicles are the only means of transportation on Guam and can be considered a necessity; and

WHEREAS, further housing development in the north would compound the existing traffic congestion along Route 1 in Dededo; and

WHEREAS, during a two (2) year period (1976-1977), there were 1,155 accidents in Dededo and Yigo, indicating a growing need for highways and requirements for highway safety; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance of the Territorial Highway Fund the sum of Three Million Nine Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$3,970,000) to include Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) grants in the amount of Two Million Seven Hundred Forty Thousand Bollars (\$2,740,000) for the construction of a highway capital improvement within the limits specified herein:

Section 2. This project includes the signalization at five (5) intersections along the project limits and construction of a frontage road approximately 1,000 feet in length connecting Harmon Loop Road and an access easement running perpendicular to Route 1.

Section 3. The appropriation made in Section 1 and the authorization for local funds use shall expire on December 31, 1980.
