




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER II-A TO TITLE XVII
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO REGULATE THE SALE OF
SCRAP MATERIALS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Chapter II-A is added to Title XVII of
3 the Government Code to read:

4 "CHAPTER II-A

5 Scrap Dealers

6 Section 16125. Definition. As used in this Chapter,
7 the term 'scrap dealer' means any person who is licensed to
8 engage in the purchase or the sale of metal, other than
9 precious metals, or other items that are normally and
10 generally defined as scrap, second-hand items or junk.

11 Section 16126. A scrap dealer shall not purchase
12 scrap during the hours from 6:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.

13 Section 16127. (a) Each scrap dealer shall keep a
14 written record of each purchase of scrap, junk or other
15 second hand items.

16 (1) The record for all items except aluminum cans
17 or tin cans or small items not brought in a motor vehicle
18 shall include:

19 (i) the name and signature of the seller
20 with a valid identification; and

1 (ii) the license number of the seller's
2 vehicle.

3 (2) The record for aluminum cans or tin cans
4 shall include the name and signature of the seller.

5 (b) Every transaction shall be recorded and the record
6 shall be made available for inspection by law enforcement
7 officers and agents of the Department of Revenue and Taxa-
8 tion for up to one (1) year.

9 Section 16128. If the Department of Revenue and Taxa-
10 tion finds that the scrap dealer has violated the provisions
11 of this Chapter or regulations promulgated by the Depart-
12 ment, the business license may be suspended or revoked. Any
13 person found in violation of the provisions of this Chapter
14 or the regulations for the fourth or more time shall be
15 guilty of a misdemeanor."

16 Section 2. This Act shall take effect sixty (60) days
17 after enactment.
