AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM FOR THE HOTEL/RESTAURANT INDUSTRY IN THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A new Section 11964.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 11364.1. The Board shall establish a coordinating committee for the hotel/restaurant industry apprenticeship program. The coordinating committee shall include representatives of the hotel and restaurant industry on Guam and members of the staff of the Guam Community College. The committee shall develop an apprenticeship program for employees in the hotel/restaurant industry and recommend rules and regulations to the Board in conjunction with the program. The program shall provide that apprentices shall be paid a wage not less than the applicable minimum

Section 2. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Hotel/Restaurant Apprenticeship Fund. The Guam Community College shall be custodian of the Hotel/Restaurant Apprenticeship Fund and annually shall report to the Legislature as to transactions involving the Fund. The College shall pay its share for wages for apprentices in the hotel and restaurant industry apprenticeship program from the Hotel/Restaurant Apprenticeship Fund. The appropriation made in this Section shall be available for expenditure for two years, the period necessary for completion of the program by the first class of students.

Section 3. A new Section 53571.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 53571.1. Participation in the Apprenticeship
Training Program. A Corporate Qualifying Certificate shall
not be issued to an applicant which operates a hotel or
restaurant unless the applicant commits itself at the time
of application for such a certificate to participate in the
Hotel/Restaurant Industry Apprenticeship Program administered
by the Guam Community College and to hire graduates of the
apprenticeship program when vacancies exist."
