## SIXTEENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 1982 (SECOND) Regular Session

Substitute Bill No. 583

Introduced by: C. T.C. Gutierrez, M. Z. Bordallo, L. L. Umagat

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 12386 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE TAKING OF FISH AT LUMINAO BARRIER REEF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 12386 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 12386. Fishing area restrictions. No
fishing shall be permitted in the Luminso Barrier Reef, on
the Philippine Sea side from Cabras Island to the extreme
western tip of the Glass Breakwater. The prohibition
imposed in this Section shall expire on October 1, 1985."
Section 2. One Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$1,700,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
government of Guam Retirement Fund for the purpose of paying
increases in annuities pursuant to Subsection (e) of Section 4211
of the Government Code and an implementing Executive Order of
the Governor. Any unexpended and unencumbered funds remaining
from the appropriation made in this Section as of September 30,
1983 shall revert from the government of Guam Retirement Fund to
the General Fund on that date.

Section 3. Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Corporation Subsidy Fund (created by Section 20062 of the Government Code).

Section 4. A new Item D. is added to Part XXII (Guam Visitor's Bureau) of Section 5 of Public Law 16-111 to read:

"D. For On-island

Promotion

Activities

Section 5. Subsection (e) of Section 4211 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"(e) Beginning in Fiscal Year 1983 and each year for four (4) years thereafter, the Governor, by Executive Order, shall increase all the service retirement annuities, disability annuities and survivors annuities to reflect changes in the cost of living in the previous year. The Executive Order shall make the increase effective as of the beginning of the fiscal year. The amount of the adjustment may be stated as a sum certain across-the-board or may be a percentage of the annuity in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) thereof. If the increase is stated as a percentage increase then the base shall be the amount of the annuity as established in Sections 4211, 4212.2 and 4212.6 or 4217.1 of the Government Code.

To the extent permitted under the Guam Territorial Income Tax Law, the cost of living allowance shall not be taxed as income to the recipient of the cost of living allowance."

Section 6. Section 4103.1 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 4103.1. Beginning in Fiscal Year 1983 and each year for four (4) years thereafter, the Governor, by Executive Order, shall adjust the base salaries of all government positions to reflect changes in the cost of

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living in the previous year. The Executive Order shall make the salary adjustment effective as of the beginning of the fiscal year. The amount of the adjustment may be stated as a sum certain across-the-board or may be a percentage of the salary in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) thereof. The adjustment may be paid as a lump sum or together with the biweekly salary of the employee. To the extent permitted by the Guam Territorial Income Tax Law, the adjustment shall not be taxed as income to the employee. There is appropriated from the General Fund any amount necessary to institute the cost of living adjustment ordered by the Governor. The Director of the Department of Administration shall distribute the appropriated funds among the executive, legislative and judicial branches of the government. In the event a person retires prior to receiving any portion of the adjustment, the sum not yet paid to the employee shall be transferred to the Retirement Fund and paid to the retired employee together with his annuity. As used in this Section 'government position' means a non-elective, permanent position in the executive branch of government, including autonomous and semi-autonomous entities; a permanent position in the judicial branch or a position in the legislative branch." Section 7. Section 30 of Chapter II of Public Law 16-111

is amended to read: "Section 30. Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the

Governor's Office for the Guam National Salute Committee to send six (6) representatives from Guam to the National Salute to Vietnam Veterans Week in Washington, D.C.,

November 10-14, 1982 and to build a float."

Section 8. Section 1974 of the Government Code, as amended, is further amended to read:

"Section 1974. After the results of the plebiscite are made known, the Commission shall reduce the desires of the people of Guam to a written covenant, or Territorial-Federal Relations Act, or both, as necessary, to be submitted to the Congress of the United States as the manifest will of the people of Guam on the question of their relationship with the Government of the United States of America. Prior to submission of this Act, covenant or both to the United States Congress, the Commission shall hold public hearings on the proposed draft(s). Upon completion of the public hearings, the Commission shall submit a final draft or drafts to the people of Guam at a referendum to be held as provided by law. The Commission shall represent the people of Guam in negotiating with the Congress of the United States the implementation of such covenant, Act, or both, if approved by the people of Guam by majority vote of those persons voting in the referendum."

Section 9. Sixty Five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Governor for the Guam Youth Band.

Section 10. The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of erecting a six feet by twenty feet by twenty feet (6'x20'x20') chain-link safety fence, with gate, around the Geus PUAG Booster Pump Station in the municipality of Merizo.

Section 11. (a) The sum of Four Hundred Forty Thousand Pollars (\$440,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the construction and installation of a sewer line in the B.P.M. area of Mangilao.

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(b) The sum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the construction and installation of a sewer system in Talofofo.

Section 12. The sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the Territorial Lottery Fund to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of assisting bona fide farmers who suffered losses during Tropical Storm Mac.

Section 13. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the purpose of improving the Soccer--Football Field adjacent to the LBJ School in Tamuning.

Section 14. The sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Commerce to pay to the tenants of the Guam Public Market for the losses of property they suffered as a result of the fire.

Any unexpended sum from the appropriation made in this Section shall revert to the General Fund.

Section 15. Subsection (n) of Section 23100 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(n) After passing an examination as required under Subsection (g) to include an actual demonstration of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motorcycle, an applicant may have his operator's or chauffeur's permit endorsed by the Director of Revenue and Taxation, or his designee, authorizing the applicant to operate a motorcycle on the highways of Guam. The Director of Revenue and Taxation may in his discretion accept evidence of a military motorcycle permit in lieu of this examination and endorsement. No person shall operate a motorcycle on the highway without first complying with this Section except that a person having in his immediate possession a valid

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motorcycle operator's license issued by any other territory or state of the United States, or by a foreign country, may operate a motorcycle upon the highways for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days from the date such person arrived in Guam. The requirement that the person pass an examination and receive an endorsement for operation of a motorcycle shall not be applicable to the operation of a motorcycle when a sidecar is attached to the motorcycle. Any person who operates a motorcycle in violation of this Title shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor."
