AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A PLAN FOR THE USE OF THE OLD GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that some of the "old Guam Memorial Hospital staff is now housed in a modern concrete multi-purpose building located in the vicinity of Oka, Tamuning; and

WHEREAS, Federal Grants-in-Aid totaling \$25 million was recently made available to the territory of Guam for the purpose of enabling the government to purchase the hospital facilities including the land at Oka, Tamuning of which a \$10 million authorization is available; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the "old" Guam Memorial Hospital facility situated near the Tumon area is quickly deteriorating due to inadequate maintenance services; and

WHEREAS, monies have been spent on some positions of the hospital while the entire complex continues to deteriorate; and

tenants in the "old" Guam Memorial Hospital building include the Offices of the Chief Medical Examiner (CMA), the Department of Public Health Clinic, the National Institute of Nuerological Diseases, Disorders and Strokes, the hemodialysis unit, skill nursing facility, intermediate care facility, mental health inpatient ward, dietary service, laundry, pharmacy satellite, micro-film room, storage area for supplies, and morgue; and

WHEREAS, there exists an irregular arrangement for rental payments to GMHA wherein the Chief Medical Examiner pays and other tenants do not, and it is not clear whether there are statutery provisions in the law that allow the GMHA to charge rent; and

WHEREAS, it has been found that the "old" Guam Memorial
Hospital facility has a total area of 161,739 sq. ft. of which
approximately 61,000 sq. ft. has the potential of being occupied
if improvements are made; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature also finds that there are forty-two (42) government agencies and departments that are currently paying rent aggregating \$2,103,299.14 per annum; ranging from a low of \$5,272.00 to a high of \$418,495.20, while there is space available at the "old" Guam Memorial Hospital facility; now, therefore.

Section 1. The Governor shall prepare a study detailing future use of the "old" Guam Memorial Mospital facility including but not limited to:

- (a) use as a medical facility;
- (b) use an an office building;
- (c) use as a convention center;
- (d) sale and use of the proceeds to:
 - (1) improve the new Guam Memorial Hospital;
 - (2) construct an office building in Agana;
- (3) repay obligations to the U. S. Government due to discontinued use as a hospital.

Section 2. The Governor shall report his findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than August 1, 1981.

Section 3. Upon receipt of said study, the Legislature shall conduct public hearings within thirty (30) days to consider the alternatives presented by the Governor.
