AN ACT AUTHORIZING GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO MAKE LOANS TO NON-PROFIT COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. A new Subsection (u) is added to Section 53552
of the Government Code to read:

Ioans of non-profit cooperative associations licensed to do business in Guam in furtherance of the purposes and activities stated in this Act. All guarantees so made shall be of such sum, value or so secured as to reasonably assure repayment or shall be of such vital need to the economy of Guam as to warrant additional risk or subsidies. As used in this subsection 'non-profit cooperative association' means any corporation organized under the provisions of Division First Part IV, Title V of the Civil Code."

Section 2. Section 53601.1 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 53601.1. From the Agricultural Development Fund, the Guam Economic Development Authority shall guarantee loans of responsible non-profit cooperative associations necessary for expanding facilities for the improvement of marketing of agricultural products."

Section 3. The sum of One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,600,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Agricultural Development Fund for use in carrying out the provisions of Section 53601.1 of the Government Code.

Section 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Administration the sum of Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) for the purpose of paying any authorized increases in salaries for fiscal years 1981 and 1982.

Section 5. Section 28 of Public Law 15-147, as amended by Section 8 of Public Law 16-44, is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 28. Section 21 of this Act shall take effect on January 6. 1981 and Section 22 of this Act shall take effect on January 12, 1982. Sections 23 and 26 of this Act shall take effect on December 31, 1980." Section 6. Subsection (c) of Section 12202 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated (as enacted in Public Law 16-123) is amended to read:

"(c) The Commission shall adopt regulations relative to the standards for licensure, application procedures, continuing education requirements and renewal of license for professions of the healing art except for the practice of medicine, nursing, dentistry, optometry and pharmacy. The Commission shall approve regulations promulgated by the Board of Medical Examiners, Board of Nurse Examiners.

Optometry and Board of Examiners for Pharmacy for the purpose of standardizing as much as possible requirements for licensure for all professions."

Section 7. Section 12221 of Title 10 of the Guam Code
Annotated (as enacted in Public Law 16-123) is amended to read:

"Section 12221. Revocation, suspension or annulment of license. The Commission may revoke, suspend or annul the license or certificate of registration of any licensed or registered practitioner of a healing art except medicine under the jurisdiction of the Commission or may reprimand or otherwise discipline such practitioner after due notice and hearing, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The Attorney General shall, upon request, furnish legal assistance to the Commission. If the practitioner shall be found not guilty of charges proffered against him, the Commission shall order a dismissal of the charges.

The Board of Medical Examiners may revoke, suspend or annul the license of a practitioner of medicine or may reprimand or otherwise discipline such practitioner after due notice and hearing, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. The Attorney General shall, upon request, furnish legal assistance to the Board. If the practitioner shall be found not guilty of the charges proffered against him, the Board shall order a dismissal of the charges.

The causes for which a license or certificate of registration may be revoked, suspended, or annulled or for which a practitioner may be reprimanded or otherwise disciplined are as follows:

(a) Conviction in a court of competent jurisdiction, either within or without Guam, of any crime involving moral

subsequently reversed upon appeal, the Commission or Board of Medical Examiners upon receipt of a certified copy of the judgment or order of reversal, shall reissue the proper license or certificate to practice as the case may be."

Section 8. Section 2 of Public Law 16-43 is amended to read:

"Section 2. Section 24 of Public Law 15-132 is amended to read:

'Section 24. There is hereby appropriated Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of providing assistance to irreversible renal failure patients. Such assistance shall be in the form of supplemental aid and out-of-pocket expenses incurred by such patients for, including but not limited to, medication, high protein food, transportation and equipment and supplies. The Board of Trustees shall report to the Legislature when ninety percent (90%) of this appropriation has been encumbered."

Section 9. In furtherance of Section & of Public Law 15-110 the sum of Two Kundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Legislature for the purpose of retaining a law firm specializing in international law with experience necessary to represent the territory in becoming a financial center.

Section 10. Section 9 shall take effect on January 4, 1983
Section 11. (a) The sum of One Hundred Thousand Bollars
(\$100,000) is hereby appropriated from the Territorial Lottery
Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for the
purpose of matching the Department's compensation of sheltered
employees.

(b) Said appropriation shall be used solely for the purpose of matching the salaries paid to the sheltered employees of said Department on a fifty-fifty basis.
