AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION TO REVIEW CERTAIN EMPLOYEE CLASSIFICATIONS AND SALARIES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Legislature finds that the recent review of Guam's schools by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges indicated that teacher salaries on Guam were below national standards. The Civil Service Commission is responsible for assessing classification and salaries of employees in the classified service.

The Civil Service Commission shall report to the Legislature its recommendation as to the institution of Teacher VII and Teacher VIII classifications in the classified service, the standards for such classifications and appropriate salary levels.

The Civil Service Commission shall report to the Legislature its recommendations as to the institution of more classifications for nurses, law enforcement personnel, fire fighters and skilled and unskilled laborers in the classified service, standards for such classifications and appropriate salary levels.

The Civil Service Commission shall report to the Legislature as to whether salaries paid to teachers, nurses, law enforcement personnel, fire fighters and skilled and unskilled laborers should be revised to be comparable to other communities of similar size in the United States.

- (a) The Executive Director of the Commission shall be appointed by the Civil Service Commission with the approval of the Governor and with the advice and consent of the Legislature.
- (b) The Civil Service Commission may employ its own staff and shall employ its own legal counsel to serve at the pleasure of the Commission, either on a full-time basis, or may employ on retainer an attorney in private practice in Guam. An attorney employed by the Commission, and who is not in private practice, may be treated as an attorney of the government for purposes of admission to the practice of law in Guam."
