




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO RENUMBER CHAPTER V, TITLE II OF
THE GOVERNMENT CODE AND TO ADD NEW SECTIONS
1404 AND 1446 TO SAID CODE RELATIVE TO
CERTIFICATES OF APPOINTMENT.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Chapter V, Title II (beginning with Sections
3 1400 through 1419) of the Government Code (Public Law 14-99) is
4 renumbered Chapter V-A, Title II and begins with Sections 1425
5 through 1445.

6 Section 2. New Sections 1404 and 1446 are added to the
7 Government Code to read:

8 "Certificates of appointment. Immediately after
9 declaring the results of any election, the Legislative
10 Secretary shall cause to be prepared 'certificates of
11 appointment'. The form of such certificate shall be
12 prescribed by the Legislative Secretary and shall contain
13 the essential facts of the appointment. The Legislative
14 Secretary shall cause to be placed in the hands of the
15 appointed person a copy of such certificate which shall
16 constitute evidence of that person's right to office. The
17 Legislative Secretary shall preserve the original
18 certificate for a period of ten (10) years."

19 Section 3. Subsection (e) of Section 1409 of the Government
20 Code, as renumbered Section 1434 under Section 1 of this Act, is
21 amended to read:

22 "(e) To subpoena any employee or agent of the
23 government of Guam to appear, give sworn testimony or to

1 produce documentary or other evidence that is reasonably
2 material to his inquiry and to administer oaths and
3 affirmations in all matters incident to his duties;"

4 Section 4. Section 17 of Public Law 14-150 is amended to
5 read:

6 "Section 17. Positions in the classified service
7 shall be established for the Mental Health & Substance
8 Abuse Agency pursuant to Section 4107 of the Government
9 Code. Provided, however, the administrator, deputy
10 administrator and their secretaries shall be in the
11 unclassified service of the government. The Civil Service
12 Commission shall establish these positions to be effective
13 July 1, 1979. Said positions shall be filled in
14 accordance with personnel rules and regulations governing
15 the filling of vacancies."
