AN ACT TO ADD, AMEND AND REPEAL CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW.

BE IT EMACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Chapter I of Title XXXIII of the Government Code is amended to make its title "Norker's Compensation" and throughout the Chapter the word "worker" is substituted in the place of "workman".
- Subsection (i) of Section 37002 of the Government Section 2. Code is amended to read:
 - "(i) Employee. This term, as used herein, is synonymous with 'worker', and means any person who has entered into the employment of or works under contract of service or apprenticeship with an employer. It includes aquacultural and agricultural workers but excludes a person whose employment is purely casual and not for the purpose of

the employer's trade or business. As used herein the term
'employee' includes any person who has worked forty (40)
hours per week during the previous sixty (60) days, exclusive
of holidays, for the same employer."

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Section 3. Subsection (p) of Section 37002 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(p) Public Employment. The term means employment by the government of Guam or any political subdivision thereof. It shall include all elected public officials except members of the Board of Education."

Section 4. Subsection (h) of Section 37003 of the Government Code is hereby repealed. Subsections (i) and (j) are appropriately renumbered.

Section 5. Subsection (a) of Section 37006 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(a) No compensation shall be allowed for the first seven (7) days of the disability, except for the benefits provided for in Section 37007; provided, however, that compensation shall be allowed from the date of the disability if the injury results in disability of more than twenty-one (21) days, or if the fact and date of disability are supported by a physician's certificate."

Section 6. Subsection (b) of Section 37006 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(b) Compensation for disability shall not exceed One Hundred Forty Dollars (\$140) per week, and compensation for total disability shall not be less than Fifty Dollars (\$50) per week: Provided that if the employee's average weekly wages, as computed under Section 37010 are less than Fifty Dollars (\$50) per week, he shall receive as compensation for total disability his average weekly wages."

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Section 7. Subsection (a) of Section 37009 of the Government 1 Code is amended to read: "(a) Reasonable funeral expenses not exceeding One 3 Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200)." 4 5 Section 8. Subsection (e) of Section 37009 of the Government Code is amended to read: Č "(e) In computing death benefits, the average weekly wages of the deceased shall be considered to have been not S more than Two Rundred Ten Bollars (\$210) nor less than Kinety Ì Dollars (\$90) but the total weekly compensation shall not 10 exceed the weekly wages of the deceased." 11 12 Section 9. Section 37014(m) of the Government Code is amended to read: 13 14 "(m) The total compensation payable under this Title for injuries not resulting in death shall in no event exceed 15 10 the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000). In cases of 17 disability compensable under paragraph (21) of subsection (c) of Section 37000, the total compensation for such disability, 13 and for any temporary partial disability sustained in addition 19 therein, shall not exceed in the aggregate the sum of Forty 20 Thousand Dollars (\$40,000). The total compensation payable 21 22 under this Title for injuries resulting in death shall in no 23 event exceed the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) plus reasonable funeral expenses payable pursuant to Section 24 37009(a) of this Title." 25 Section 10. Section 57943 of the Government Code is amended 26 27 to read: 25 "Section 37043. Annual Report. The Commission shall make to the Guan Legislature and the Governor at the 29 beginning of each regular session a report of the administra-30 tion of this Title for the preceding fiscal year, including 31

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a detailed statement of receipts of and expenditures from 1 the funds established or authorized in Section 37041 and رد. بت 37042. Annually the Commission shall advise the Legislature 3 and the Governor of needed changes in the laws of Guam re-4 garding compensation of workers for injuries sustained while S working and shall provide data from other jurisdictions on the amounts of compensation payable therein." Section 11. Subsection (e) of Section 37002 of the Government Code is amended to read: 9 "(e) Commissioner. This term means the head of the 10 Worker's Compensation Commission who shall be the Director 11 of the Department of Labor or his designee." 12 Section 12. Subsection (b) of Section 37039 of the Govern-15 ment Code is repealed and reenacted to read: 14 "(b) The Worker's Compensation Commission shall be 15 under the cognizance of the Department of Labor and shall 10 consist of the Commissioner and six (6) other members to be 17 appointed by the Governor as follows: 18 (1) one member appointed from the Commissioners 19 Council: 20 (2) one member appointed from a list of three 21 medical doctors recommended by the Guam Medical Society; 22 (3) one member appointed from a list of three 33 24 attorneys recommended by the Guam Bar Association; (4) one member appointed from a list of three 25 Certified Public Accountants recommended by the Guasi 26 Society of Certified Public Accountants; 27 (5) one government of Guam employee; and 20 (6) one member of a labor union. 29

The Commission shall maintain and keep open during reasonable business hours, an office for the transaction of business. If any member of the Commission is removed from office or for any reason ceases to act as a member, all of his official records and papers shall be transferred to his successor in office or to the Commission. No member nor any business associate of a member shall appear as attorney in any proceedings under this Title, and no member shall act in any such case in which he is interested, or when he is employed by any party in interest or related to any party in interest by consanguinity or affinity within the third degree as determined by the common law. Members of the Commission, except the Commissioner, shall receive Fifty Dollars (550) per meeting attended not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) por month and any reasonable expenses incurred in performance of duty."

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Section 13. This Act shall become effective sixty (60) days after enactment.
