AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE II TO SUBCHAPTER O OF TITLE VI OF TITLE X OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO HUMANE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Article II is added to Subchapter 0 of Chapter VI of Title X of the Government Code to read:

"ARTICLE II

Humane Treatment of Animals

Section 9640.50. Definitions. As used in this Article:

- (a) Animal: Any live, non-human vertebrate creature, domestic or wild;
- (b) Animal Shelter: Any facility operated by a humane society, the government or its authorized agents for the purpose of impounding or caring for animals held under the authority of this subchapter;
- (c) Auctions: Any place or facility where animals are regularly bought, sold or traded, except for those facilities otherwise defined in this Article. This Section does not apply to individual sales of animals by owners.
- (d) Circus: A commercial variety show featuring animal acts for public entertainment;

- (e) Commercial Animal Establishment: Any pet shop, grooming shop, auction, riding school or stable, zoological park, circus, performing animal exhibition or kennel;
- (f) Grooming Shop: A commercial establishment where animals are bathed, clipped, plucked or otherwise groomed:
- (§) Officer: A member of the Department of Public Safety; a Commissioner and a person authorized by the Director;
- (h) Kennel: Any premises wherein any person engages in the business of boarding, breeding, buying, letting for hire, training for a fee or selling dogs or cats;
- (i) Owner: Any person, partnership or corporation owning, keeping or harboring one or more animals. An animal shall be deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered for three consecutive days or more;
- (j) Performing Animal Exhibition: Any spectacle, display, act or event other than circuses in which performing animals are used;
- (k) Pet: Any animal kept for pleasure rather than utility;
- (1) Pet Shop: Any person, partnership or corporation, whether operated separately or in connection with another business enterprise except for a licensed kennel that buys, sells

- (r) Wild Animal: Any live monkey (non-human primate), race-on, skunk, fox, leopard, panther, tiger, lion, lyns, or other warm blooded animals and snakes which can normally be found in the wild state;
- (s) Zoological Parks: Any facility, other than a pet or kennel, displaying or exhibiting one or more species of non-domesticated animals operated by a person, partnership, corporation or government agency.
- (t) Licensing Authority. The Department of Revenue and Taxation shall be the licensing authority for purposes of this Article.

Section 9640.51. Permits. (a) No person, partnership or corporation shall operate a commercial animal establishment or animal shelter without first obtaining a permit in compliance with this Section.

- (b) The Department of Revenue and Taxation, in conjunction with the Department of Public Health and Social Services, shall promulgate regulations for the issuance of permits and shall include requirements for humane care of all animals and for compliance with the provisions of this Article.
- (c) Upon a showing by an applicant for a permit that he is willing and able to comply with the regulations promulgated by the licensing authority,

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- (d) The permit period shall begin with the fiscal year and shall run for one year. Renewal applications for permits shall be made thirty days prior to, and up to sixty days after, the start of the fiscal year. Application for permit to establish a new commercial animal establishment under the provisions of this Article may be made at any time.
- (e) If there is a change in ownership of a commercial animal establishment, the new owner may have the current permit transferred to his name upon payment of a Ten Dollars (\$10) transfer fee.
- (f) Every facility regulated by this Article shall be considered a separate enterprise and requires an individual permit.
- (g) Persons operating kennels for the breeding of dogs or cats may elect to license such animals individually.
- (h) No fee may be required by this Article of any veterinary hospital, animal shelter or government-operated zoological park.
- (i) Failure to obtain a permit before opening any facility covered in this Section shall result in a fine of Two hundred Dollars (\$200).
- (j) Any person who has a change in the category under which a permit was issued shall be subject to reclassification and appropriate adjustment of the permit fee shall be made.

(k) The permit required in this Section shall be in addition to the business permit required for the business to operate.

Section 9640.52. License and Permit Issuance and Revocation. (a) The Licensing Authority may revoke any permit or license if the person holding the permit or license refuses or fails to comply with this subchapter, the regulations promulgated by the licensing authority or any law governing the protection and keeping of animals.

- (b) Any person whose permit or license is revoked shall, within ten days thereafter, humanely dispose of all animals owned, kept or harbored and no part of the permit or license fee shall be refunded.
- (c) It shall be a condition of the issuance of any permit or license that the licensing authority shall be permitted to inspect all animals and the premises where animals are kept at any time and shall, if permission for such inspections is refused, revoke the permit or license of the refusing owner.
- (a) If the applicant has withheld or falsified any information on the application, the licensing authority shall refuse to issue a permit or license.
- (e) No person who has been convicted of cruelty to animals shall be issued a permit or license to operate a commercial animal establishment.
- (f) Any person having been denied a license or permit may not reapply for a period of thirty days. Each reapplication shall be accompanied by a Ten Dollars (\$10) fee.

Section 9640.53. (a) Every female dog or cat in heat shall be confined in a building or secure enclosure in such a manner that such female dog or cat cannot come into contact with another animal except for planned breeding.

(b) Every vicious animal, as determined by the Department, shall be confined by the owner within a building or secure enclosure and shall be securely muzzled or caged whenever off the premises of its owner.

Section 9640.54. Animal Care. (a) No owner shall fail to provide his animals with sufficient good and wholesome food and water, proper shelter and protection from the weather, veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering and with humane care and treatment.

- (b) No person shall beat, cruelly ill treat, torment, overload, overwork or otherwise abuse an animal or cause, instigate or permit any dogfight, bullfight or other combat between animals with the exception of cockfighting or between animals and humans.
 - (c) No owner of an animal shall abandon such animal.
- (d) No person shall crop a dog's ears, except when a licensed veterinarian issues a signed certificate that the operation is necessary for the dog's health and comfort and in no event shall any person except a licensed veterinarian perform such an operation.
- (e) Any person who, as the operator of a motor vehicle, strikes a donestic and wildlife animals shall stop at once and render such assistance as may be possible and shall immediately report such injury or death to the

animal's owner. In the event the owner cannot be ascertained and located, such operator shall at once report the accident to an officer.

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Section 9640.55. Keeping of Wild Animals. (a) No person shall keep or permit to be kept on his premises any wild or vicious animal for display or for exhibition purposes, whether gratuitously or for a fee. This Section shall not be construed to apply to zoological parks performing animal exhibitions or circuses.

- (b) No person shall keep or permit to be kept any wild animal as a pet.
- (c) The licensing authority shall have the power to release or order the release of any infant wild animal kept under temporary permit which is deemed capable of survival.

Section 9640.56. Performing Animal Exhibitions. (a)
No performing animal exhibition or circus shall be
permitted in which animals are induced or encouraged to
perform through the use of chemical, mechanical, electrical
or manual devices in a manner which will cause or is likely
to cause, physical injury or suffering.

(b) All equipment used on a performing animal shall fit properly and be in good working condition.

Section 9640.57. Animal Waste. The owner of every animal shall be responsible for the removal of any excreta deposited by his animal(s) on public walks, recreation areas or private property.

Section 9640.58. Sterilization. No unclaimed dog or cat shall be released for adoption without being sterilized

or without a written agreement from the adopter guaranteeing that such animal will be sterilized and a deposit of at least Fifteen Dollars (\$15) must be paid at the time of adoption.

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Section 9640.59. Penalties. Any person violating any provision of this Article shall be deemed guilty of a violation and shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-Five Bollars (\$25) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500). If any violation be continuing, each day's violation shall be deemed a separate violation.

Section 9540.60. The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any operator of a greyhound racing track nor to any greyhound racing dog so long as such greyhound is subject to regulations by the Guam Gaming Commission.

Section 9640.61. Severability Clause. If any part of this Article shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining parts of this Article."

Section 2. Sections 9540 through 9540.27 designated Subchapter C in Bill 33 passed by the Fifteenth Guam Legislature on November 9, 1979 are redesignated Article I. Wherever the word "Subchapter" appears in said Sections it shall be amended to read "Article".

Section 3. The provisions of this Act shall take effect at the same time the provisions of Bill No. 33 passed by the 26 Fifteenth Guam Legislature on November 9, 1979 takes effect.

Section 4. The title and preamble and certain sections of P.L. 15-36 (Substitute Bill No. 37) are hereby amended to read:

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"AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 12325 OF PUBLIC LAW 13-85 AND TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE II TO CHAPTER IV OF TITLE XIII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSERVATION OF RESIDENT ENDANGERED AND THREATENED SPECIES OF PLANTS AND WILDLIFE.

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Section 1. Section 12325 of Public Law 13-85 is hereby repealed in its entirety and a new Article II is added to Chapter IV of Title XIII of the Government Code to read:

Section 12325.7. Enforcement.

- (a) Any authorized officer or agent empowered by the Department with police powers to serve and execute warrants; to arrest offenders; or, to issue citations throughout Guam; or any officer and agent of Guam Customs and Quarantine, or any police officer of Guam shall have the authority to enforce any of the provisions of this Act or any regulation, rule or order promulgated pursuant hereto.

 Section 12325.8. Penalties.
- (c) The Department shall suspend, for a period of one (1) year, any hunting licenses, fishing permits (including shells, corals, shellfish and other fish weirs) or other stamps, certificates, leases or agreements issued to any person or persons who are convicted of a violation of any provision of this Act or any regulation, rule or order issued hereunder.

(e) All guns, traps, nets and other equipment, vessels, vehicles, aircraft and other means of transportation used to aid the taking, possessing, selling, purchasing, offering for sale or purchase, transporting, delivering, receiving, carrying, shipping, exporting any plants or wildlife in violation of this Act, any regulation made pursuant thereto or any permit or certificate or agreement made or issued thereunder shall be subject to forfeiture to the government of Guam upon conviction of a criminal violation pursuant to Subsections 12325.4, 12325.5, and 17325.7.
