CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF EIGHTY
THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$80,000) TO THE GUAM
MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY FOR THE
PURPOSE OF PROVIDING A BLOOD BANK IN
GUAM AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) is appropriated
3 from the General Fund to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for
4 a frozen blood bank unit. The funds appropriated by this section
5 shall be used to buy equipment for the unit, to train staff for
6 operation of the frozen blood bank and to employ personnel
7 necessary to organize blood donors. Not more than Thirty Thousand
8 Dollars (\$30,000) of this appropriation may be expended for
9 personnel related expenses.

10 The Legislature does not find that the purchase of and
11 operation of a frozen blood bank unit would completely solve the
12 day-to-day blood demand on island but recognizes that this unit
13 may help keep rare bloods or bloods for an autologous transfusion
14 available.

15 Section 2. There is appropriated from the Territorial
16 Lottery Fund the sum of Thirteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
17 (\$13,500) to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation to allow
18 representatives of Guam to participate in the International
19 blissymbolic training.

20 Section 3. The sum of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand
21 Seven Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars (\$175,796) is appropriated from
22 the Territorial Lottery Fund to the Department of Vocational

Rehabilitation to be expended as follows:

- (a) For the initial operation of the integrated mass transit for the handicapped \$ 23,492
 - (b) For supplemental operations at the Guam Rehabilitation and Workshop Center \$137,018
 - (c) For continued training and services for the severely disabled at the Life Skill Center \$ 16,286.

Section 4. For initiating work designed to induce the federal Veterans Administration to develop a veterans cemetery in Guam, the sum of One Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$135,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to enter into contractual agreements with architectural and engineering firms to conduct:

- (a) Soil investigation;
 - (b) Survey design;
 - (c) Preliminary and final working drawings; and
 - (d) All other work necessary to satisfy the requirements of the Veterans Administration for the construction of a veterans cemetery.

Section 5. Any federal funds reimbursed to the territory for expenditures made pursuant to Section 4 of this Act shall be paid into the General Fund.

Section 6. A new subsection (c) is added to Section 26011, Title XXVII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"(c) to control, manage, develop and maintain the Veterans Cemetery in accordance with applicable federal regulations. Any money paid by the federal government to the territory in connection with the use of the cemetery shall be deposited to a special trust fund for the maintenance of the cemetery. Expenditure from the fund shall be

1 by direction of the commission, which shall annually
2 account to the Legislature for the use of the fund."

3 Section 7. Section 8978 of the Government Code, as amended
4 by Section 1 of Public Law 15-81, is repealed and reenacted to
5 read:

6 "Section 8978. Powers and duties of officer. The
7 officer:

8 (a) shall administer the office;

9 (b) shall exercise and discharge the duties
10 of the office through such organizational units as he
11 may establish;

12 (c) shall enforce the provisions of this Chapter
13 and of any other laws granting him jurisdiction
14 pertaining to veterans of the armed forces of the
15 United States;

16 (d) may administer and certify oaths and
17 affirmations, take and certify affidavits and
18 acknowledgments, and exercise any other power of a
19 notary public, but only as part of his duties under
20 this Chapter and neither he nor his office shall
21 charge any fee for such certification or notarial
22 service;

23 (e) may formulate and adopt rules necessary
24 or proper for the internal administration of the
25 office; and

26 (f) may study and plan for the establishment
27 of a Territorial Veterans Cemetery, seeking such
28 assistance, advice and support from the armed forces
29 of the United States, the federal Veterans Administra-
30 tion, other local and federal agencies and veterans
31 and veterans organizations."

32 Section 8. Section 7 of this Act shall take effect immedi-
33 ately, provided, however, that no expenditure of funds shall be

1 made pursuant to Section 8978(f) of the Government Code until
2 October 1, 1984, except pursuant to a specific appropriation
3 that may be made hereafter.

4 Section 9. Section 8978.1 is added to the Government Code
5 to read:

6 "Section 8978.1. Veterans cemetery, eligibility for.
7 The Territorial Veterans Cemetery shall be used for the
8 burial of persons who served honorably in the armed forces
9 of the United States, the Insular Guard, the Guam Militia,
10 the Guam Scouts, the Guam Combat Patrol or who were employed
11 on Wake Island in a civil capacity on December 7, 1941, and
12 their spouses and dependents."

13 Section 10. The sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) is
14 appropriated from the General Fund to replenish the Off-Island
15 Sports Fund established by Section 25020 of the Government Code.

16 Section 11. A new Section 1025 is added to the Government
17 Code to read:

18 "Section 1025. Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union.
19 The Guam Legislature shall be an associate member of the
20 Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union. The Speaker shall be
21 Guam's Chief Delegate to the Asian Pacific Parliamentarians
22 Union. He shall appoint members of the Legislature or other
23 citizens of the territory to serve as Guam's delegates to
25 attend meetings of the Union.

26 The Guam Legislature may take whatever action is
27 required to maintain its membership in the Union including
28 but not limited to payment of annual assessments, hosting
29 meetings and attending meetings."

30 Section 12. Section 1010 of the Government Code is amended
31 to read:

32 "Section 1010. Organization of Legislature. Upon the
33 election of the Speaker, the Legislature shall proceed to
34 organize, adopting rules governing its procedure and with

1 the election of a Vice Speaker, Legislative Secretary and
2 Secretary General of the Guam delegation to the Asian
3 Pacific Parliamentarians Union, who shall be members of the
4 Legislature, and the following attaches: Sergeant-at-Arms,
5 Chaplain, Recording Secretary, and Legislative Counsel, none
6 of whom shall be a member of the Legislature. All such
7 officers shall be elected for the entire term of the
8 Legislature and shall serve during all regular and special
9 sessions thereof, unless otherwise ordered by a majority
10 vote of the Legislature."

11 Section 13. There is appropriated from the General Fund to
12 the Legislature Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for the
13 purpose of maintaining the legislature's membership in the
14 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures and its membership
15 in the Asian Pacific Parliamentarians Union, and in the hosting
16 of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures First General
17 Assembly in August 1982 in Guam and Asian Pacific Parliamentarians
18 Union meeting in Guam in 1983. The money appropriated by this
19 section shall be deposited in a special account, separate and
20 apart from other funds of the Legislature and shall be available
21 to the Legislature through February 28, 1983. Any sum not
22 expended or encumbered by that date shall then revert to the
23 General Fund by operation of law.

24 Section 14. There is hereby appropriated from the General
25 Fund to Guam Power Authority the sum of Five Thousand Dollars
26 (\$5,000) to extend the power lines to Lot Numbers 76 and 97,
27 Tract 634, Machanao, Dededo and Lot 14, 15 NEW RI-2, Tract 284,
28 Dededo.

29 Section 15. The sum of Two Hundred Forty-One Thousand
30 Dollars (\$241,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
31 Department of Education to repair and purchase cafeteria
32 equipment.

1 Section 16. The sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
2 (\$4,500) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
3 Department of Public Works for the construction of guard rails
4 across from Vicente P. Balajadia's residence on Fulanat Road in
5 the municipality of Yona.

6 Section 17. The sum of Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars
7 (\$35,000) is hereby appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund
8 to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the purpose of
9 constructing two (2) picnic shelters to be erected at Santos
10 Memorial Park in the municipality of Piti.

11 Section 18. The sum of Forty-Four Thousand Seven Hundred
12 Sixty-One Dollars (\$44,761) is appropriated from the General Fund
13 to Guam Health Planning and Development Agency to serve as
14 matching funds for Federal Grants-in-Aid for the period commencing
15 June 1, 1982 and ending June 30, 1983.

16 Section 19. Section 3, Part XVII, (A), 2. of Public Law
17 16-44 is hereby amended to read:
